1. TAMIL NADU NEWS

Activities which held up in Tamil Nadu during June 2021

Village rice



- A start-up firm has exported two consignments of 4.5 tonnes of patented “village rice” sourced from Kumbakonam in Tamil Nadu’s Thanjavur district to Ghana and Yemen via air and sea routes.
- The start-up's name is Udaya Agro Farm.
- Enriched with protein, fibre, and a variety of minerals, ‘village rice’ is sourced directly from farmers of Thanjavur.

TN HR and CE embarks on digitalising records

- HR & CE minister P K Sekar Babu inaugurated the digital scanning of the records and files of the temples, in the presence of HR and CE commissioner J Kumaragurubaran, additional commissioners Ramana Saraswati and N Thirumagal, here. The initiative, aiming at administrative reforms, was launched as per the guidance of chief minister M K Stalin.
- There are nearly 36,612 temples across the state in addition to mutts and charitable endowments under the ambit of the department.

International Memory Studies Workshop - IIT Madras

- Indian Institute of Technology Madras’ Centre for Memory Studies recently hosted virtually Asia’s first International Memory Studies Workshop.
- This international workshop is the first of its kind in Asia.
- The launch of the Indian Network for Memory Studies will take place in mid-June 2021 through a virtual event at IIT Madras.

Government's announcement on June 3rd

- A multi super-speciality hospital in Chennai's King Institute of Preventive Medicine and Research will be constructed at the cost of ₹250 crore.
- Kalaignar Memorial Library, spread across 2 lakh square feet, will be constructed in Madurai at a cost of ₹70 crore.
- A new award, Illakiya Mamani, will be instituted to honour three Tamil writers annually with a citation and cash award of ₹5 lakh.
- Housing will be provided for the writers who are recipients of renowned literary awards either in their district or whichever district in which they wish to reside.
- At the cost of ₹24.30 crore, a 16,000-tonne capacity warehouses will be built in Thiruvarur district.
- The scheme of free bus transport has been extended to people with disabilities and the transgender.

Operation Wind

- During the lockdown and following the closure of liquor outlets, illicit liquor is being sold across the State of Tamilnadu.
- The Prohibition and Enforcement Wing (PEW) has launched a special drive called "Operation Wind" from June 8 to 22.
- This aims to prevent production and sale of illicit liquor / arrack in the entire State.

Justice AK Rajan Committee

- Justice AK Rajan Committee was appointed to examine the impact of NEET on medical aspirants, who are socially and economically deprived.
- It was appointed by Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin.
- The committee will also suggest an alternative methodology for admission in medical colleges.

CEO World Magazine

- Two colleges in Tamil Nadu have got a place in the 2021 list of top 100 medical colleges in the world.
- Every year on behalf of CEO World Magazine, a list of the world's top medical colleges and various other colleges, including fashion and management, is published.
- In this list Vellore Christian Medical College is ranked 49th and Chennai Medical College is ranked 64th.
- Similarly, Puducherry Jipmer Medical College is ranked 59th.
- Varanasi Medical College is ranked 72nd.

State Development Policy Council



- Chief Minister M K Stalin revamped the State Development Policy Council (SDPC) with Prof J Jayaranjan as the new vice chairman.
- It is headed by the chief minister.
- Besides a permanent member the council will have eight part-time members.
- Prof Rama Srinivasan will be its permanent member.
- The other part time members include Prof M Vijayabaskar, Prof Sultan Ahmed Ismail, former IAS official M Deenabandhu, industrialist Mallika Srinivasan and DMK MLA from Manaargudi T R B Rajaa, Dr. Narthaki Nataraj and medical practitioners J Amalorpavanathan and K Sivaraman.
- New history is being written in Tamil Nadu by having Thirumiku Narthaki Nataraj as the member of the State Development Policy Committee.
- This is the first time in India a Transgender people is in a high-level committee of a state government.
- State planning commission was originally established by the former chief minister M Karunanidhi on May 25, 1971.
- It was established as an advisory body to recommend developmental schemes for the state.
- It was renamed as State Development Policy Council by the earlier AIADMK government on April 23, 2020.

Keezhadi excavation - 7th phase

- A baby bone was found during excavation in Manalur area.
- Konthagai was only considered as the burial site.
- Keezhadi, Agaram and Manalur were residential areas.
- This is the first time a baby bone has been found in the Manalur area.

- The Tamilnadu CM raised the shutters of Mettur dam to release water for Kuruvai cultivation.
- This was the 18th time water was being released for Kuruvai cultivation on June 12.
- It targets to benefit 16.05 lakh acres.
- Irrigation will be across Tiruchirappalli, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Ariyalur, Preambular, Pudukkottai, and Cuddalore districts.

First session of the 16th Legislative Assembly

- The first session of the 16th Legislative Assembly began at the Kalaivanar Arangam.
- The assembly commenced its proceedings with the address of Governor Banwarilal Purohit.
- According to his address,
 - Working Women's hostel will be formed in all districts.
 - Smart cities with latest facilities will be developed near all metro cities in the State.
 - State will urge central government to constitute a national commission for the welfare of fishermen.
 - State to introduce a separate annual budget for agriculture.
 - State to introduce a new legislation to regulate ground water use.

Esther Duflo: A joint winner of the 2019 Nobel Prize in Economics, she is a professor of poverty alleviation and development economics at MIT, U.S. She has worked extensively in India over the last two decades, including in Tamil Nadu, where her research focuses on improving the well-being of the elderly, the learning outcomes of primary and pre-primary children and maternal health



Jean Drèze: A development economist, he is currently a visiting professor at Ranchi University in India. His recent books include *An Uncertain Glory: India and Its Contradictions* (with Amartya Sen) and *Sense and Solidarity: Jholawala Economics for Everyone*



Raghuram Rajan: He is a Katherine Dusak Miller Distinguished Service Professor of Finance at the University of Chicago's Booth School. He was the Governor of the Reserve Bank of India between 2013 and 2016, vice-chairman of the Board of the Bank for International Settlements (2015-16) and chief economist at the International Monetary Fund (2003-2006)



S. Narayan: A 1965-cadre IAS officer of the Tamil Nadu cadre, he was in public service till 2004. He was the Economic Adviser to the Prime Minister between 2003 and 2004. He is the author of *The Dravidian Years- Welfare and Politics in Tamil Nadu*



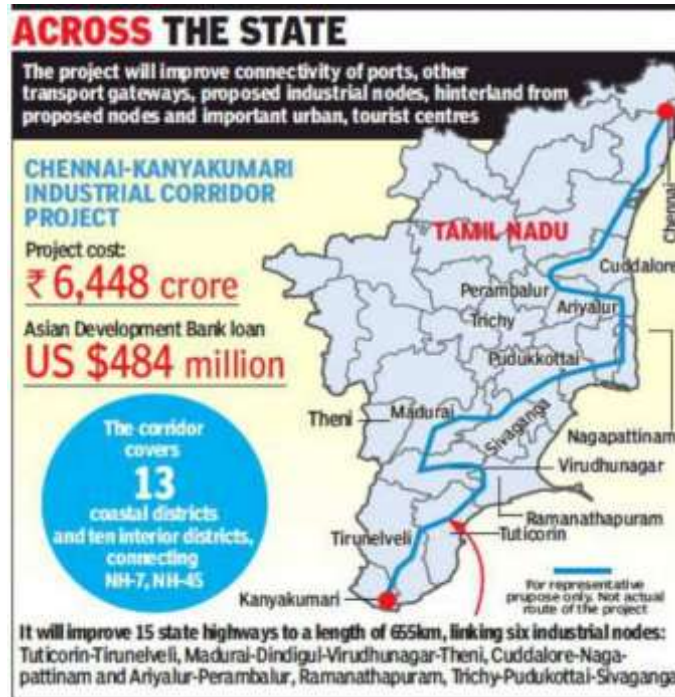
Arvind Subramanian: He was the Chief Economic Adviser (CEA) to the Government of India between 2014 and 2018, and is now a senior fellow at Brown University's Watson Institute for International and Public Affairs and a distinguished senior fellow and professor at the Center for Global Development, Ashoka University

- Newly-elected Tamil Nadu government has decided to constitute an “Economic advisory council to the chief minister”.
- Its members include,
 - Nobel laureate Esther Duflo of Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in USA,
 - Former Reserve Bank of India governor, Raghuram Rajan,
 - Former chief economic advisor to central government, Dr Arvind Subramanian,
 - Development economist, Jean Dreze and
 - Former Union finance secretary Dr S Narayan.

Reward for sportspersons - MK Stalin

- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin announced that his government will reward sportspersons who bag medals in the upcoming Tokyo Olympic Games.
- MK Stalin said that sportsperson who win a gold medal will be given Rs 3 crore as prize money.
- Those winning silver medals will be given Rs 2 crore and Rs 1 crore will be given to bronze medal winners.
- Gagan Narang, a Chennai native is still the only individual medallist from the state.
- He represented India in shooting and won a bronze in the 2012 London Olympics in the Men's 10m Air Rifle event.

Chennai - Kanyakumari Industrial Corridor



- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Government of India have signed a \$484 million loan.
- This is to improve transport connectivity and facilitate industrial development in the Chennai-Kanyakumari Industrial Corridor (CKIC) in the state of Tamil Nadu.
- CKIC is part of India's East Coast Economic Corridor (ECEC), which stretches from West Bengal to Tamil Nadu.

Covid -19 Vaccine & Relief measures

Names for corona viruses

New names proposed for Covid variants

- World Health Organisation has recommended several names, to label emerging coronavirus variants of global concern.
- It named B.1.617.2 variant, identified first in India, as 'Delta'.
- B.1.617.1 virus identified in India has been labelled as 'Kappa'.
- 'UK variant' was named as 'Alpha'.

H10N3

- First Human case of H10N3 bird flu was reported in eastern province of Jiangsu in China.
- H10N3 is a low pathogenic or less severe strain of virus in poultry.

Abdala vaccine




- Cuba said that its Abdala vaccine against the coronavirus had proved 92.28% effective in last-stage clinical trials.
- It is a three-shot vaccine.
- It is developed by the Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology in Cuba.

“Mixing and matching” of Covid-19 vaccines

- Canada has recommended “mixing and matching” of AstraZeneca, Pfizer and Moderna Covid-19 vaccines.
- National Advisory Committee on Immunization has advised Canadians to combine either “AstraZeneca-Oxford, Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna shots” interchangeably for specific situations.
- Research highlights, mixing shots of AstraZeneca and Pfizer vaccines were safe and effective in preventing the disease.
- It recommended first shot of AstraZeneca vaccine can be followed by shots of Moderna or Pfizer.

- A survey by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the National Institute of Virology has picked up samples with the possible presence of antibodies against the Nipah virus in some bat species.
- The samples were from a cave in Mahabaleshwar, Maharashtra.
- The survey was aimed at studying the prevalence of the Nipah virus (NiV) in bats of India.
- It is considered as one of the top-10 global priority list pathogens identified by the World Health Organization (WHO).

Note

- India has experienced four NiV outbreaks.
- The most recent outbreak started in Kerala in 2018.
- Nipah is considered dangerous as there is no medicine or vaccines and the death rate among those affected is high.

Corona-free Village Competitions

- Maharashtra government has launched “Corona-free Village Competitions”.
- Under this, three villages will be selected in each revenue district.
- They are selected on the basis of their good work and efforts in Covid-19 management.
- This competition is part of ‘My Village Corona Free’ initiative.

ZyCoV-D Vaccine

- Indian pharmaceutical company Zydus Cadila is soon going to apply Central Drugs Regulator (DCGI) for emergency approval of the corona vaccine ZyCoV-D.
- If approved, it will be the world’s first DNA-based vaccine.
- With this, the number of vaccines available in the country will increase to 4.
- ZyCoV-D is a needle free vaccine and will be fitted with a jet injector.
- It will be given in three dosages.

2DG adjunct therapy in Covid treatment

Directions for use of 2DG in COVID-19 Patients as per DCGI Approval

- The 2DG is approved for Emergency use as adjunct therapy to the standard of care in the treatment of COVID patients in the hospital settings.
- Ideally, 2DG should be prescribed as early as possible by Doctors for moderate to severe COVID patients for maximum duration up to 10 days.
- Uncontrolled diabetes, severe cardiac problem, ARDS, severe hepatic and renal impairment patients have not been studied yet with 2DG, hence caution should be exercised.
- 2DG should not be given to pregnant and lactating women and patients below 18 years.
- Patients/Attendants are advised to request their hospital to contact Dr Reddy’s Lab, Hyderabad for medicine supply at email: 2DG@drreddys.com

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) announced that the anti-COVID drug 2DG has been approved for emergency use as an adjunct therapy in the treatment of COVID-19 patients.
- DCGI approved the emergency use authorization of 2-deoxy-D-glucose (2-DG).
- It was approved as an adjunct therapy for moderate to severe COVID-19 patients.

PanBio COVID-19 test kit

- ICMR has approved second home-based Rapid Antigen Test kit named “PanBio COVID-19”.
- This test kit was developed by Abbott Rapid Diagnostics Division, Chicago.
- Earlier, ICMR had given its approval to “CoviSelf test kit”.
- That was developed by Pune-based Mylab Discovery Solutions.

30 crore COVID-19 vaccine doses - Biological-E

- The Health Ministry has finalised arrangements with Hyderabad-based vaccine manufacturer Biological-E to reserve 30 crore COVID-19 vaccine doses (Corbevax).
- The Centre will be making an advance payment of Rs 1,500 crore to Biological-E for this order.
- This is the second made-in-India vaccine after Bharat Biotech’s COVAXIN.

AmB tablets

- Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Hyderabad has developed nano-fibre based oral tablets of Amphotericin B, called as AmB.
- IIT Hyderabad researchers decided to keep this technology free of intellectual property rights.
- This medicine is reportedly cheaper, higher AmB absorption and less Nephrotoxicity.
- AmB was earlier available in injectable form only.
- It is used to treat fungal infections post COVID treatment.

Covovax



- Serum Institute of India has begun manufacturing the first batch of Covovax.
- It is a Covid-19 vaccine developed by Novavax Inc.
- Novavax is an US-based biotechnology company.

Centre for World University Rankings 2021-22

- Harvard University has topped the ranking globally followed by Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Stanford University, University of Cambridge, and Oxford University respectively.
- As many as 68 Indian institutes have made it to the list of the top 2000 higher education institutes across the world.
- IIM-Ahmedabad has bagged 415th rank, followed by the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) at 459th rank.

Pesticides - leading cause of poisoning in India

- 'Toxicoepidemiology of poisoning exhibited in Indian population from 2010 to 2020: A systematic review and meta-analysis' was the study published by the British Medical Journal.
- It revealed that pesticides were the main cause of poisoning in India, with an overall prevalence of 63 per cent.
- It is due to widespread use of pesticides for agricultural and household activities.
- According to the study, the prevalence of pesticide poisoning in the adult population was 65 per cent and 22 per cent in children.
- An analysis of the region-wise distribution of the prevalence of poisoning showed that it was
 - The Highest in north India at 79 per cent
 - Followed by south India (65.9 per cent),
 - Central India (59.2 per cent),
 - West India (53.1 per cent),
 - North east India (46.9 per cent) and
 - East India (38.5 per cent).

UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration report

- UN Environment Programme (UNEP) and Food & Agriculture Organisation of UN (FAO) launched 'UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration' report for 2021-2030.
- It called the nations to meet commitments of restoring 1 billion hectares of land.
- As per the report, the world is facing triple threat of climate change, loss of nature and pollution.

May month records low temperature

- May month of this year in India recorded the lowest average maximum temperatures in since 1977.
- The figure for entire India stood at 34.18-degree Celsius, as per data shared by India Meteorological data (IMD).
- This happens to be lowest in 44 years and fourth lowest since 1901.
- The lowest ever average maximum temperature in May was recorded in the year 1917 at 32.68-degree Celsius.

Industrial Deep Decarbonization Initiative



- India along with Govt. of United Kingdom launched the Industrial Deep Decarbonization Initiative (IDDI).
- It was launched under the Clean Energy Ministerial (CEM) at the 12th Chief Energy Ministerial (CEM).
- IDDI is a global coalition of public and private organisations who are working to stimulate demand for low carbon industrial materials.
- It is coordinated by United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO).
- IDDI is co-led by the UK and India.
- The current members also include Germany and Canada.

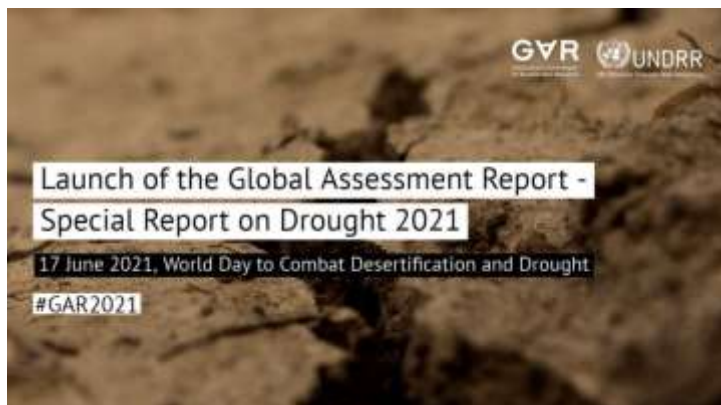
Sustainable Development Report 2021

- Sustainable Development Report was prepared and released by experts from UN Sustainable Development Solution Network (SDSN).
- The index compares how countries implement 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- This year Finland was ranked highest in the index.
- This is the first time a Nordic country has ranked at the top of SDG Index.
- India ranked 120 in this report.

Green Hydrogen Initiatives

- India hosted a two-day summit on Green Hydrogen Initiatives.
- This Summit involves the BRICS nations.
- This prestigious event offers a platform to share their respective Green Hydrogen initiatives & views on how to take it to next level in their countries.
- This Online event was hosted by India's largest power producer and global energy majors called NTPC Ltd.
- Green Hydrogen is obtained entirely from renewable power sources.

Special Report on Drought 2021



- The report titled “Global Assessment Report on Disaster Risk Reduction: Special Report on Drought 2021” was published recently.
- It was published by UNDRR (United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction).
- It will be a part of discussions at vital UN climate talks called Cop26.
- Cop26 is scheduled to take place in Glasgow of Scotland in November 2021.
- As per the report, Drought is a hidden global crisis which can become “the next pandemic” if no urgent action is taken.
- About 1.5 billion people are directly affected by drought this century.
- Economic cost was roughly estimated at \$124bn.

Ramgarh Vishdhari wildlife sanctuary



- Ramgarh Vishdhari wildlife sanctuary becomes the 4th Tiger reserve of Rajasthan.
- This will be the 52nd Tiger Reserve of India.
- Rajasthan's other three tiger reserves are,
 - Ranthambore Tiger Reserve (RTR) in Sawai Madhopur,
 - Sariska Tiger Reserve (STR) in Alwar and
 - Mukundra Hills Tiger Reserve (MHTR) in Kota.

Note

- Project Tiger was launched in 1973 with 9 tiger reserves.
- It is an ongoing Centrally Sponsored Scheme of the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change.

Times 50 Most Desirable Women 2020

- The Times 50 Most Desirable Women 2020 list has been unveiled recently.
- It features women under 40 across various fields.
- Rhea Chakraborty has bagged the number 1 spot on Times Most Desirable Women 2020 list.
- She was in the news for most of last year due to the sudden demise of Sushant Singh Rajput and the controversy around his death.
- Miss Universe 2020, 3rd runner-up Adline Castelino bagged the second spot in the list.
- Actress Disha Patani, Kiara Advani and Deepika Padukone were on the third, fourth and fifth spot respectively.

FCI rice to be used for ethanol production

- The Central government has allocated 78,000 tonnes of rice procured for food security purposes to be diverted to ethanol production at a subsidized rate of ₹20 a kg.
- However, the share of rice in ethanol production is minuscule and maize would form the first feedstock for grain-based ethanol production.

Explanation:

- This is a part of the government's decision to double distilling capacities by 2025, partly by encouraging a rise within the share of grain-based ethanol production from the present specialization in molasses-based production.
- Earlier, a road map advancing the target date for achieving 20% blending of ethanol in petrol by five years to 2025 was presented.
- The last two years have seen blending levels of around 5%.
- The center is targeting an ethanol production of 1,500 crore liters by 2025, out of which, 740 crore liters, would be from grain-based distilleries, with the rest coming from sugar-based distilleries.
- Currently, a third of the 710-crore liter ethanol production capacity comes from grains.
- Only 38 crore liters of grain-based ethanol is employed for fuel.

BAFTA TV Awards 2021



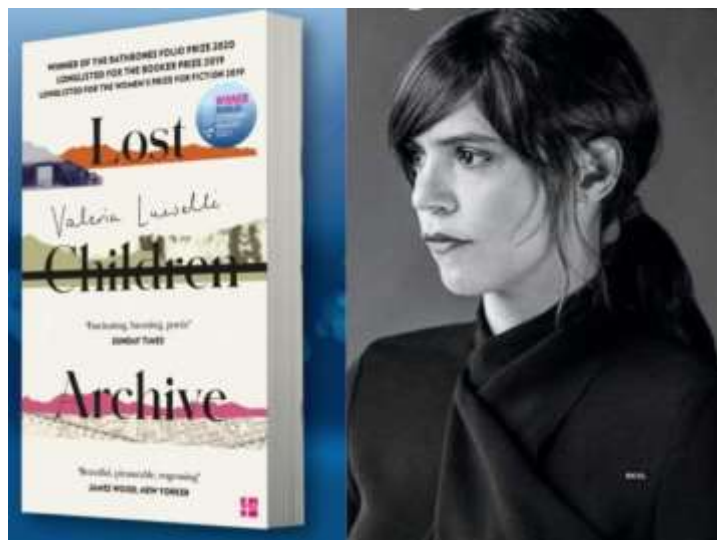
- Michaela Coel scooped Best Actress and Best Mini-series awards for her show I May Destroy You.

WHO Director-General Special Recognition Award



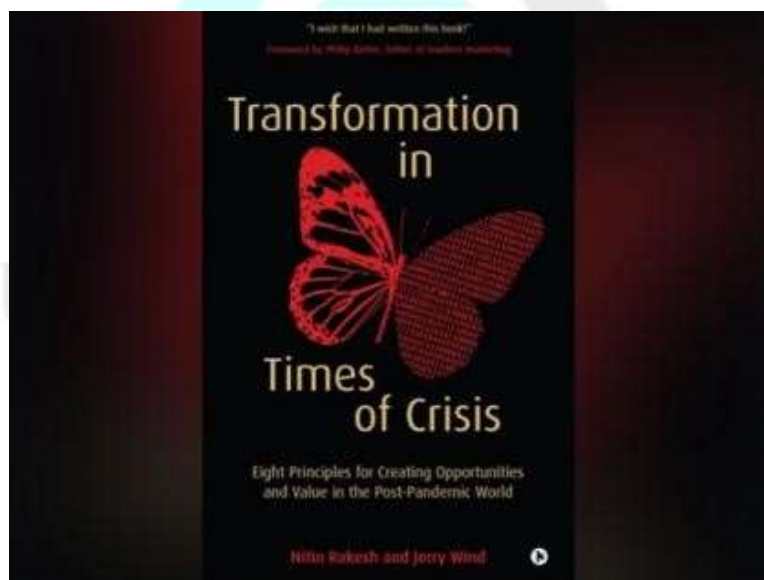
- World Health Organisation has awarded Union Health Minister Dr Harsh Vardhan with 'WHO Director-General Special Recognition Award'.

- It's noted that the author also won the Rathbones Folio Prize in 2020 for the same book.

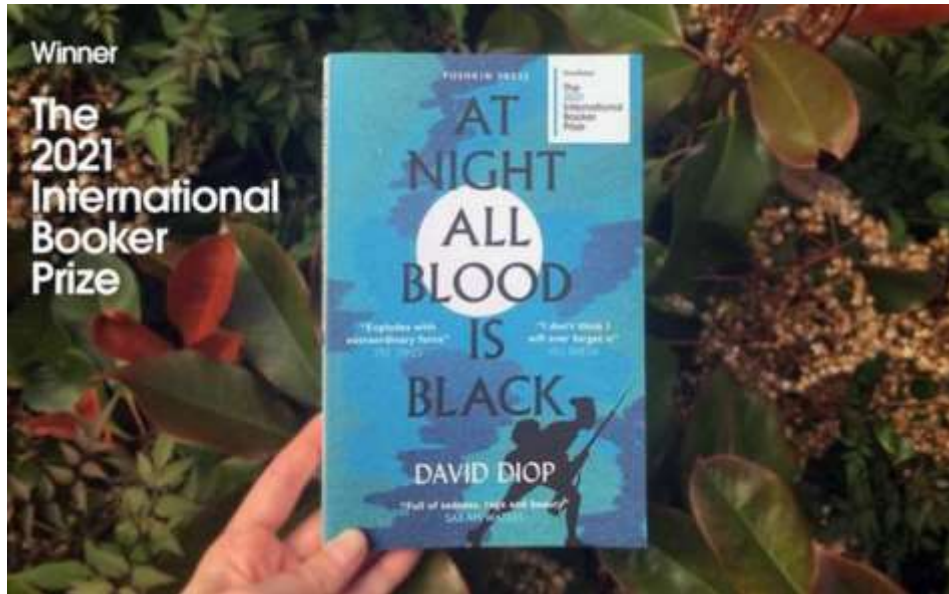
International Business Book of the Year Award 2021

- This is for his photo of an Orangutan clinging to a tree.
- The photograph is titled ‘The World is Going Upside Down’.
- Vijayan was adjudged as the overall winner of the competition from over 8,000 entries.
- Nature TTL is the world’s leading online nature photography resource.

The PEN Pinter prize



- Tsitsi Dangarembga, Zimbabwean writer has been awarded the PEN Pinter prize.
- She has been awarded the PEN Pinter prize, praised for her “ability to capture and communicate vital truths even amidst times of upheaval”.
- Dangarembga was also shortlisted for the 2020 Booker Prize for her work ‘This Mournable Body’.

- He is the first Indian to have received the prestigious award, in the last 20 years.

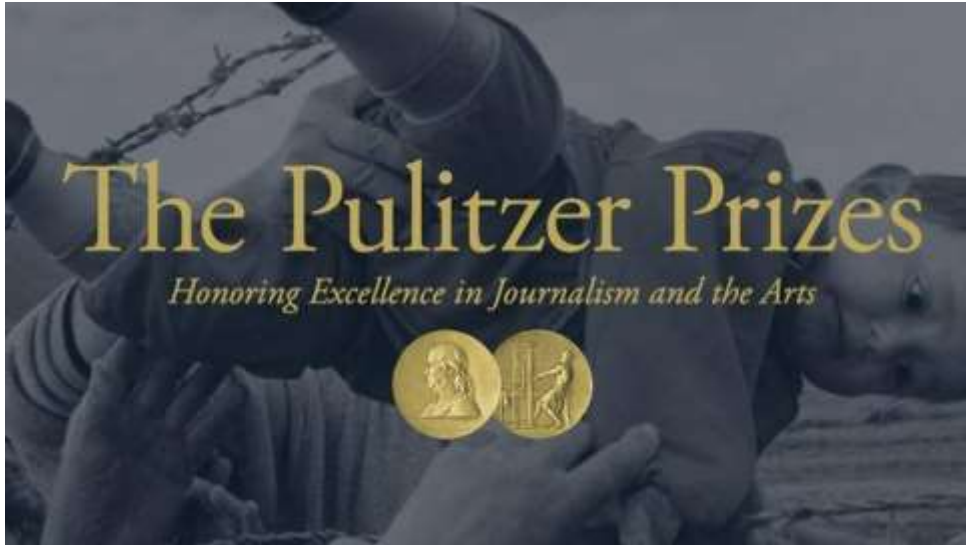

Pulitzer Prize 2021



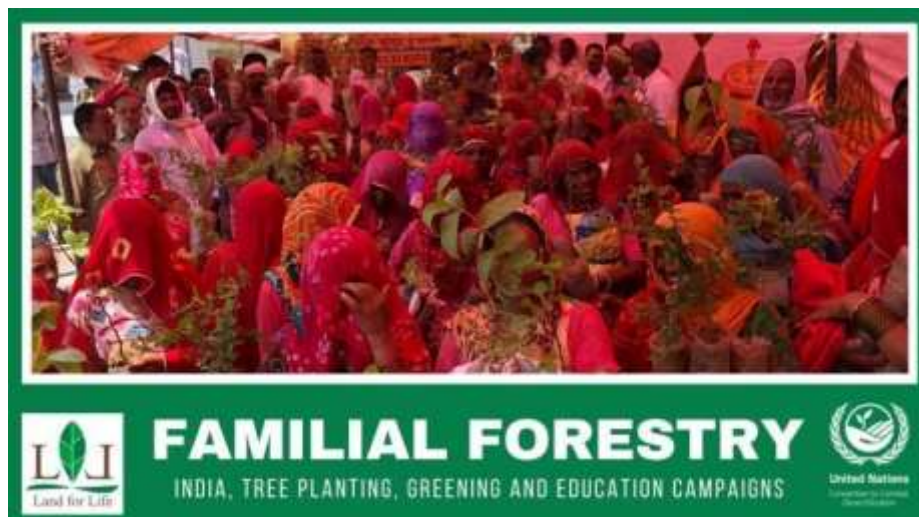
- Pulitzer Prize 2021 was recently conferred recently.

Jagjit Pavadia - President of the INCB



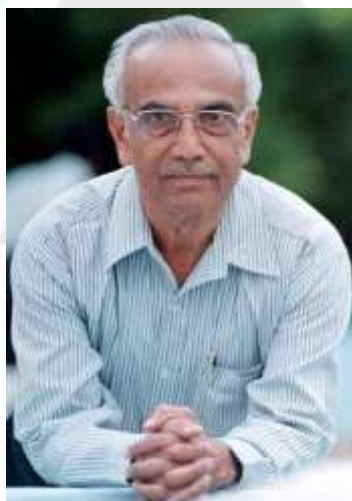
- Jagjit Pavadia has been elected president of the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB).

- Mr. Alphonse had been elected to the State Legislative Assembly from Tenkasi constituency in 1989 and 1991.
- The State Minorities Commission was constituted to safeguard the rights and interests of both religious and linguistic minorities.
- The constitution of the State Minorities Commission was ordered through a G.O. in 1989.
- It was done under the DMK government headed by Chief Minister M. Karunanidhi.
- An Act was passed to make it a statutory body in 2010.



Ajit Mishra expert group

- The Central Government has constituted an Expert Group under the Chairmanship of Professor Ajit Mishra.
- He is a renowned economist.
- The committee is to provide technical inputs and recommendations on fixation of Minimum Wages and National Floor Wages to the Government.

New Special Director of CBI



- The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of Praveen Sinha as the Special Director of the Central Bureau of Investigation.
- The Special Director is the second senior-most position in the agency after the Director.
- The post was vacant since the last three years.
- It was earlier held by Rakesh Asthana.
- The committee is composed of the Prime Minister of India, who is the Chairman, and the Minister of Home Affairs.

Nomination of members to Rajya Sabha

- The senior advocate Mahesh Jethmalani has been nominated to the Rajya Sabha.

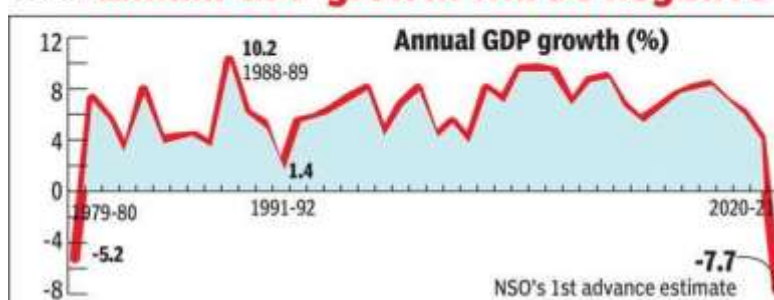
About Financial ups and downs

New loan products

- Public sector banks (PSBs) have announced support measures and launch of new loan products to mitigate economic impact of Covid-19 pandemic.
- PSBs would provide unsecured loans of up to 5 lakh rupees to individuals.
- Loan can be utilized to meet their and family members' treatment cost.
- Indian Banks Association and State Bank of India announced three new loan products in Mumbai.
- One will provide fresh lending support to vaccine manufacturers, hospitals or dispensaries, manufacturers & suppliers of oxygen, pathology labs, Ventilators, importers of vaccines, Covid drugs logistics firms and patients for treatment.
- The other two loans includes the Healthcare Business Loan of up to 2 crore rupees and Business loans for Healthcare Facilities of up to 100 Crore rupees.

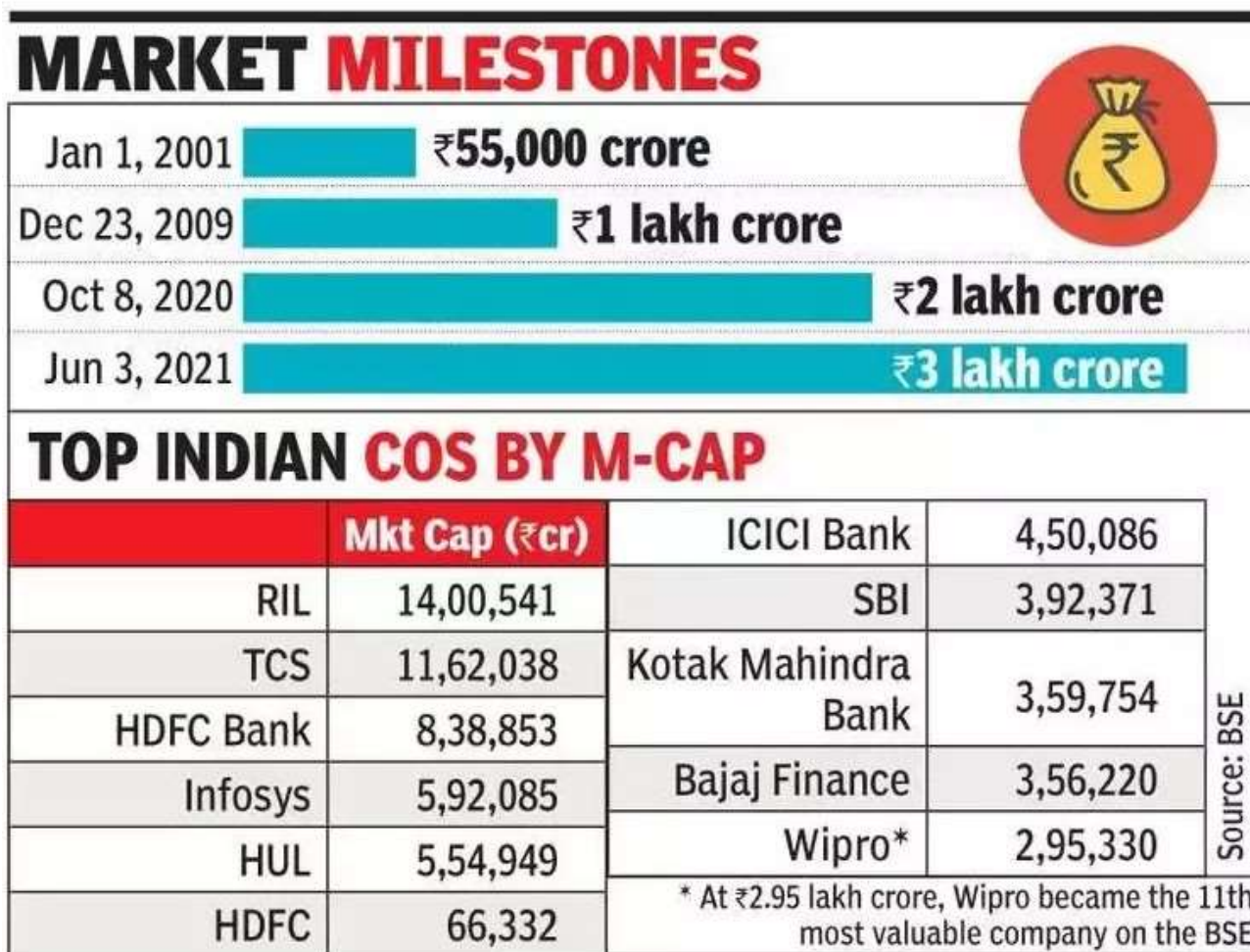


- The Central Statistics Office (CSO) released India's gross domestic product (GDP) data for January-March quarter of financial year 2020-21.
- Before second wave of Covid-19, India's GDP grew 1.6 per cent in fourth quarter (January-March) of 2020-21.
- However, for all quarters together, GDP contracted to 7.3 percent.

Business Confidence Survey

- FICCI has published its quarterly “Business Confidence Survey”.
- According to it, Business confidence of Indian companies has come down to its lowest in three quarters in May.
- In last survey, confidence was at decadal high.
- Business Confidence Index (BCI) declined due to decline in optimism levels of participating companies with respect to current conditions.
- BCI stands at 51.5 in latest survey, after hitting 74.2 in previous survey round.

Wipro to touch Rs 3 trillion in m-cap



- Wipro has touched Rs 3 trillion in market capitalisation for the first time.
- It has become the third Indian IT firm to achieve this milestone after Tata Consultancy Services and Infosys.
- India has a total of 13 listed firms that have crossed the Rs 3 trillion m-cap.
- Wipro now ranks at 14th place.
- Reliance Industries is India’s most valued company with a market capitalisation of ₹14.05 trillion.
- It is followed by Tata Consultancy Services Ltd (₹11.58 trillion) and HDFC Bank (₹8.33 trillion).

Initial public offer - Paytm

- Paytm has announced that it will bring an initial public offer (IPO) worth USD 3 billion later this year.
- When companies wish to raise funds to fuel their growth, they sell a part of their stock on the stock market.
- This process is called an initial public offering, or IPO.
- In response to this Paytm's stock has risen largely in the grey market.
- The IPO grey market is an unofficial market that performs outside SEBI's purview.
- All transactions here are undertaken on the basis of trust and carry counterparty risk.

RBI monetary policy

- Reserve Bank of India unveiled its bi-monthly monetary policy.
- It has kept the interest rates unchanged.

Highlights

- Monetary policy opened a Rs 15,000-crore liquidity window for contact-intensive sectors such as hotels and tourism.
- On the liquidity front, it announced securities purchases of Rs 40,000 crore in June quarter while Rs 1.2 lakh crore in September under G-SAP 1.0 to revive the growth.
- Repo rate was kept at 4 per cent while reverse repo rate was kept unchanged at 3.35 per cent.
- G-SAP 2.0 will be launched to buy bonds worth Rs 1.2 trillion.
- Under it, RBI will also buy bonds issued by state governments.

Note

- G-SAP 1.0 is Government Security Acquisition Programme 1.0 announced by RBI.
- It is for orderly evolution of yield curve in Financial Year 2022.

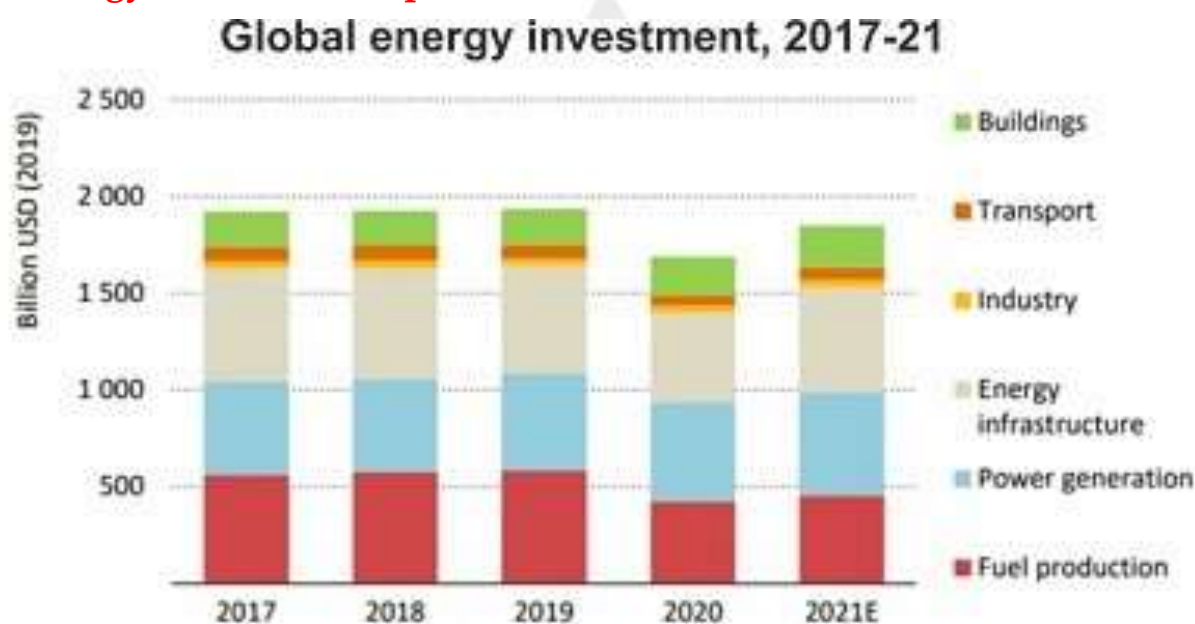
Bitcoin Investment Gain - 2020

- The US traders have benefited the most in Bitcoin Investment Gain in 2020 with a profit of \$4.1 billion.
- This is in according to the latest report by Chainalysis.
- Chinese traders stood second, with a profit of \$1.1 billion.
- India has been ranked at 18th spot with a profit of \$241 million.

SWIFT gpi Instant facility

- ICICI Bank has announced has tied up with SWIFT to offer a facility that helps overseas partner banks to send instant remittances on behalf of their customers to the beneficiary in India.
- The beneficiary gets the credit to the bank account instantly.
- This makes ICICI Bank the first bank in Asia-Pacific and the second globally to offer the facility, called 'SWIFT gpi instant', for cross border inward payments.
- The personal remittances of up to 2 lakhs will be sent through 'SWIFT gpi instant'.
- This can be processed instantly and credited into the beneficiary account held with any bank in India.
- It is sent via the IMPS network.

World Energy Investment Report 2021



- The International Energy Agency (IEA) has released the World Energy Investment Report, 2021.
- According to this report, global energy investment is expected to rebound this year and increase 10% year-on-year to around \$1.9 trillion.
- Most of this investment will flow towards power and end-use sectors, shifting out of traditional fossil fuel production.
- The global energy demand is projected to rise 4.6% year-on-year in 2021, offsetting its contraction in 2020.
- Energy efficiency sector will see a 10% rise in investment, though the low fossil fuel price may act as a deterrent.

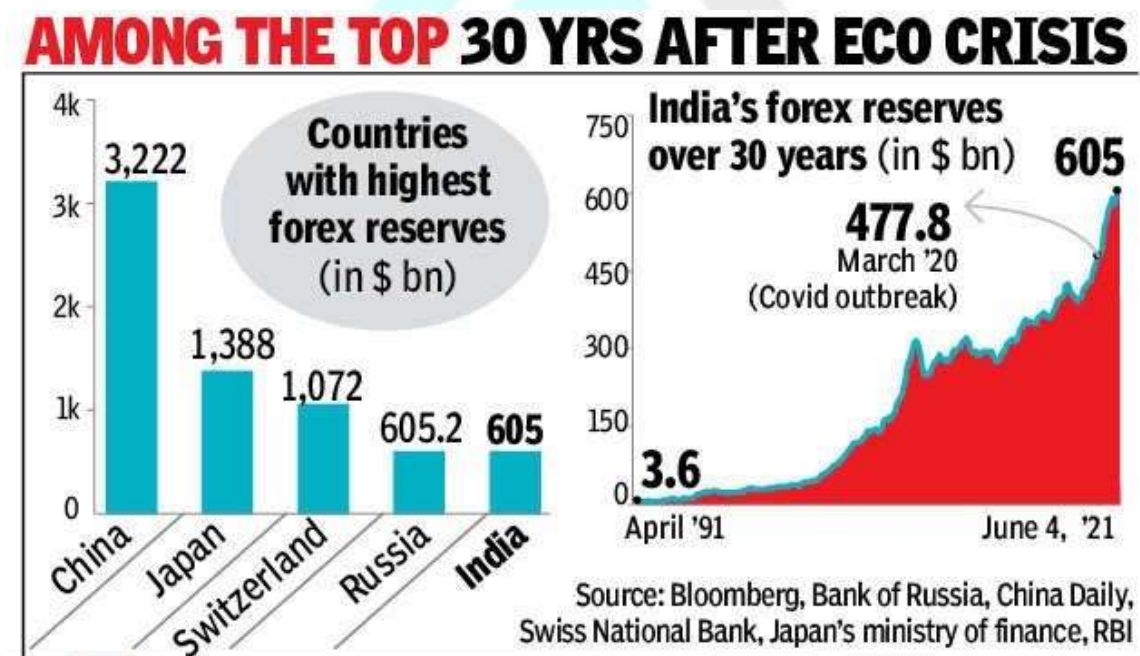
Global corporate tax deal

- Finance ministers from wealthy G7 nations have endorsed a new global corporate tax deal.
- The agreement will now be discussed in detail at a meeting of G20 financial ministers and central bank governors in July.
- The aim is to counter tax avoidance to make companies pay in the countries where they do business.
- The agreement commits states to a global minimum corporate tax rate of 15% to avoid countries undercutting each other.

World Bank's Global Economic Prospects Update

- According to this, the Global economy is expected to expand 5.6 per cent in 2021.
- This would be the fastest post-recession pace in 80 years because of strong rebounds from a few major economies.
- US growth is projected to 6.8 percent in 2021.
- China will rebound to 8.5 percent.
- Rebound in group of developing countries, other than China, is expected to be 4.4 percent.

India's forex reserves



- India's forex reserves crossed \$600 mark for the first time.
- With this, India equals Russia as the fourth largest reserve holder worldwide.
- Forex are assets on reserves which are held by central bank in foreign currencies.
- It includes bonds, treasury bills and other government securities.
- Most of the foreign exchange reserves are held in U.S. dollars.

DBS Bank - World's Best Bank 2021

- DBS Bank has been named by Forbes in their list of World's Best Banks 2021.
- DBS was ranked 1 out of 30 domestic and international banks in India for the second consecutive year.
- This is the third edition of the 'World's Best Banks' list by Forbesc.
- It was conducted in partnership with market research firm Statista.
- Recently, DBS Bank India was recognised as 'India's Best International Bank 2021' by Asiamoney.
- DBS was named 'Safest Bank in Asia' for the 12th consecutive year by New York-based trade publication Global Finance in 2020.
- The bank was also Global Finance's pick for 'Best Bank in the World' in the same year.
- Previously, DBS was named 'World's Best Bank' by leading financial publication Euromoney in 2019.
- CEO of DBS bank is Piyush Gupta.
- Its Headquarters is in Singapore;
- Its tag line is "Make Banking Joyful".

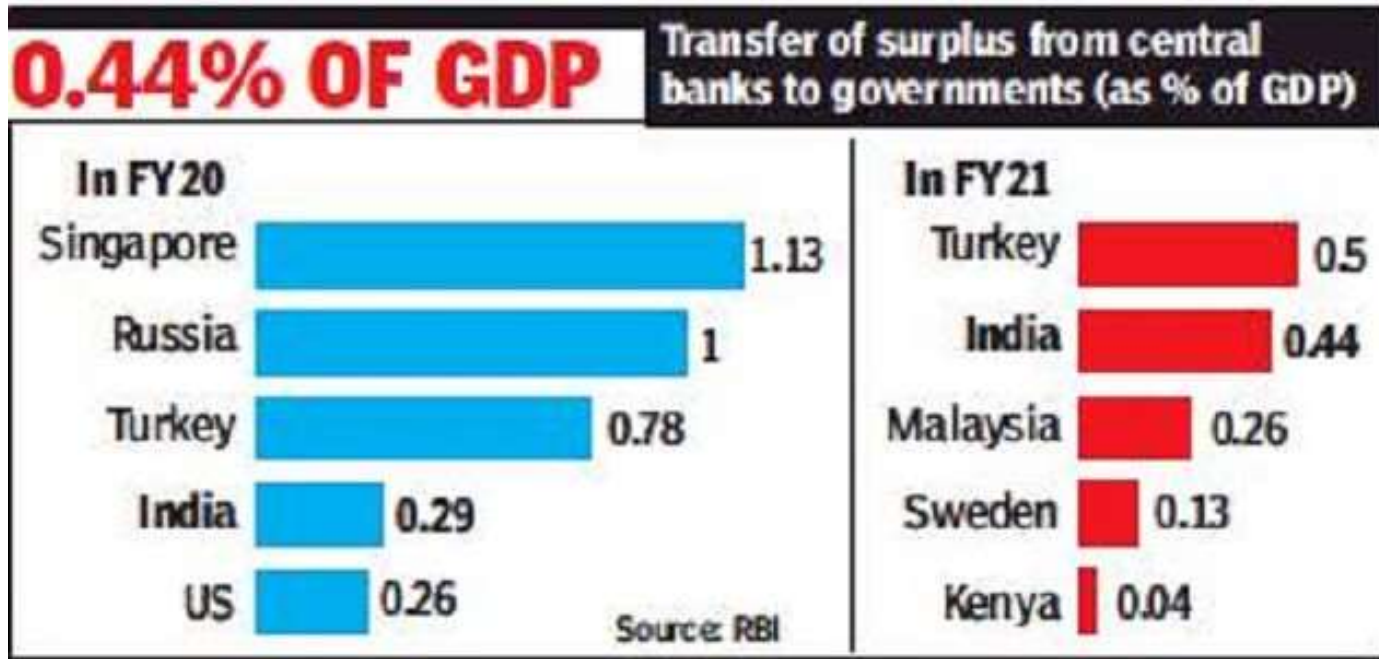
Food Price Index - May

- United Nations announced recently that World food prices rose for the 12th consecutive month in in May.
- This is the highest level since September 2011.
- This announcement was made based on the Food Price Index released by the Food and Agriculture Organisation.
- On a year-on-year basis, prices were up 39.7 per cent in May.
- FAO also issued its first forecast for world cereal production in 2021.
- It predicted output of nearly 2.821 billion tonnes.
- It is a new record and 1.9 per cent up on 2020 levels.

India's bank credit-to-GDP ratio

- The bank credit-to-GDP ratio rose to a five-year high of a little over 56 per cent in 2020.
- This is according to the latest data from the Bank for International Settlements (BIS).
- At a 56.075 per cent credit-to-GDP ratio, total outstanding bank credit stood at USD 1.52 trillion in the country in 2020.

Second in share of central bank surplus transfers - India



- The Reserve Bank of India was second in terms of reserves transferred to the government as a percentage of gross domestic product (GDP) for the fiscal year 2020-21.
- Turkey has been ranked first.
- The surplus transferred by RBI constitutes 0.44% of GDP.
- The Central Bank of the Republic of Turkey constitutes 0.5% of GDP.

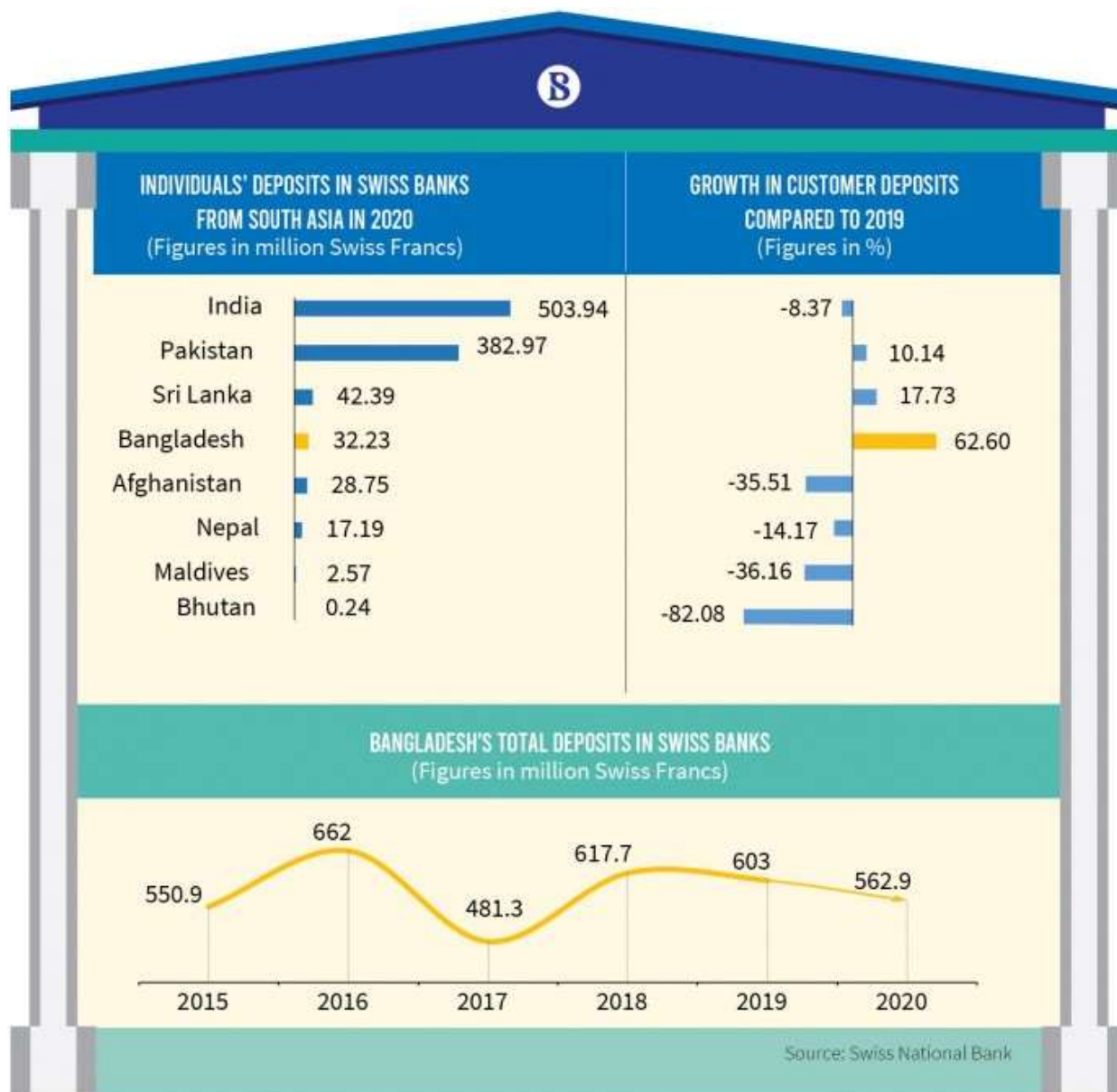
Centrum to takeover PMC bank

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) cleared proposal to takeover of Punjab and Maharashtra Cooperatives Bank (PMC Bank).
- The Consortium of non-bank lender Centrum Financial Services & fintech start-up BharatPe will take over it.
- This decision was taken in the backdrop of collapse of Punjab & Maharashtra Cooperatives Bank.

RBI's Approval

- The RBI has decided to grant in-principle approval to Centrum so as to set up a small finance bank.
- It will be set up under on-tap licensing norms.
- On-tap licensing means, when regulator gives out bank licences on continuous basis rather than once in several years.

Annual bank statistics 2020



- The Annual bank statistics 2020 is released by Swiss national bank.
- India with Swiss Francs (CHF) 2.55 billion (INR 20, 706 Crore) has been placed at 51st place in the list of foreign clients' money in Swiss Banks during 2020.
- It has increased from 899 million CHF (INR 6, 625 Crore) in 2019.
- The United Kingdom (UK) topped the list with CHF 377 billion.
- It is followed by US (152 billion).

Kerala launches 'Knowledge Economy Mission'

- The project will be launched to bring ongoing efforts of providing employment to educated people and support 'knowledge workers' under a single programme.
- It was being spearheaded by Kerala Development and Innovation Strategic Council (K-DISC).
- For implementation and funding purposes, a 'knowledge economy fund' will be created.

World Investment Report 2021



- "World Investment Report 2021" was released by UN Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD).
- As per the report, India received USD 64 billion in foreign direct investments (FDI) in 2020.
- It has emerged the fifth largest recipient of FDI inflows across the world.
- The United States remained the largest recipient of FDI.
- China was the second-largest recipient.

Global home price index

- India has moved down by 12 spots in the global home price index.
- This is according to Knight Frank's Global House Price Index for Q1 2021.
- India is ranked at 55th position in terms of property prices.
- Property price in India has declined amid covid-19 pandemic.

Note

- Turkey is the topper in annual rankings with prices of 32 percent.
- Spain emerged as weakest-performing territory in Q1 2021.
- Space is followed by India with 1.6 per cent decline on prices.

These rate reductions/exemptions shall remain in force up to 30th September 2021.

- 44th meeting of Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council was chaired by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on June 12, 2021.



- GST Council has accepted recommendations of Group of Ministers (GoM) which was set up to look on tax relief on Covid-19 medical supplies.
- Several changes in GST rate have been made.
- This would be applicable till September 30, 2021.
- GST rate for ambulances has been reduced from 28 percent to 12 percent.
- GST rate for COVID-19 testing kits, medical-grade oxygen and ventilator have been reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent.
- Rate on hand sanitisers has been reduced from 18 percent to 5 percent.
- For temperature check equipment, rate was reduced from 18 percent to 5 percent.
- 5% GST tax will be applicable on pulse oximeters, including personal imports, from earlier 12 percent.
- On specified inflammatory diagnostic kits was reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent.
- GST rates on gas or electric or other furnaces used in crematorium including the installation charges has been reduced to 5% from 18%.
- No GST rate would be imposed on Covid-19 related drugs including Tocilizumab and Amphotericin B.
- Earlier it was kept at 5 percent.
- GST rates on anticoagulants such as Heparin and Remdesivir have been cut to 5 percent from 12 percent.
- 5% tax would be applied on ventilator masks or cannula or helmets.

New Definition of Small and medium companies

- The Ministry of corporate affairs has expanded the definition of small and medium sized companies (SMCs).
- As per expanded definition, Small & Medium Companies is an unlisted company, a bank, an insurance or a financial institution with sales up to Rs 250 crore and borrowings up to Rs 50 crore.
- Earlier limit for sales was Rs 50 crore and for borrowings was Rs 10 crore.
- Now, SMCs are permitted to avail number of exemptions under Company (Accounting Standards) Rules 2021.
- It will reduce complexity of regulatory filings for smaller firms.

- The Central government has hiked the minimum support price (MSP) for common paddy, pulses, oilseeds and coarse cereals.
- The decision was taken by the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs.

Note

- The Union Budget for 2018-19 had announced that MSP would be kept at levels of 1.5 the cost of production.
- The MSP is fixed twice a year on the recommendations of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP).
- CACP is a statutory body and submits separate reports recommending prices for kharif and rabi seasons.

DPIIT notifies 74% FDI cap in insurance sector under automatic route

- The DPIIT has notified the government's decision to increase the foreign direct investment (FDI) limit in the insurance sector under the automatic route to 75 per cent from 49 per cent earlier
- The Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has notified the government's decision to increase the foreign direct investment (FDI) limit in the insurance sector under the automatic route to 75 per cent from 49 per cent earlier.
- According to a press note issued by the department, the decision will take effect from the date of FEMA (Foreign Exchange Management Act) notification.
- The Insurance (Amendment) Bill, 2021, was passed by Parliament in March. The Bill amended the Insurance Act, 1938.
- FDI in the insurance sector was increased from 26 per cent to 49 per cent in 2015. The announcement for hiking the FDI limit was made in the Union Budget 2021-22 on February 1.
- The new arrangement is expected to benefit 23 private life insurers, 21 private non-life insurers and seven specialised private health insurance companies.

6. SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Inventions and updations of Science

NGC 691



- NASA's Hubble Space Telescope captured beautiful photo of spiral galaxy called "NGC 691".
- It is an unbarred spiral galaxy located about 125 million light-years away in Aries constellation.
- It was discovered by German-born British astronomer William Herschel in November, 1786.

AmbiTAG



- IIT Ropar has developed the "AmbiTAG".
- This is India's first indigenous temperature data logger developed for cold chain management.
- AmbiTAG is shaped as USB device.
- It continuously records temperature of its immediate surroundings.
- It can detect temperatures "from -40 to +80 degrees" in any time zone for 90 days on a single charge.
- Logger recorded temperature that will further help to know whether particular item transported from anywhere in world is still usable or perished because of temperature variation.
- This information is significant for transportation of vaccines including Covid-19 vaccine, organs and blood transportation.

Vajra Kavach Disinfection System



- Mumbai-based startup 'Indra Water' has developed a disinfection system named 'Vajra Kavach' that removes the scourge of viral particles from protective equipment
- It can remove any possible traces of the SARS-Cov-2 virus from PPE, N95 masks, coats, gloves & gowns
- The disinfected PPEs and other materials can be reused by healthcare workers
- The system has a multistage disinfection process with over 99.999% efficiency in just a few minutes

- Mumbai-based start-up, Indra water has developed “Vajra Kavach Disinfection System”.
- This removes scourge of viral particles from equipment used by Corona warriors front line workers.
- Disinfection System removes any possible traces of SARS-Cov-2 virus from Personal Protective Equipment, coats, gloves, N95 masks and gowns.

SWASTIIK technology

- CSIR-National Chemical Laboratory (CSIR-NCL), Pune has launched a new technique called SWASTIIK technology.
- It helps to disinfect water by using natural oils.
- It was launched because, water-borne diseases have increased India's disease burden.
- This technology was developed in backdrop of National Jal Jeevan Mission (NJJM).
- NJJM recently issued an advisory for states and Union territories to monitor and survey water quality and ensure potable water amid rising covid-19 cases.

Madad Map

- It is India's first country-wide map showing availability of hospital beds in real-time updates.
- This portal was launched by Project Madad (help).
- Washington-based Dr Rajesh Anumolu was head architect of 'Madad Maps'.

Davinci+ and Veritas

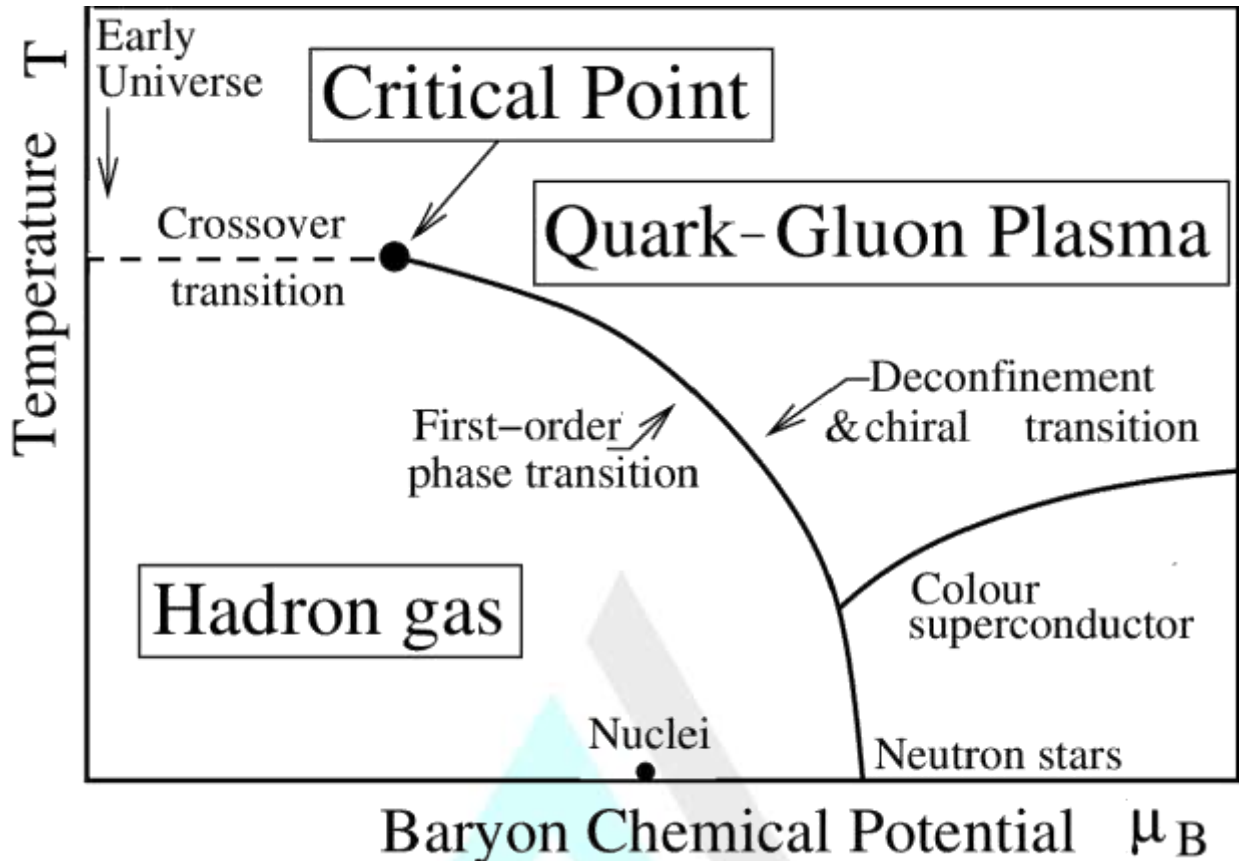


- NASA, has announced its two new robotic missions namely Davinci+ and Veritas.
- These are to examine to Venus.
- They will be launched in between 2028 and 2030.
- Davinci+ is “Deep Atmosphere Venus Investigation of Noble gases, Chemistry, and Imaging” mission.
- It will measure atmosphere of Venus.
- It also seeks to determine whether Venus ever had an ocean.
- Veritas is called as “Venus Emissivity, Radio Science, InSAR, Topography, and Spectroscopy”.
- It will map surface of Venus to understand its geologic history.
- It will discover if volcanoes and earthquakes are still happening.

LEO satellites - Internet connectivity

- OneWeb is a Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellite communications operator.
- It has launched its next batch of 36 satellites from Russia.
- With the latest launch, OneWeb’s total in-orbit constellation stands at 218 satellites.
- These would be a part of OneWeb’s 648 LEO satellite fleet.
- Using LEO satellites OneWeb seeks to offer connectivity across the UK, Alaska, Northern Europe, Greenland, the Arctic Seas and Canada.
- It calls this programme the ‘Five to 50’ service.
- It offers internet connectivity to all regions north of 50 degrees latitude.

Quark-gluon plasma



- Smashing together lead particles at 99.9999991% the speed of the light, the first matter that appeared after the Big Bang has been recreated.
- This primordial type of matter is known as quark-gluon plasma, or QGP.
- This matter lasted only for a fraction of a second.
- This new study is performed by researchers from the University of Copenhagen, Denmark.

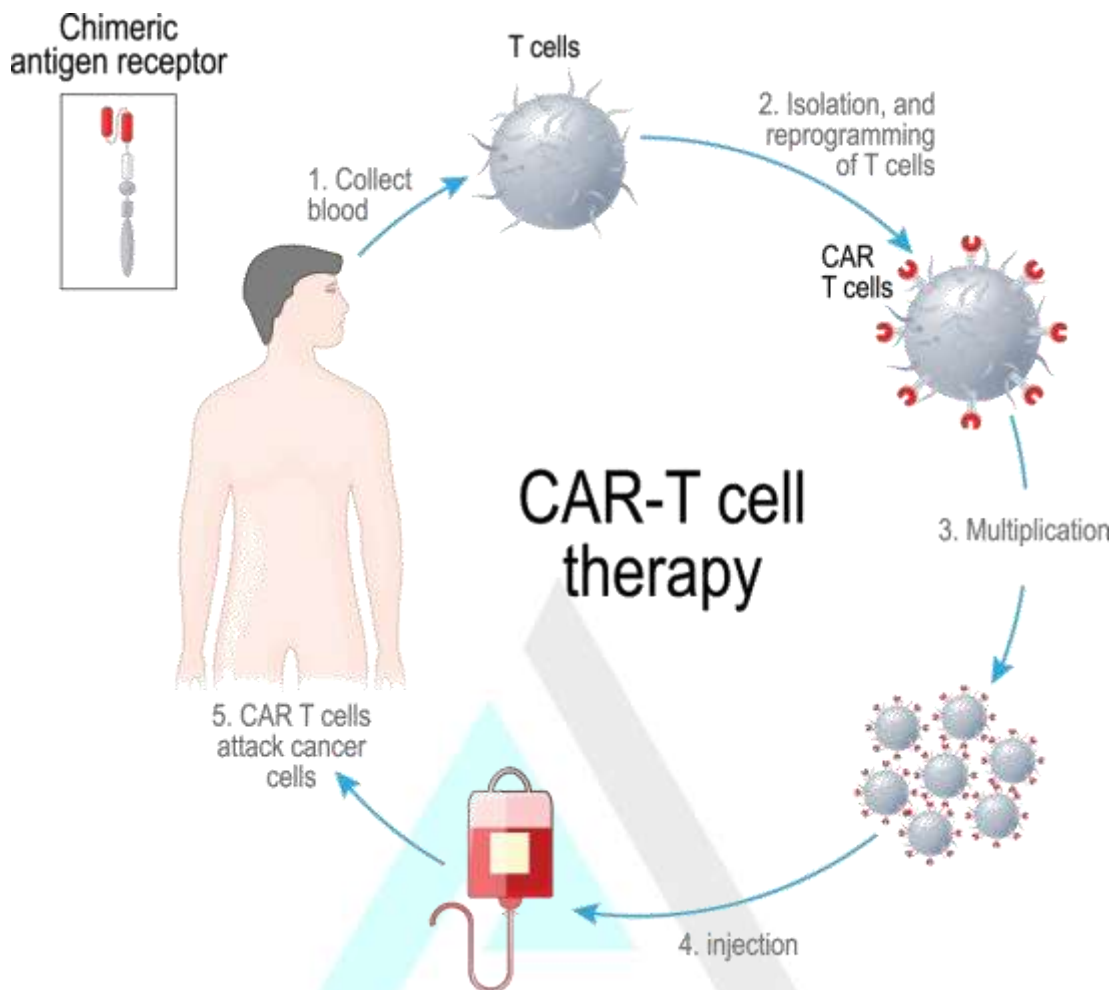
'EAST' - China's Artificial Sun

- The China's EAST (Experimental Advanced Superconducting Tokamak) reactor is an advanced nuclear fusion experimental research device.
- The EAST Tokamak device is designed to mimic the energy generation process of the sun.
- It replicates the process of nuclear fusion process carried out by the sun and stars.
- It has set a new record after it ran at 216 million degrees Fahrenheit (120 million degrees Celsius) for 101 seconds.
- EAST is one of three major domestic tokamaks that are presently being operated across the country.
- Other two are HL-2A reactor and J-TEXT.
- Also, in 2020, South Korea's KSTAR reactor set a record by maintaining a plasma temperature of 100 million degrees C for 20 seconds.



- A new AI-driven platform called 'XraySetu' has been developed to help in the early detection of COVID 19, with the help of Chest X-ray.
- The solution will be beneficial for early detection especially in rural areas,
- In rural areas, RT-PCR tests and CT-Scans are not easily available.
- XraySetu will operate through WhatsApp.
- It will identify COVID positive patients even from low-resolution Chest X-Ray images sent over Whatsapp-based Chatbot.
- The solution has been developed by ARTPARK (AI & Robotics Technology Park), established by the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru, with support from the Department of Science & Technology (DST), in collaboration with Bangalore based HealthTech startup Niramai and the Indian Institute of Science (IISc).

CAR-T cell therapy

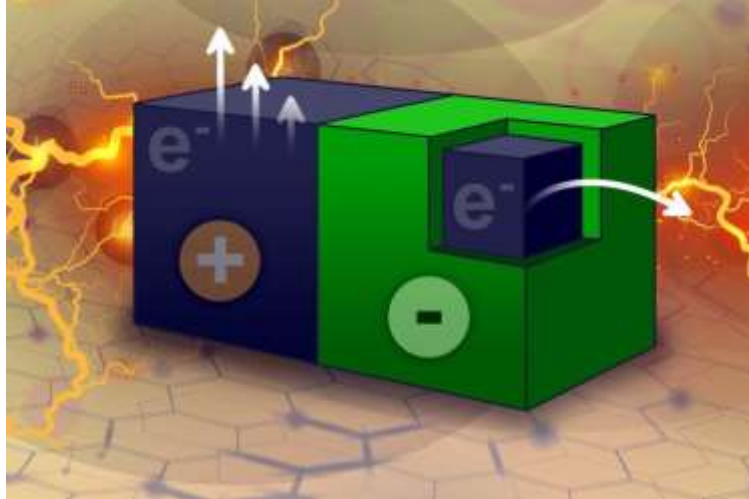


- The clinical trials of Chimeric Antigen Receptor T-cell (CAR-T) therapy were conducted globally.
- It has shown promising results on end stage cancer patients, especially in patients of Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia.
- First CAR-T cell Therapy was done by IIT Bombay and cancer care in India.
- It was done at Bone Marrow Transplant unit of Tata Memorial Centre in Mumbai.
- CAR-T cells were designed and manufactured at Bioscience and Bioengineering (BSBE) department, IIT Bombay.
- This was also supported by BIRAC-PACE scheme.
- Now, this therapy will undergo Phase I and II trial of their CAR-T product through National Biopharma Mission.

Early cyclone detection technique

- Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur has developed an early cyclone detection technique.
- This will help in early detection of development or strengthening of tropical cyclones in North Indian Ocean region.
- IIT developed this technique using Eddy detection technique.

Electricity from carbon nanotubes



- MIT engineers (Massachusetts Institute of Technology) have discovered a new way of generating electricity using carbon nanotubes.
- A new material made up of carbon nanotubes has potential to generate electricity by collecting energy from its environment.
- These micro carbon particles can create current by interacting with liquid around them.
- Liquid, an organic solvent, attracts electrons out of the nanoparticles, which generates current.

3D-printed Masks coated with anti-viral agents



- Thincr Technologies India Private Limited, has developed an 3D-printed Masks coated with anti-viral agents.
- Thincr Technologie is a Pune-based start-up firm.
- Masks are coated with anti-viral agents known as virucides.
- These cost-effective masks are more effective in containing spread of COVID-19.
- This project received financial support from TDB (Technology Development Board).
- Masks were developed with support from Merck Life Sciences.

EnVision

- European Space Agency is now developing its own probe to study Venus.
- The mission is named as “EnVision”.
- It will probably be launched to the planet in early 2030.
- ESA will undertake this mission with contributions from NASA.

CHIME telescope results

- Scientists with the CHIME Collaboration have assembled the largest collection of fast radio bursts (FRBs) in the telescope’s first FRB catalogue.
- CHIME is Canadian Hydrogen Intensity Mapping Experiment.
- It is a large stationary radio telescope in British Columbia, Canada.
- Sight of an FRB is considered a rare thing in the field of radio astronomy.
- Radio astronomers had only caught sight of around 140 bursts in their scopes since the first FRB was spotted in 2007.
- FRBs are oddly bright flashes of light which blaze for a few milliseconds before vanishing without a trace.
- They are registered in the radio band of the electromagnetic spectrum.

Shenzhou-12

- Chinese spacecraft, Shenzhou-12, blasted off from Gobi Desert on a Long March rocket.
- This Spacecraft will ferry three men to an orbiting space.
- They will stay for three-month.
- This will be the first time China will send humans into space since 2016.
- Shenzhou-12 means Divine Vessel.

T2T-CHM13

- Telomere-to-Telomere (T2T) consortium, an international collaboration of around 30 institutions has sequenced the “first truly complete human reference genome”.
- The new sequence is named as “T2T-CHM13”.
- This unlocks newer regions in human DNA.
- It might help understanding of a wide variety of disorders affecting people.

Aerosol Nucleation

- The Scientists from the University of Hyderabad have found frequent formation of sub-3 nanometres aerosol particles in the atmosphere.
- This is measured using AIRMODUS nano Condensation Nucleus Counter.
- The formation of small molecular clusters of sub-3nm size is technically called aerosol nucleation.

WISA Woodsat



- European Space Agency (ESA) will launch world's first wooden satellite in the Earth's orbit.
- It is called as WISA Woodsat.
- It will be launched to test the applicability of wooden materials such as plywood in spacecraft structures.
- Wooden satellite will be launched with a Rocket Lab Electron rocket.
- It will be launched from Mahia Peninsula launch complex in New Zealand.
- Satellite has been designed and built in Finland.

Rapid Antigen Test kit - IIT Delhi

- The Minister of State for Education, Sanjay Dhotre, launched a Rapid Antigen Test kit for COVID-19.
- It was developed by IIT Delhi.
- RAT kit has been developed by IIT Delhi researchers led by Dr. Harpal Singh.
- He is a professor at Centre for Biomedical Engineering of IIT Delhi.
- The kit has been developed entirely using internal resources at IIT Delhi.

Boundary between Solar System and Interstellar Space



- The Scientists have created first-ever 3D map of boundary between our solar system and interstellar space called Heliosphere.
- This 3D map was created using data from NASA's IBEX satellite.
- The Boundary of heliosphere has been mapped for the first time.
- It will provide for scientists to understand how solar and interstellar winds interact.
- Earlier, this boundary was mentioned in theories of Physics models.
- This is the first-time scientists were able to measure it and make its three-dimensional map.

LiDAR based survey of forest areas

- The Union Environment Minister released the Detailed Project Reports of LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) based survey of forest areas in ten states.
- The 10 mapped states are Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Nagaland, and Tripura.
- The Survey of Forest Areas Project was awarded to WAPCOS.
- WAPCOS is a Mini Ratna Public Sector Undertaking (PSU) under the Jal Shakti Ministry.
- It is a first of its kind and a unique experiment using LiDAR technology.
- This survey will help augment water and fodder in jungle areas thereby reducing human-animal conflict.
- LiDAR technology has been found to have 90% accuracy.

Yellow watermelon



- Yellow watermelon has been developed by Bayer's global research and development efforts.
- Yellow watermelon variety has been commercially introduced in India after two years of local trials.
- Yellow Gold 48 have enhanced yield potential, better disease & pest tolerance.
- Yellow Gold 48 variety is best suited for cultivation during October to February.
- Harvest can be done from April onwards.

Nirbhay



- The Defence Research and Development Organisation successfully test-fired the subsonic cruise missile 'Nirbhay'.
- It is tested from an Integrated Test Range (ITR) at Chandipur in Odisha's Balasore.
- This was the eighth test flight of the missile.
- The first test flight of Nirbhay was held on 12 March 2013.
- Nirbhay is a long-range, all-weather, subsonic cruise missile indigenously designed and developed by DRDO.
- It has a strike range of about 1500 km.

- NASA's experimental Mars helicopter called Ingenuity undertook its 8th flight on Red Planet.
- Ingenuity is a small robotic helicopter which is operating on Mars under NASA's Mars 2020 mission.
- Ingenuity was built by Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) of NASA.
- Ingenuity was originally designed to fly only five times.
- But its steady successes made agency to extend its mission and experiment with more ambitious flights.

Strawberry Moon

- The Strawberry Moon marks the last Full Moon of the spring season.
- It also marks the first Full Moon of the summer.
- The celestial event is significant for two reasons,
 - It's a Strawberry Moon and
 - A Supermoon.
- This celestial event took place on 24th June.

Mega-comet 2014 UN271

- The mega-comet 2014 UN271 is expected to pass by the Sun by 2031 bringing it closest to Saturn's orbit.
- The mega comet was identified during the astronomical findings of the Dark Energy Survey that captured data between 2014 and 2018.
- The mega comet 2014 UN271 is estimated to be between 100 and 370 kms wide.
- The Comets are frozen leftovers from the formation of the solar system composed of rock, dust, and ice.

New human species - Israel

- An international group of archaeologists have discovered new human species in Israel.
- Excavations were done at Israeli site of Nesher Ramla.
- Archaeologists have recovered a skull there.
- It is expected that, they lived about 420,000 to 120,000 years ago.
- This analysis finds that, this jaw belonged to person who were neither fully Homo sapiens nor were Neanderthal.

Windows 11



- Microsoft officially launched its new Windows operating system 'Windows 11'.
- It is being called as the "next generation" of Windows.
- The previous Windows Operating System 'Windows 10' was launched in July 2015.
- PCs having Intel's sixth and seventh-generation processors will not be eligible to use Windows 11.

PM CARES for Children

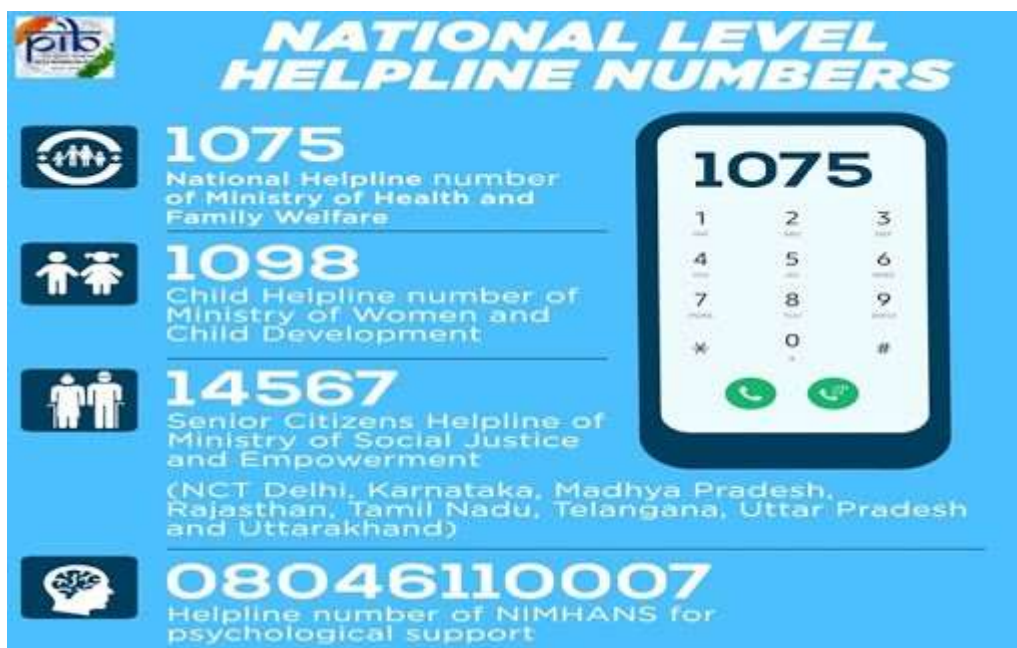


- All children who have lost parents or surviving parent or legal guardian/adoptive parents due to Covid 19 will be supported under the scheme.

Highlights

- Fixed Deposit in the name of the child: A corpus of Rs 10 lakh for each child when he or she reaches 18 years of age.
- They will be given a monthly stipend for five years starting from 18 years till 23 years to fulfil their personal requirements.
- After they will attain 23 years of age, they will be given full amount of Rs 10 lakh to use it professionally or personally.
- For children under 10 years - Admission will be given in the nearest Kendriya Vidyalaya or in a private school as a day scholar.
- For children between 11-18 years - The child will be given admission in any Central Government residential school such as Sainik School, Navodaya Vidyalaya etc.
- The child will be assisted in obtaining an education loan for Professional courses / Higher Education in India as per the existing Education Loan norms.
- All children will be enrolled as a beneficiary under Ayushman Bharat Scheme (PM-JAY) with a health insurance cover of Rs 5 lakhs.

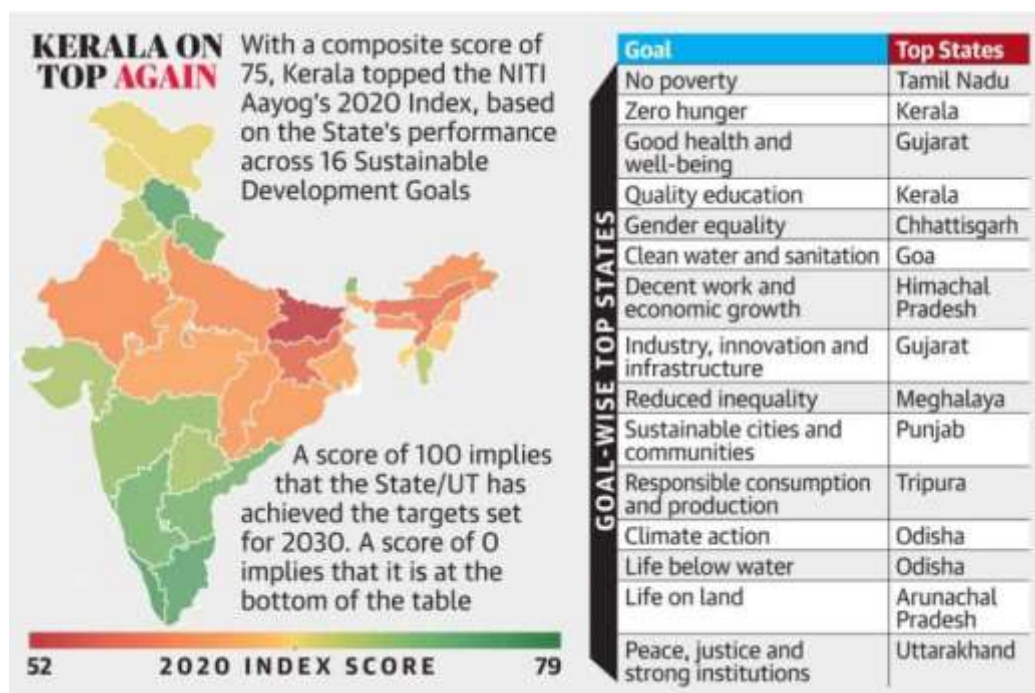
Nano Urea

- It has been constructed by Goa Shipyard Limited.
- Sajag is the third in a series of five offshore patrol vessels indigenously designed in line with Prime Minister's 'Make in India' vision.

NITI Aayog's SDG Index 2020-2021



- NITI Aayog released third edition of Sustainable Development Index for 2020-2021.
- The index is developed in collaboration with the United Nations in India.
- The Index evaluates the progress of states and union territories on social, economic and environmental parameters.
- Kerala retained its rank as the top state with a score of 75.
- Himachal Pradesh and Tamil Nadu retained its second position with a score of -74
- Bihar has been adjudged as the worst performer.

ECLGS 4.0

- The Government has increased the scope of Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) for three more months.
- Extension will help businesses across several sectors of economy.

About

- 100% guarantee cover to be provided on loans, in hospitals/nursing clinics/medical colleges/homes, up to Rs.2 crore.
- Loan can be utilized up to set up on-site oxygen generation plants.
- Interest rate on load was capped at 7.5%.
- Additional ECLGS assistance of up to 10% of outstanding by February 2020 to borrowers who are covered under ECLGS 1.0.
- Ceiling of Rs. 500 Cr. of loan outstanding for eligibility under ECLGS 3.0 will be removed.
- Civil Aviation sector will be eligible under ECLGS 3.0.
- Validity of ECLGS extended to 30.09.2021.

Horticulture Cluster Development Programme

- The Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar launched the Horticulture Cluster Development Programme (CDP) for the integrated and market-led development of 53 horticulture clusters.
- The Agriculture Ministry has identified 53 horticulture clusters, of which 12 have been selected on a pilot basis.
- The Horticulture Cluster Development Program will address all the major issues that are related to the Indian Horticulture Sector including production, pre-production, logistics, post-harvest management, branding, and marketing.
- With this program, the Central Government aims at improving the exports of the targeted crops by about 20%.
- The program is also expected to attract an investment of Rs. 10,000 crores when implemented in all the 53 clusters.

Bal Swaraj portal

- The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) has launched “Bal Swaraj” portal.
- It is an online tracking portal for real-time tracking & monitoring of Children who lost both or either of their parents in COVID-19.
- NCPCR is an organisation under the Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- NCPCR is the monitoring authority of all children in India, under the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015.

Model Tenancy Act

- The Union Cabinet has approved “Model Tenancy Act” for circulation to all States and Union Territories.
- Model Tenancy Act, 2019, a tenancy law in India, was designed to rebuild tenancy market.
- The Creation of this Act was first announced in budget speech of 2019 by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman.
- It seeks to replace archaic rental laws of India and to solve housing availability deficit.
- This Act will help in achieving the target of “Housing for All by 2022”.

Patent for Black Pepper Micronutrient

- The Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR)-Indian Institute of Spices Research (IISR) got patent for black pepper micronutrient foliar formulation.
- The application for this was submitted in 2013.
- Its formulation was developed by a team comprising of three scientists - Dr. V. Srinivasan, Dr. S. Hamza and Dr. R. Dinesh.



DAC nod for building 6 conventional submarines

- The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC), headed by Defence Minister has approved the issuance of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the construction of six conventional submarines under Project-75I at an estimated cost of ₹43,000 crore.

Significance:

- This is a landmark approval. It is the first case processed under the Strategic Partnership (SP) model.
- The SP model of the Defence Procurement Procedure (DPP) aims to promote the role of Indian industry in manufacturing and build a domestic defence industrial ecosystem.
- It would be one of the largest 'Make in India' projects and it will create a tiered industrial ecosystem for submarine construction in India.
- India would be enabled to achieve its 30-year submarine construction programme envisioned by the government to acquire national competence in their building and for Indian industry to independently design and construct them.
- As per the Navy's requirements, the submarines, all of which will be built in India, should be equipped with Air Independent Propulsion (AIP) modules and be able to fire land-attack cruise missiles.

Note:

- It also approved the procurement of air defence guns and ammunition for the Army at an approximate cost of ₹6,000 crore.

INS Sandhayak



- It is Hydrographic survey ship.
- It is the first of its class indigenously designed and built.
- It was decommissioned recently after 40 years of service.
- The ship had undertaken approximately 200 major hydrographic surveys and numerous minor surveys.
- The ship has also been an active participant in many significant operations such as
 - Op Pawan – assisting the Indian Peace Keeping Force in Sri Lanka in 1987.
 - Op Rainbow – rendering humanitarian assistance post 2004 Tsunami.
 - Participation in the maiden joint Indo-US HADR Exercise 'Tiger-Triumph'.

MoC on Sustainable Urban Development

- Union Cabinet approved Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC) on Sustainable Urban Development between India and Japan.
- To implement and strategize programmes on cooperation under MoC, a Joint Working Group (JWG) will be constituted.
- JWG will meet once in a year in Japan as well as in India, alternately.
- The Cooperation under MoC will continue for a period of 5 years, which can be auto-renewed for 5 years at a time.
- It is expected to create employment opportunities in listed areas of sustainable urban development like Urban Planning, affordable housing, rental housing, Smart Cities Development etc.

Cabinet approves SCO Agreement on Mass Media cooperation

- The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister approved the agreement on 'Cooperation in the field of Mass Media' between all the Member States of Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO).
- The Member States of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization consists of eight countries: India, China, the Kyrgyz Republic, Kazakhstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Russia, and Uzbekistan
- The Agreement will
 - Provide an opportunity for the Member States to share new innovations and best practices in the field of Mass Media.
 - Boost equal and mutually beneficial cooperation between associations in the field of Mass Media.

RDSO joins 'One Nation, One Standard' scheme

- The Research Design and Standards Organisation (RDSO) has become the first standards body in the country to join the 'One Nation, One Standard' scheme of the central government.
- RDSO, the sole R&D wing of the Railways Ministry, sets standards for the Indian Railway Sector
- The RDSO has now been recognised as a 'Standard Developing Organisation' by the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), for a three years period.

Note

- BIS is the implementing agency for the 'One Nation, One Standard' scheme.
- RDSO and BIS will be now jointly defining the parameters to ensure quality goods and services for the Railways.
- The 'One Nation, One Standard' scheme was launched in 2019.
- Its objective is to develop one template of standard for one given product in the country, instead of having multiple agencies set it.
- This helps building a 'Brand India' identity in the long run.



Report on Variable Capital Company

- Dr. K.P. Krishnan committee on “Variable Capital Company” has submitted its report to International Financial Services centres Authority (IFSCA).
- The report is regarding feasibility of Variable Capital Companies in International Financial Services Centres in India.
- VCC is an alternative form of corporate vehicle which can be used for open-ended as well as closed-ended alternative and traditional fund strategies.
- It is a corporate vehicle with flexible capital.
- These shares are created when investments are made and shares are readily redeemable by shareholders.
- It has been designed for fund management industry.

Mini kit programme

- Union Agriculture Minister, Narendra Singh Tomar, launched a seed Mini kit programme by distributing high-yielding varieties seeds of oilseeds and pulses to farmers.
- About 20,27,318 seed mini kits of pulses, 74000 mini kits of groundnut and 8 lakhs for soybean will be provided free of cost to the farmers directly under National Food Security Mission.
- Mini-kits are being provided by NAFED, National Seeds Corporation (NCS), and Gujarat State Seeds Corporation.
- It is completely funded by government through National Food Security Mission.

Global initiative for clean energy innovation

- India launched the Mission Innovation Clean Tech Exchange.
- It is a global initiative that will create a network of incubators across member countries to accelerate clean energy innovation.
- This Mission was launched virtually at “Innovating to Net Zero Summit, 2021” organised by Chile.

ASPAGNII

- The Department of Biotechnology - National Institute of Immunology receives ASPAGNII trademark for India’s First Indigenous Tumour Antigen SPAG9.
- SPAG9 was discovered by Dr Anil Suri in 1998.
- Currently, ASPAGNII is being used in dendritic cell based immunotherapy in cervical, ovarian cancer and will be used in breast cancer.

NTPC - UN's CEO Water Mandate



- NTPC Ltd, has become a signatory of UN Global Compact's CEO Water Mandate
- NTPC is India's largest power utility.
- CEO Water Mandate is a coveted league of companies focusing on efficient water management.
- Chairman and Managing Director of NTPC Gurdeep Singh, has joined a select group of business leaders.

India slips two spots on achieving SDG



- India's rank has slipped by two places from last year to 117.
- It has got this result on the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted as a part of the 2030 agenda by 193 United Nations member states in 2015.
- India ranks fifth after the four South Asian countries - Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh.
- The overall SDG score of India is 61.9 out of 100.
- The report said Jharkhand and Bihar are the least prepared to meet the SDGs by 2030.
- The report also said that India ranked 168 out of 180 countries in terms of Environmental Performance Index.

Centre amends Civil Services Pension Rules

- The Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions informed that the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 are being amended.
- The newly amended Civil Services Pension Rules state that no retired official of security and intelligence organizations will publish material, including information about their experience and expertise gained in the organizations, without clearance from the head of the organization.
- In case of any failure to abide by the rules, their pension can be withheld or withdrawn in part or full.

Norms for employing retired officials

- The Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) has laid down a defined procedure for getting vigilance clearance before employing a retired official on a contractual or consultancy basis.

Procedure

- Before offering employment the vigilance clearance from the employer organisation, from which the officer has retired, should be obtained.
- In case a retired officer served in more than one organisation, clearance has to be obtained from all of them where the person was posted in the 10 years prior to retirement.
- A communication seeking clearance should also be sent to the CVC.
- If the employee is found involved in any vigilance-related matter or not cleared from the vigilance point of view, the erstwhile employer organisation would be responsible for all consequential actions.

Group for fixing minimum wages

- The Union Labour and Employment Ministry had set up an expert group for fixing minimum wages and national floor minimum wages.
- The group, set up for three years, would be chaired by Professor Ajit Mishra, director of the Institute of Economic Growth.
- The decision is part of the Centre's implementation of the Code on Wages, 2019.
- Code on Wages, 2019 mandates a statutory national level floor wage.

E-100 Ethanol Project

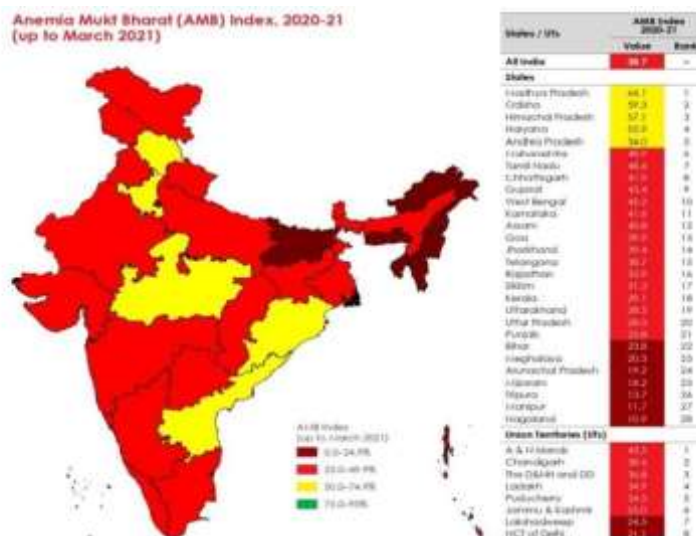


- PM Modi launched the E-100 Project.
- It was launched with the aim of setting up a network for production and distribution of ethanol in India.
- Prime Minister also launched 'Report of the Expert Committee on Road Map for ethanol blending in India 2020-2025'.
- It was released in line with the theme of World Environment Day - "promotion of biofuels for a better environment".

Note

- PM Modi also launched a Pilot Project of E 100 ethanol dispensing stations at three locations in Pune.
- The government has reset the target to achieve 20 per cent ethanol blending in petrol by 2025.
- Earlier this target was to be met by 2030.

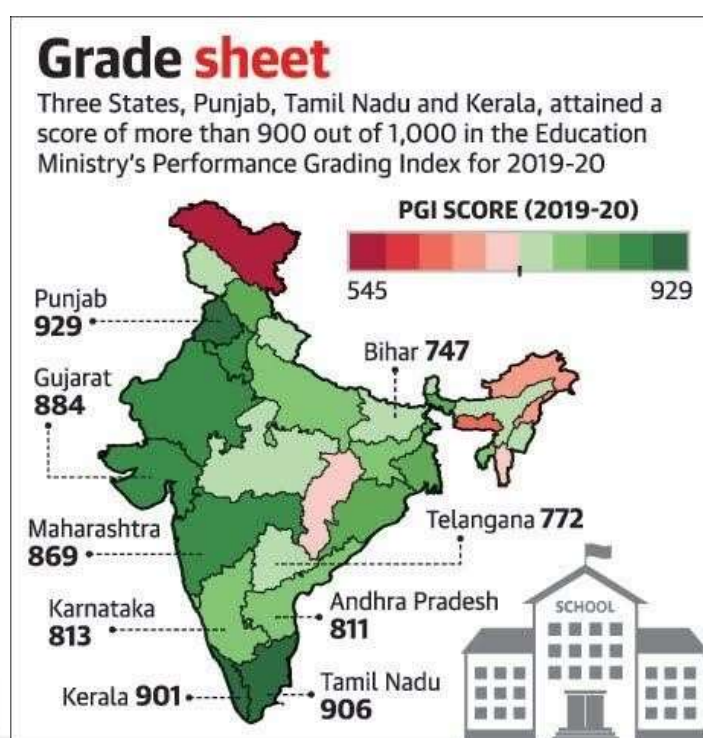

- Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Rajasthan, Puducherry, Dadra and Nagar Haveli are in the A+ category.
- Punjab has scored the maximum points for governance and management.
- Bihar and Meghalaya have scored the lowest in terms of infrastructure and facilities.

Namaste Yoga

- A mobile application devoted to Yoga called “Namaste Yoga” was launched recently.
- This was launched in an event was organised by Ministry of Ayush in association with Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga.
- Namaste Yoga app is designed as an information platform for public.

India wind energy market outlook

- It was released by Global Wind Energy Council.
- As per the report, India has a pipeline of 10.3 GW in Central and State markets.
- These pipelines will drive installations until 2023.
- This report highlights India will install 20 GW of wind energy capacity by 2021-25.
- India's total installed wind power capacity was 38 GW, as of February 2021.
- It has the fourth largest installed wind power capacity worldwide.
- European Union is the leading market in wind energy having around 48 GW of installed capacity.

Raimona reserve forest

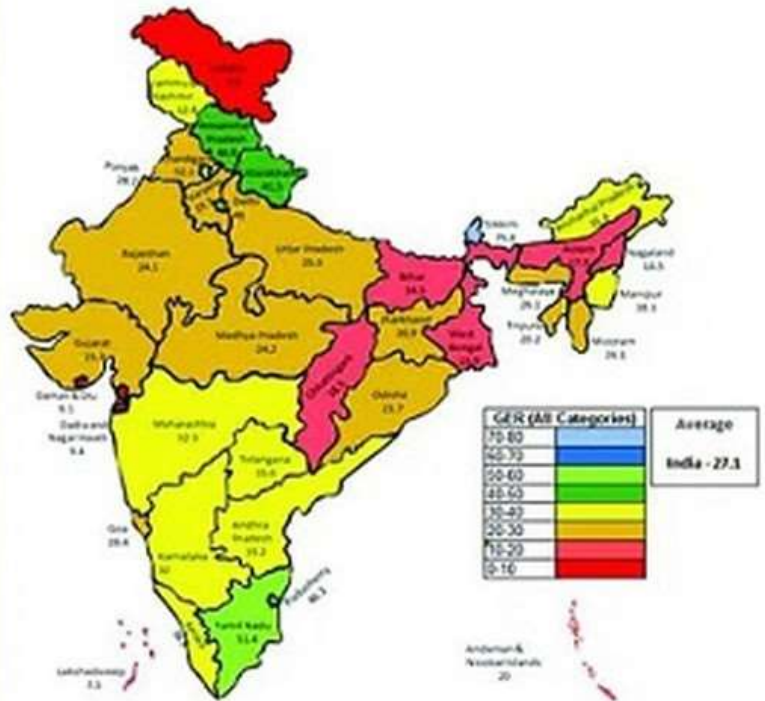


- Raimona reserve forest in Kokrajhar district has been upgraded to sixth national park of Assam.

- As per the survey, numbers of institutions of national importance have increased to 135 in 2020 from 75 in 2015.
- There has been a growth of 11.4 per cent in student enrolment from 2015-16 to 2019-20.
- The rise in female enrolment in higher education during the period is 18.2 per cent.
- Total enrolment in higher education is 3.85 crore (Improved by 3.04%) in 2019-20.
- It was 3.74 crore in 2018-19 & 3.42 crore in 2014-15.
- Gender parity Index has also improved (1.01).
- Number of PhDs has increased by 60 per cent since 2015.

Tamil Nadu

- Tamil Nadu as it has a gross enrolment ratio (GER) of 51.4% in higher education, almost double the national average,
- In fact, the state’s GER exceeds the National Education Policy’s target of 50% to be achieved in the year 2030.
- The state’s GER has increased from 32.9% in 2010-11 to 51.4% in 2019-20.

Green airports recognition

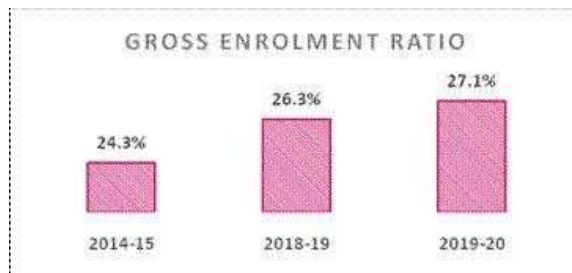

- Hyderabad International Airport Limited (GHIAL) received the Gold Recognition by the ACI in the below 25 Million Passengers Per Annum (MPPA) category.
- The program's objective
 - Is to promote environmental best practices to minimize aviation's impact on the environment and
 - Is to recognize airport members who have outstanding accomplishments in their environmental projects.
- The theme of ACI's Green Airports Recognition programme for 2021 was 'Air Quality Management'.

India's 1st VSC based HVDC system

- Power Grid Corporation of India Ltd (PGCIL) has fully commissioned India's first Voltage Source Converter (VSC) based HVDC (high voltage direct current) electricity transmission system.
- This project strengthens the power system of the southern region of the country.
- The PGCIL commissioned Monopole-I of the 320 kV, 2000 MW, Pugalur (Tamil Nadu) Thrissur (Kerala) Voltage Source Converter (VSC) based High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) System.

GER in India



- Gross enrolment ratio in higher education is calculated for the 18-23 age group
- Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education in India is 27.1 per cent for 2019-20
- It is an improvement from previous year's 26.3 per cent.
- For Scheduled Castes, the ratio is 23.4 per cent and for Scheduled Tribes, it is 18 per cent.
- The highest GER is in Sikkim, at 76%.
- Tamilnadu is at 51.4%.
- Karnataka is at 32%
- The other states are Kerala (39%), Telangana (36%), AP (35%) and Maharashtra (32.3%).
- In terms of Student enrolment (In Numbers), Uttar Pradesh occupies the first place.
- It has 49.1% male and 50.9% female students.
- It is followed by Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.
- The number of universities has increased by 30.5% from 799 in 2015-16 to 1043 in 2019-20.
- Of the 42,343 colleges in the Country, 60.56% are located in rural areas and 10.75% of colleges are exclusively for girls.
- And the majority of the colleges (78.6%) in the country, are privately managed, led by Andhra Pradesh (81%), Telangana (80%), Uttar Pradesh (78.5%), and Tamil Nadu (77.6%).
- Maharashtra tops in the enrolment of students in universities (including constituent units) with 9,67,034, followed by Tamil Nadu with 9,26,490 students, and Delhi with 8,16,110 students.

Prana, VaU and Svasta

- The Indian Space Research Organisation's Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC), had developed three different types of ventilators and an oxygen concentrator.
- They were named as Prana, VaU and Svasta.
- Prana is meant to deliver respiratory gas to the patient by automated compression of an Ambu bag.
- Svasta is designed to work without electric power.
- VaU is a low-cost ventilator.

Rainfall - May 2021

- As per Indian Meteorological Department (IMD), May 2021 received second highest rainfall in 121 years.
- Rainfall over India as a whole for May month of 2021 was recorded as 107.9 millimetres.
- This is 74 percent more than its Long Period Average (LPA) of 62 mm.
- Highest ever rainfall was occurred in year 1990 with recorded rainfall of 110.7mm.
- Tauktae cyclone formed over Arabian Sea and Cyclone Yaas was developed over Bay of Bengal were the main reasons for this.

FAME-II scheme - Amended

- Ministry of Heavy Industry has announced major amendments in ongoing FAME-II scheme.
- Ministry has fixed incentives for India-made electric two-wheelers.
- Earlier, subsidy rate for electric two-wheelers was Rs 10,000/kWh.
- It has been increased to Rs 15,000/kWh.

Pyrostria laljii



- A 15-metre-tall tree that belongs to genus of the coffee family has recently been discovered in Andaman Islands.
- The new species Pyrostria laljii, is also the first record of the genus Pyrostria in India.
- Trees belonging to these species are usually found in Madagascar.

Copperplate inscriptions found at Srisailam temple



- The Bhramarambha Mallikarjuna Devasthanam, engaged in reviving ancient Ganta Matham near Srisailam temple complex.
- Six sets of copperplate inscriptions were found.
- 18 copper leaves were found.
- It could be dated back to somewhere between 14 and 16 centuries.
- Out of the six sets,
 - Four have inscriptions in Sanskrit and Nandi-Nagari script and
 - The other two plates are in Telugu script.

Political donations

- The Bharatiya Janata Party has topped the list of individual and corporate donations, pocketing around Rs 750 crore in 2019-20.
- The amount received by the Congress during the same period was Rs 139 crore.
- This is the seventh year in a row that the BJP has topped the list of political donations.

MoU on cooperation on domestic worker recruitment

- India and Kuwait signed an MoU on cooperation on domestic worker recruitment recently.
- This MoU will bring Indian domestic workers in Gulf nation within the legal framework.
- This will provide them protection under law.
- MoU was signed between Indian Ambassador Sibi George and Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs of Kuwait Majdi Ahmad Al-Dhafiri.

Deep Ocean Mission

- The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved the implementation of “Deep Ocean Mission”.
- This mission is proposed by the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES).
- This is to explore the deep ocean for resources and develop deep-sea technologies for sustainable use of ocean resources.
- This is a 5 year Mission.
- The first phase will be carried during 2021-2024.
- The main objective of the Deep Ocean Mission is to support the Blue Economy Initiatives of the Government of India.
- The Ministry of Earth Sciences will be the nodal Ministry for implementing this.

Hallmarking of Gold jewellery



- The Government had made hallmarking of gold jewellery as mandatory.
- The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) has been established for this purpose.
- Gold hallmarking is a purity certification for precious metal.
- Thus, from 15 June 2021, jewellers will only be allowed to sell gold jewellery of 14, 18 and 22 carats.

Global Yoga Conference 2021

- Dr Harsh Vardhan, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare addressed the inaugural ceremony of Global Yoga Conference 2021.
- The event was organised by ‘Mokshayatan Yog Sansthan’ along with the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India & Indian Council for Cultural Relations.
- This was organised to mark the occasion of the 7th International Day of Yoga which falls on 21st June 2021.

India's foreign student population

- India's foreign student population inched closer to 50,000 in 2019-20.
- According to an education ministry survey, the cumulative 2019-20 foreign student population of 49,348 was slightly more than the figure of 47,427 reported in 2018-19.
- This indicates India is still far from its aim to be a study-abroad destination with 200,000 foreign students.
- The Highest share of foreign students come from the neighbouring countries.
 - Nepal contributes 28.1%,
 - Afghanistan 9.1%,
 - Bangladesh 4.6% and
 - Bhutan 3.8%,
- Among states, Karnataka hosts the highest number of foreign students (10,231).
- Tamil Nadu (4,461) stands at 5th.

Conference of BRICS Network Universities 2021

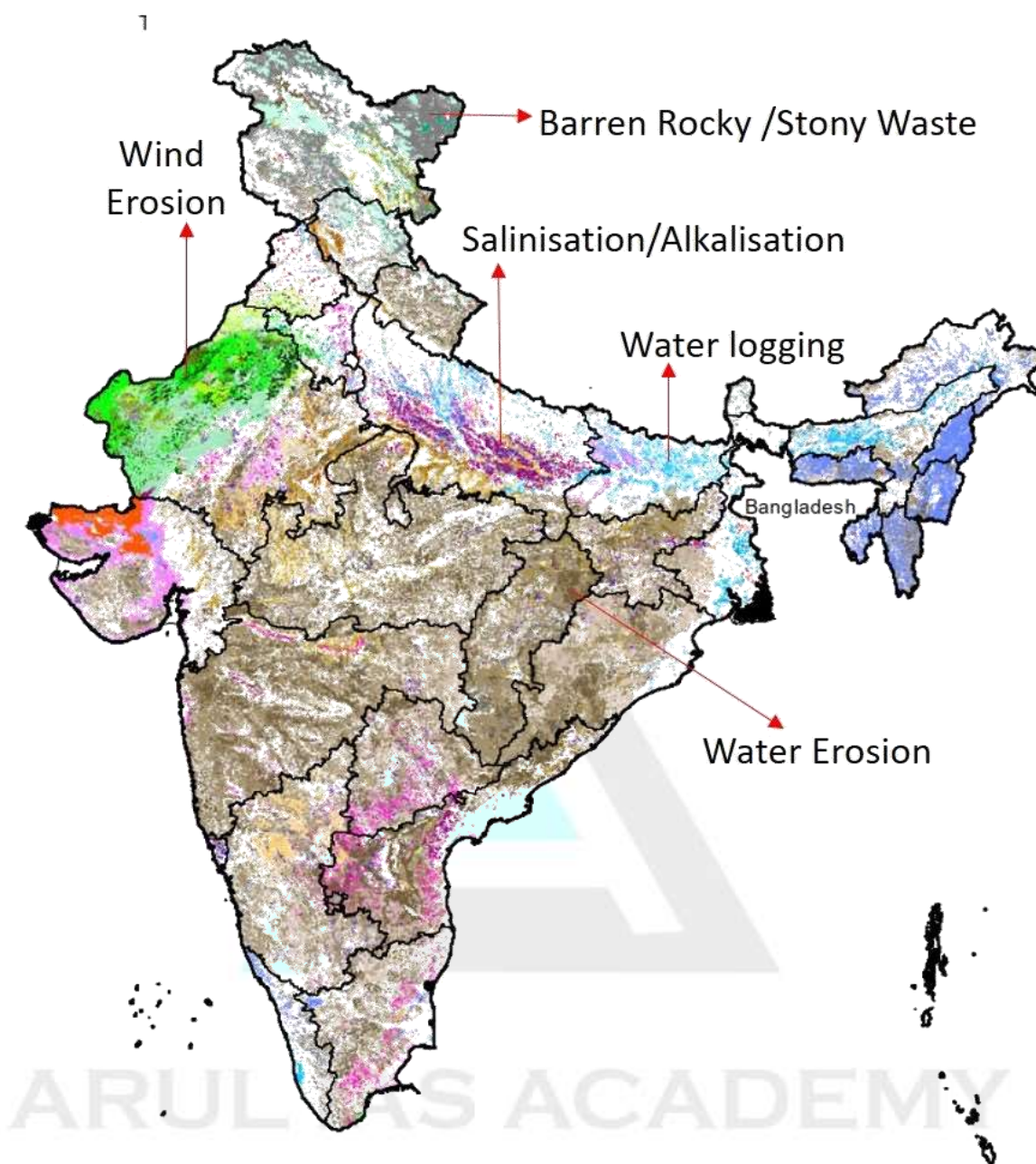


- The Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IIT Bombay) hosted a three-day virtual "Conference of BRICS Network Universities".

- Rice Bran oil from NAFED (National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India) will be fortified.
- It will be ensured that it will contain additional nutrients and vitamins.
- This initiative will significantly reduce the country's consumption dependence on imported edible oil in the future.

- It has been published by Space Application Centre, ISRO, Ahmedabad.
- The Atlas provides state wise area of degraded lands for the time frame 2018-19.
- It was released on the occasion of the World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought, observed on 17 June.

India's new trilateral

- India-Italy-Japan launched their trilateral recently.
- It was launched to create stability and a rules-based international order based on the consent of all, not on the power of the few in the Indo-Pacific region.
- Last year, India-France-Australia launched a trilateral mechanism.

- Twitter has lost its safe harbour immunity in India.
- This is because of its failure of appointing statutory officers, as required by the new IT rules of the Indian Government.
- This means Twitter will no longer be protected under Section 79 of the IT Act.
- Therefore top executives of Twitter will now be liable for all the content on its platform that is considered inflammatory or considered unlawful in nature.

General Elections 2019: An Atlas

- The Election Commission of India released 'General Elections 2019: An Atlas' recently.
- This Atlas was released by Chief Election Commissioner Sushil Chandra and Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar and Election Commissioner Anup Chandra Pandey.
- This document would be beneficial to researchers and academicians and help in exploring vast landscape of Indian elections.
- This General Election Atlas comprises of all statistical figures and data of General Elections 2019.

MoU between India and Bhutan

- It was held in Jabalpur and Nagpur in 1923.

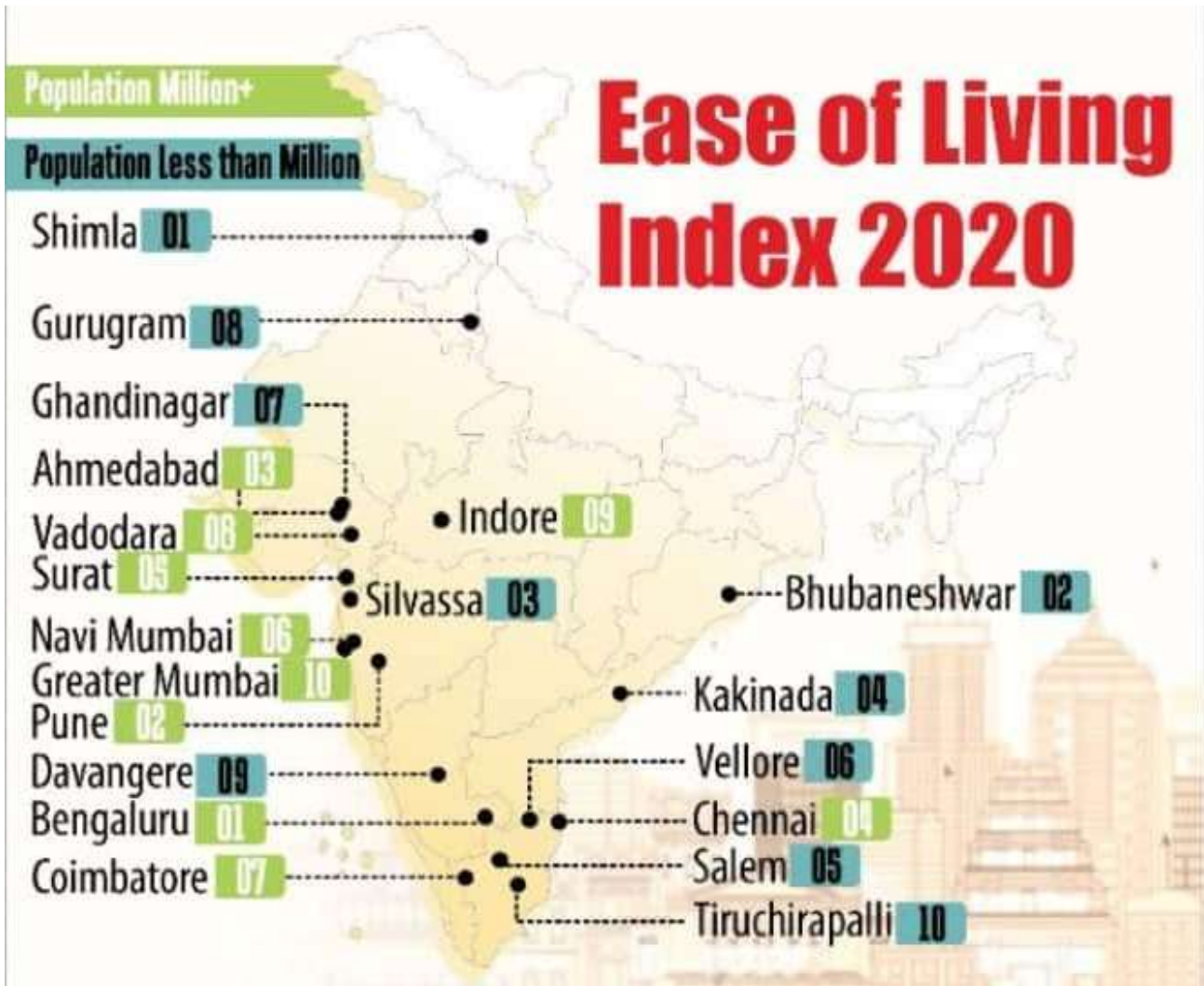
Jaan Hai to Jahaan Hai Awareness Campaign

Four-member Takeover Panel - SEBI

- The IGBC Green HSR rating system is a first-of-its-kind in the world.
- It is exclusively developed to address the sustainability aspects of High-Speed Rail (HSR) projects.
- The rating system is developed aligning the requirements with the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

India's best employers among Nation-Builders 2021 - NTPC

- For the first time, NTPC won recognition as India's Best Employers among Nation-Builders 2021.
- It has been recognized as the 'Great Place to Work' for the 15th straight year by the Great Places to Work Institute.
- It has been ranked at 38th.
- It was ranked 47 last year.
- NTPC, a Maharatna Community and Public Sector Unit, works under the Ministry of Power.

9th Asian Ministerial Energy Roundtable

- India will host 9th Asian Ministerial Energy Roundtable (AMER9) next year.
- The announcement was made by the International Energy Forum (IEF).
- The event will take forward the understandings reached in the previous meeting held in Abu Dhabi in 2018.
- The 2018 meeting was co-hosted by India.
- The 2018 meeting focused on global energy security in the age of change.

India - US PASSEX

- The Indian Navy and the Air Force had a two-day passage exercise with U.S. Navy Carrier Strike Group (CSG) Ronald Reagan.
- The passage exercise was in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR).
- Indian Navy's INS Kochi and Teg, along with P-8I long-range maritime patrol aircraft and MiG 29K fighters, participated in the exercise.

Nano Urea Fertilizer Plant

- The Indian Farmers Fertiliser Cooperative (IFFCO) will set up a nano urea liquid manufacturing plant in Argentina.
- It is to be done with a partnership with two agencies,
 - Instituto Nacional de Asociativismo y Economía Social (INAES) and
 - The Cooperative Confederation of Argentina 'Cooperar'.
- The use of nano urea will have,
 - A Huge impact on the quality of underground water and
 - A Very significant reduction of global warming.

India's largest solar carport



- Tata Motors and Tata Power inaugurated India's largest solar carport at the Tata Motors car plant at Chikhali in Pune.
- The 6.2 megawatt peak (MWp) solar carport will generate 86.4 lakh kilowatt hour (kWh) of electricity per year.
- It is estimated to reduce 7,000 tonnes of carbon emissions annually.

Merger of CWC-CRWC



- The Union Cabinet has approved merger of Central Railside Warehouse Company (CRWC) and its holding enterprise Central Warehousing Corporation (CWC).
- These Companies were merged with the aim of improving efficiency and increase financial savings.
- With the merger, it is expected that, management expenditure of Railside Warehouse Complexes (RWCs) will be reduced by Rs 5 crore.

Note

- CRWC is a Public Sector Enterprise of Mini-Ratna status of Category-II.
- It was incorporated on in 2007 under the Companies Act, 1956.

Toyconomy

- Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, interacted with participants of Toycathon-2021 through video conferencing.
- During the meeting, PM Modi highlighted the importance of toys and game industry in Indian Economy.
- Toy and Game Industry was termed as 'Toyconomy' by him.

Toycathon-2021

- It was a joint initiative by the Ministry of Education, Women and Child Development Ministry, Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Textile Ministry, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and All India Council for Technical Education.
- It was launched on 5th January 2021.
- It aims to promote India as a global toy manufacturing hub.

Pinaka rocket - Enhanced version

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully test fired an extended range version of “Pinaka” rocket.
- This Test fire was carried at Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Chandipur, Odisha.
- This 122 mm Calibre rockets were launched with the help of Multi-Barrel Rocket Launcher (MBRL).
- The enhanced version has been developed by Pune based Armament Research and Development Establishment (ARDE) in association with High Energy Materials Research Laboratory (HEMRL).
- They got manufacturing support from Economic Explosives Limited, Nagpur.
- Enhanced Systems can destroy targets kept at distances up to 45 kilometres.

India's first Indigenous Aircraft Carrier

- India's first Indigenous Aircraft Carrier (IAC-I), is planned to be commissioned by 2022.
- Once commissioned, the carrier will be named as INS Vikrant, in memory of India's first aircraft carrier.
- The IAC-1 carrier is being built at the Cochin Shipyard Limited (CSL), Kochi, Kerala, under a public-private partnership.

Agni-Prime

- India successfully carried out the test-firing of a new missile of the Agni series known as Agni-Prime off the coast of Odisha.
- The new nuclear-capable missile is fully made up of composite material.
- Agni-Prime is a canisterised missile with a range capability between 1000 and 2000 kilometres.

Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan

- The central government launched a website for its Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan.
- It is a campaign against substance abuse, to mark the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking.
- The website was launched by Social Justice and Empowerment minister Thawarchand Gehlot.

Digital Skill Champions Program



- The National Skill Development Corporation and WhatsApp announced an alliance to launch the Digital Skill Champions Program.
- This aims to train India's youth on digital skills, in order to make them employment ready.
- The partnership identifies two broad areas of collaboration viz., WhatsApp Digital Skills Academy and Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra (PMKK) and WhatsApp Business App Training sessions.

Paribartan Electoral Trust

- Paribartan Electoral Trust has anonymously disbursed Rs 3 crore it received from Birla Corporation in 2019-20 using electoral bonds.
- This is the first time that an electoral trust has taken the bonds route to disburse corporate donations to unnamed political parties.
- Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) has alleged that the use of electoral bonds route is "against the spirit" of the Electoral Trusts Scheme, 2013 and Income Tax Rules, 1962.

Electoral Trusts Scheme, 2013

- Electoral Trust is a non-profit organization formed in India for orderly receiving of the contributions from any person.
- The scheme was notified by the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT).
- The sole object of the electoral trust is to distribute the contributions received by it to the political party.
- These Electoral Trust companies are not allowed to accept contributions from foreign citizens or companies.
- The electoral trust may receive voluntary contributions from,
 - An individual who is a citizen of India.
 - A company which is registered in India.
 - A firm or Hindu undivided family or an Association of persons or a body of individuals, resident in India.

Project Seabird



- It is the largest naval infrastructure project for India.
- The project aims at creation of a naval base at Karwar (Karnataka) on the west coast of India.
- Upon completion, the program will provide Indian Navy with its largest naval base on the west coast.
- It will also be the largest naval base east of the Suez Canal.

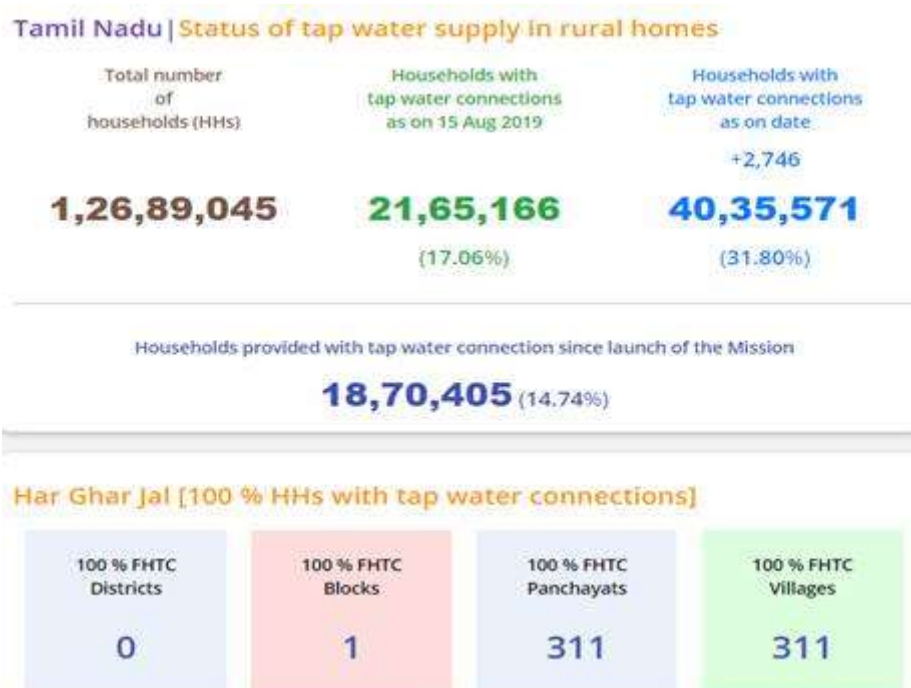

NTPC - Energy Compact Goals



- National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) Limited declared its Energy Compact Goals as part of the UN High-level Dialogue on Energy (HLDE).
- It became the first energy company in India to declare this.
- The NTPC is the India's largest power generating company under the Ministry of Power.
- The NTPC has set a target to install 60 GW of renewable energy capacity by 2032.
- The company also has aimed at a 10 per cent reduction in net energy intensity by 2032.

Centre allocates Rs.3,691 Crore grants to Tamil Nadu under Jal Jeevan Mission to make provision of tap water supply to every home



- To translate Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision of providing clean tap water to every household, Union government has increased the Central grant to Tamil Nadu under the Jal Jeevan Mission in the year 2021-22 to Rs 3,691.21 Crore, which was Rs 921.99 Crore in 2020-21. National Jal Jeevan Mission, Ministry of Jal Shakti has also released Rs. 614.35 Crores to the State as first tranche. Union Minister, Jal Shakti, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat while approving this four-fold increase in allocation has assured full assistance to the State for making provision of tap water supply in every rural home by 2024.
- In Tamil Nadu, out of a total of 1.26 Crore households, 40.36lakh households (31.80%) have been provided with tap water connections. On 15th August 2019, at the time of launch of Jal Jeevan Mission, only 21.65 lakh (17.06%) households had tap water supply. In 22 months, 18.70 lakh (14.74%) households in the State have been provided tap water connections.
- Thus, in Tamil Nadu there are still 86.53 lakh households without tap water supply. With the present pace of 16.13 lakh households (in 2020-21), it is a huge task to be accomplished in next three years. To achieve this by 2024, the State needs to increase its pace of providing tap water supply to rural households by 179%.
- The State Government is yet to finalize and present its Annual Action Plan (2021-22) to achieve the goal of ensuring tap water to every rural household. National Jal Jeevan Mission (NJJM), Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India has asked the State Government to finalize Annual Action Plan for the



year 2021-22 without any further delay, and present the same as first quarter of the financial year is coming to an end.

- Urging the State to accelerate the pace of implementation and emphasizing the work of providing tap connections should start in all the villages so that Tamil Nadu can provide tap water supply to every household by 2024, Union Minister, Jal Shakti, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat has written a letter to the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu.
- In 2020-21, Rs.921.99Crore Central grant was allocated to Tamil Nadu but the State could draw only Rs. 544.51 Crore, and surrendered Rs. 377.48 Crore meant for tap water supply in rural areas of the State. This year with four-fold increase in Central allocation (Rs 3,691.21 crore), unspent balance of Rs.377.48 Crore and short fall of Rs. 290.79 Crore in State matching share in 2020-21, and matching State's share in this year, Tamil Nadu has an assured availability of Rs. 8,428.17 Crore under Jal Jeevan Mission for water supply work in 2021-22. Thus, there is no shortage of fund availability. In his letter to the Chief Minister, Tamil Nadu, the Union Minister has hoped that this enhanced allocation will enable the State to achieve various planned activities under Jal Jeevan Mission to provide tap water connection to every household in rural areas.
- In 2021-22, Rs1,600 Crore has been allocated to Tamil Nadu as 15th FC tied grant for water & sanitation to Rural Local Bodies/ PRIs. There is an assured funding of Rs 8,436 Crore for the next five years i.e. up to 2025-26. This huge investment in rural areas of Tamil Nadu, will create new employment opportunities, accelerate economic activities and boost rural economy.
- In his letter, Union Minister Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawathas reiterated the emphasis given by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi to provide tap water on priority to all households in water-scarce areas, quality-affected villages, Aspirational districts, SC/ST majority villages and Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojna (SAGY) villages of Tamil Nadu. The State has been urged to cover all households in these villages/ areas in 2021-22 on priority.
- To ensure safe tap water to children in schools, ashramshalas and anganwadicentres in the country, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi announced 100-days campaign, which was launched by the Union Minister Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat on 2ndOctober 2020. As a result, Tamil Nadualong with Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Gujarat, Goa, Telangana, Andaman & Nicobar Islands have made provision of tap water in all schools andanganwadicentres.
- Water quality monitoring & surveillance activities are to be given top priority, for which anganwadi workers, ASHA workers, members of Self-Help Groups, PRI members, school teachers etc.; are being trained so that they can test water samples for contamination at water sources and delivery points using Field Test Kits (FTKs). Out of a total of 113 water testinglaboratories, only 1 lab in



Tamil Nadu is NABL accredited. The State needs to upgrade its water testing laboratories and securing their NABL accreditation.

- Jal Jeevan Mission is a 'bottom up' approach where community plays a vital role starting from planning to implementation, management, operation and maintenance. To achieve this, State Government has to undertake support activities like strengthening the Village Water & Sanitation Committee (VWSC)/Pani Samiti, developing of Village Action Plan co-terminus with 15th FC for the next five years, engaging Implementing State Agencies (ISAs) to handhold and support village communities, carry out awareness among people. So far Tamil Nadu has 10,812 VWSCs or PaniSamitis in 12,525 villages and 6,335 Village Action Plans have been prepared. State needs to prepare Village Action Plans for all villages within next 3-4 months. State also needs to train about 63 thousands women for water quality monitoring and surveillance. Such handholding and capacity building plays a critical role in ensuring long-term sustainability and operation & maintenance of the water supply infrastructure for assured water supply to every home.
- At the start of the Mission in 2019, out of a total of 19.20 Crore rural households in the country, only 3.23 Crore (17%) had tap water supply. During the last 22 months, despite Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown disruptions, Jal Jeevan Mission, has been implemented with speed and 4.29 Crore households have been provided with piped connections. With the increase in coverage by 22%, presently 7.53 Crore (39.25%) rural households across the country have tap water supply. Goa, Telangana, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Puducherry have achieved 100% household connection in rural areas and has become 'Har Ghar Jal'. Following the principle of Prime Minister's vision of 'SabkaSaath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas', the motto of the Mission is that 'no one is left out' and every household in a village should be provided with tap water connection. At present, in 62 districts and more than 92 thousand villages, every household has tap water supply.
- Jal Jeevan Mission announced by the Prime Minister on 15th August 2019 from Red Fort is under implementation in partnership with States/ UTs to provide tap water connection to every rural household of the country by 2024. Total budget for Jal Jeevan Mission in 2021-22 is Rs 50,011 Crore. With State's own resources and Rs 26,940 Crore as 15th Finance Commission tied grant for water and sanitation to RLBs/ PRIs, this year, more than Rs 1 lakh Crore are being invested in rural drinking water supply sector. This is creating new employment opportunities in villages and boosting the rural economy.

BRICS Foreign Ministers 2021 meeting

- India is the hosting country and the chair of the BRICS Foreign Ministers 2021 meeting.
- The country chairs the meeting for the third time, after 2012 and 2016.
- India's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar chaired the BRICS Foreign Ministers meeting virtually.

Sinovac gains WHO's approval

- World Health Organisation has given approval for global use of covid-19 Vaccine by Sinovac Biotech of China.
- WHO recommended its use for people above 18 years.
- Two-dose will be scheduled for it, with a gap of two to four weeks between shots.
- Other vaccines cleared for emergency use by WHO are vaccines from Pfizer & BioNTech SE, Johnson & Johnson, AstraZeneca, and Moderna.

United Nations Global Sustainable Transport Conference

- The second United Nations Global Sustainable Transport Conference will be held in Beijing, China.
- It will provide an opportunity to focus attention on the opportunities, challenges and solutions towards achieving sustainable transport worldwide.
- Its first conference held in 2016 in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan.

Tulsa Massacre

- U.S. President Joe Biden recently became the first sitting American head of state to officially recognise the 1921 Tulsa Massacre.
- It is one of the worst incidents of violent racial hate in the US' modern history.
- Tulsa was especially known for being an unofficial sanctuary city for African Americans.
- It was also called as the "Black Wall Street" of the U.S.

World Sustainable Development Summit 2021



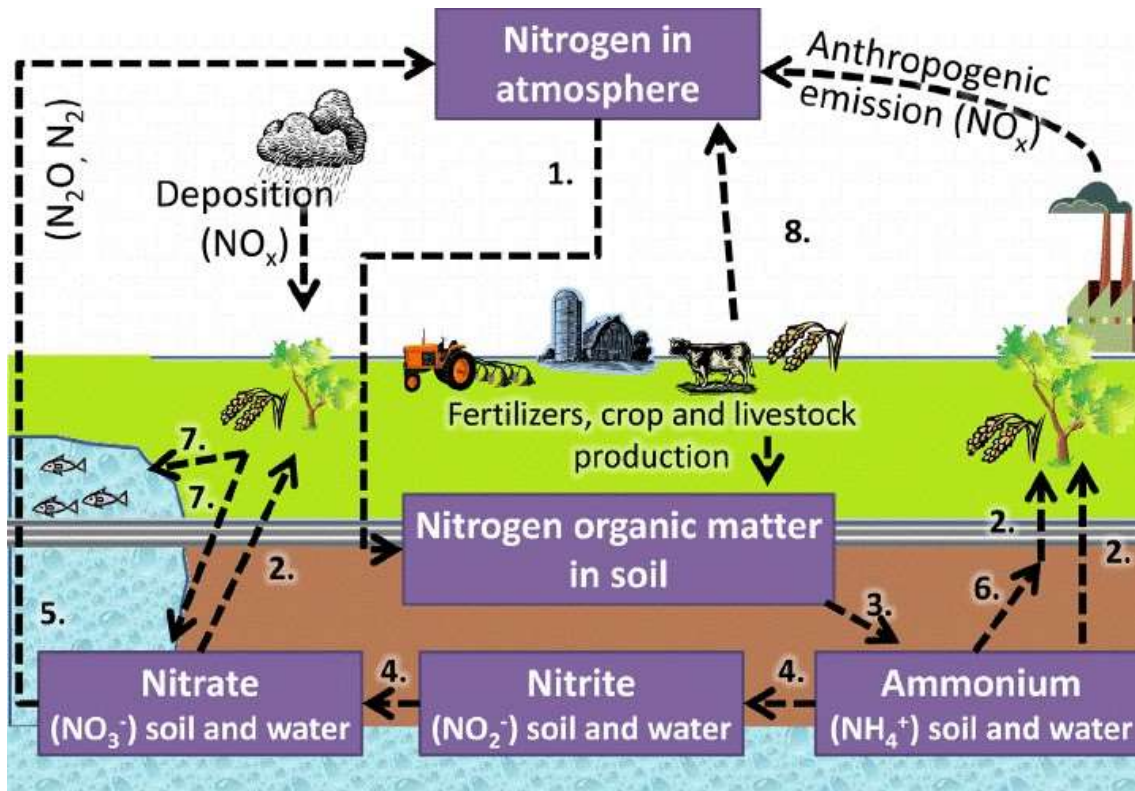
- Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Prakash Javadekar, addressed the summit.

International Nitrogen Initiative Conference

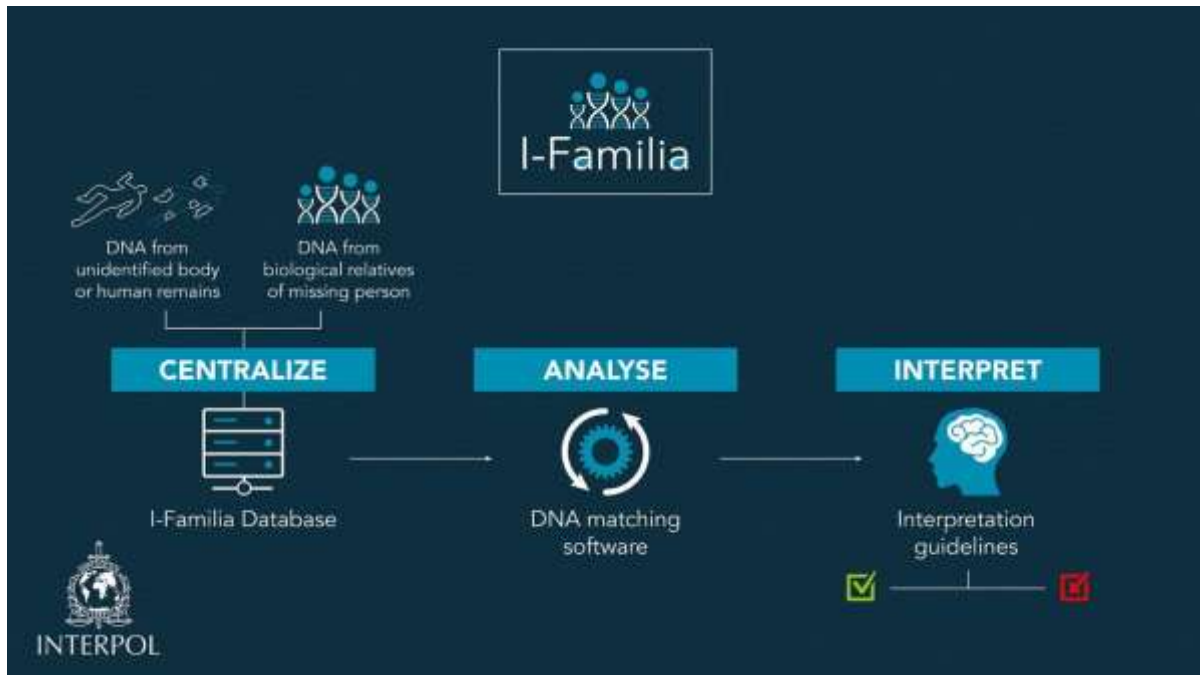


- Recently the 8th International Nitrogen Initiative Conference held virtually.

Impact of climate change on plant pests

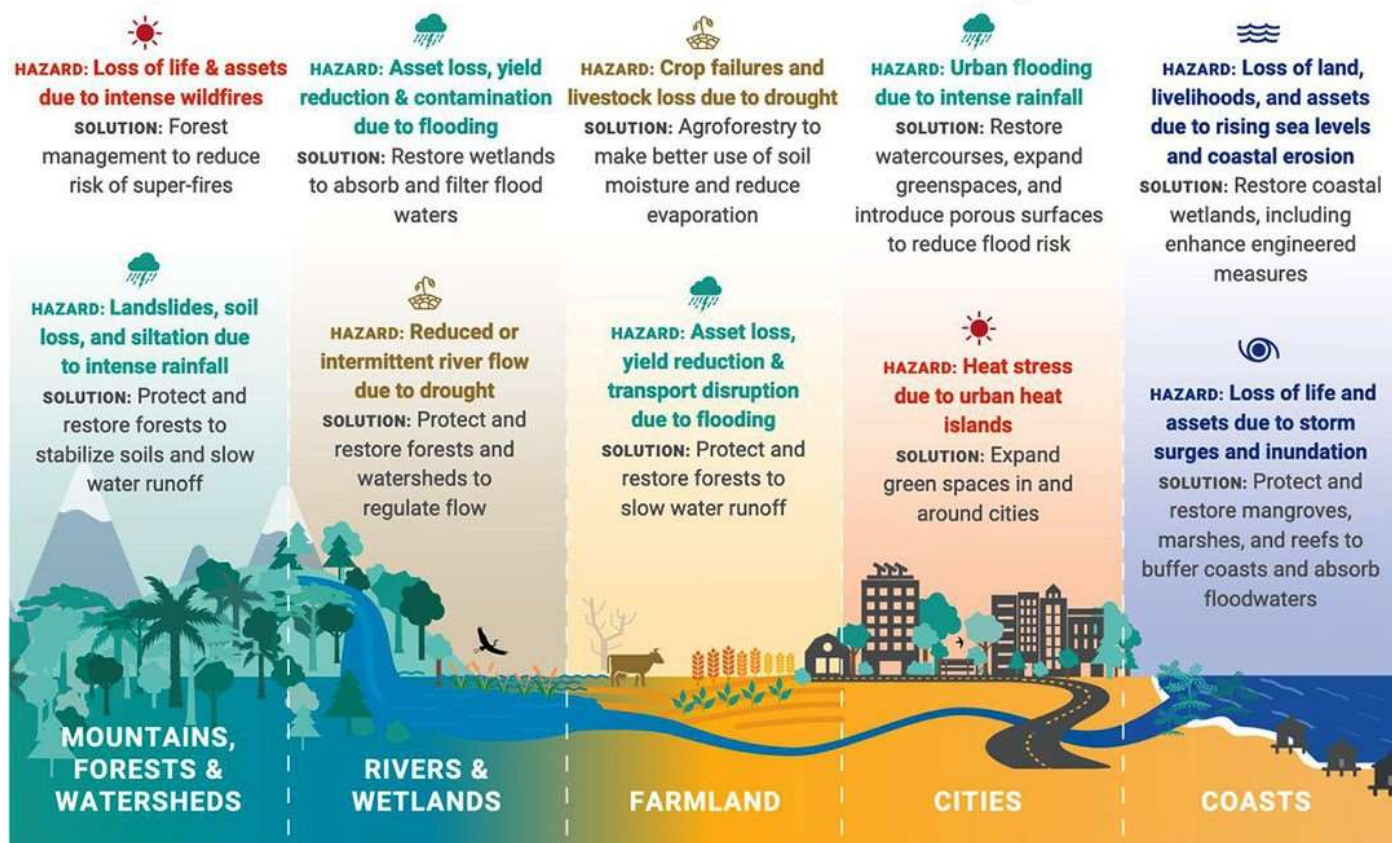
- The FAO & International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) published a report “Scientific review of the impact of climate change on plant pests”

- Aducanumab (Aduhelm) is the new drug approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for treating Alzheimer's disease.
- It is developed by the company Biogen.
- Alzheimer's disease causes the accumulation of the debris caused by the breakdown of neurons in the brain.
- This leads to plaque formation.
- Aducanumab is a monoclonal antibody.
- It is designed to reduce the presence of amyloid beta, a protein that forms plaques in the brain.

Remain in Mexico policy ended

- The United States has formally ended the Trump's "remain in Mexico" policy.
- This policy forced thousands of Central American asylum-seekers to wait in Mexico for U.S. court cases.
- After ending this policy more than 11,000 migrants enrolled in it have been allowed to enter the United States to pursue asylum claims.

Child labour global estimates 2020 report

- International Labour Organisation (ILO) and UNICEF jointly published report on child labour.
- As per report, the world has marked rise in child labour in two decades.
- Report highlights, coronavirus crisis might push millions more youngsters toward child labour.
- As of 2020, number of child labour stands at 160 million.
- It has increased by 8.4 million in four years.
- Sub-Saharan Africa is the worst affected part in the world.
- Boys are more likely to be affected.
- They will account for 97 million out of 160 million children engaging into child labour at start of 2020.

Economist's annual survey of World's Most Liveable Cities

- According to annual survey of World's most liveable cities 2021, Covid-19 pandemic has shaken up rankings of liveable cities.
- Auckland of New Zealand is the most liveable city in 2021 because of its successful approach in containing pandemic.
- It is followed by
 - Osaka & Tokyo in Japan,
 - Adelaide in Australia and
 - Wellington in New Zealand.
- Life remains most difficult in Damascus because of Syria's ongoing civil war.
- Vienna of Austria fell to 12th place in this year.
- That was world's most liveable city during 2018-20.

Operation Pangea XIV



- A record number of fake online pharmacies have been shut down under Operation Pangea XIV.
- The operation targets the sale of counterfeit and illicit medicines and medical products.
- The operation coordinated by INTERPOL involved police, customs and health regulatory authorities from 92 countries.
- Its first Operation Pangea was in 2008.

Urgent action to end AIDS by 2030

- The UN General Assembly approved a declaration for urgent action to end AIDS by 2030.
- It noted that the COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated inequalities and pushed access to AIDS medicines, treatments and diagnosis further off track.
- It advises the member nations to reduce the annual new HIV infections to under 3,70,000.
- It also reduced the annual AIDS-related deaths to under 2,50,000 by 2025.

Firmina - longest undersea cable



- Alphabet's Google is all set to build world's longest undersea cable.
- It will connect United States, Brazil, Argentina and Uruguay.
- This undersea cable will boost internet connection capacity in these regions.
- The Undersea cable is called as Firmina.

Prime Minister of Israel

- Naftali Bennett took oath as the Prime Minister of Israel.
- He is the former Defence Minister and leader of the Yamina party.
- He replaces Benjamin Netanyahu.
- Netanyahu is the longest-serving PM of Israel (12 years).

Viva Tech - 5th edition

- Viva Tech is one of the largest digital and start-up events of Europe.
- It is held in Paris every year since 2016.
- PM Modi was invited as a Guest of Honour to deliver the keynote address at Viva Tech 2021.
- During his address, PM Modi invited the world to invest in India based on the five pillars: Talent, Market, Capital, Eco-system and, Culture of openness.

New Atlantic Charter

- US President Joe Biden and British Prime Minister Boris Johnson held meeting recently in Cornwall (England).
- The meeting inspected documents related to Atlantic Charter and signed a document titled “New Atlantic Charter”.
- New Atlantic Charter was signed with the objective of defending principles & institutions of democracy and strengthening & adapting the institutions.
- Atlantic Charter is a declaration signed in August 1941 (after the end of second world war).
- It was signed by British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt.
- The recent Atlantic charter is a new version of the Atlantic Charter of 1941.

UN conference on Desertification, Land Degradation and Drought

- This conference was convened by President of 75th session of General Assembly, Volkan Bozkir.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed the high-level virtual conference on desertification, land degradation and drought.
- PM Modi was President of 14th session of Conference of the Parties to United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).
- India aims to restore 26 million hectares of degraded land by 2030.

Note

- As per United Nations, one-fifth of earth’s land area worldwide is degraded.

Global Skills Report 2021

- As per the ‘Global Skills Report 2021’, India has been ranked 67th overall globally.
- The report is released by Coursera.
- Indian learners have high proficiency in digital skills like Cloud Computing (83%) and Machine Learning (52%) & 54% in Mathematical skills.
- Improvement is needed in digital skills because in Data Analysis (25%) and Statistical programming (15%) skills.
- Countries that topped the report are
 - Switzerland - Rank 1
 - Luxembourg - Rank 2
 - Austria - Rank 3

'Report it, don't share it' - initiative



- Facebook has launched a new initiative 'Report it, don't share it!'.
 - This encourages people to report child abuse content on its platforms and not to share it.
 - The initiative is in collaboration with civil society organisations like Aarambh India Initiative, Cyber Peace Foundation and Arpan.

Brussels summit of NATO



- 31st formal meeting of heads of government of NATO was held in Brussels, Belgium.
- NATO summit 2021 is also being dubbed as Brussels summit of NATO.
- NATO leaders declared that China poses a constant security challenge and is working to undermine global order.
- NATO leaders declared China a global security challenge.

Report on Small Island developing States

- The 2021 edition of UNCTAD's Development and Globalization: Facts and Figures report was released recently.
- According to the report,
 - COVID-19 had affected all spheres of life in SIDS (Small island developing States) including health, the economy and trade.
 - This has had a huge impact on SIDS as most of them are heavily reliant on tourism.
 - SIDS were also 35 per cent more vulnerable to external economic and financial shocks than other developing countries.

United Kingdom - Australia trade deal

- United Kingdom and Australia has signed a free trade deal.
- This trade deal eliminates tariffs on wide range of goods.
- This deal was signed following UK's exit from European Union.
- This deal is expected to boost exports of traditional British products like Scotch whisky.

UNESCO Science Report

- The Latest edition of UNESCO Science Report (USR) was published recently.
- It is entitled as "race against time for smarter development".
- USR is a flagship publication of UNESCO.
- It is published once every five years.
- It is a report on science, technology and innovation (STI).
- Every edition comprises of a chapter on India.
- The Chapter on India in latest edition was authored by Prof Sunil Mani.
- He is director at Centre for Development Studies, Thiruvananthapuram.

Juneteenth



- US Government has recognised Juneteenth, or June 19th, as a federal holiday.
- The day is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the US.
- It is also known as Emancipation Day or Juneteenth Independence Day.

- The report assesses the current state of armaments, disarmament and international security.
- According to the yearbook, India possessed an estimated 156 nuclear warheads at the start of 2021.
- Pakistan had 165 warheads.
- China’s nuclear arsenal consisted of 350 warheads.
- Russia and the U.S. together possessed over 90% of global nuclear weapons.

ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting Plus



- 8th ASEAN Defence Ministers Meeting (ADMM) Plus was held recently.
- It is being hosted by Brunei as it is the chair of the ASEAN grouping this year.
- The ADMM-Plus is a platform for ASEAN and its eight Dialogue Partners to strengthen security and defence cooperation for peace, stability, and development in the region.
- Eight Dialogue Partners are Australia, China, India, Japan, New Zealand, Republic of Korea, Russia and the USA (collectively referred to as the “Plus Countries”).

India-US Hydrogen Task Force

- US-India Hydrogen Task Force was constituted with the aim of serving as a forum to achieve affordable hydrogen solutions.
- It seeks to enhance energy security & resilience by boosting up low or zero-carbon hydrogen technologies & deployment.
- This task force was launched by
 - United States Department of Energy,
 - Union Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) and
 - US India Strategic Partnership Forum (USISPF).

'Southern Ocean' - globe's fifth ocean



- The National Geographic magazine has recognised the 'Southern Ocean' as the world's fifth ocean.
- The Southern Ocean is the only ocean to touch three other oceans.
- Its northern limit is latitude of 60 degrees south.
- It is also defined by its Antarctic Circumpolar Current that was formed 34 million years ago.
- The current flows from west to east around Antarctica.

Aspirational Districts Programme - UNDP



- The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) India has lauded the Aspirational Districts Programme (ADP) as 'a very successful model of local area development'
- It was said in an independent appraisal report released recently.
- UNDP's analysis found that the programme has acted as a catalyst for expediting development in these districts.

World Competitiveness Index



- World Competitiveness Index was compiled by Institute for Management Development (IMD).
- It examined the impact of COVID-19 on economies worldwide.
- India was ranked at 43rd position among 64 countries.
- Switzerland has topped the list.
- It is followed by Sweden (2nd), Denmark (3rd), Netherlands (4th) and Singapore (5th).

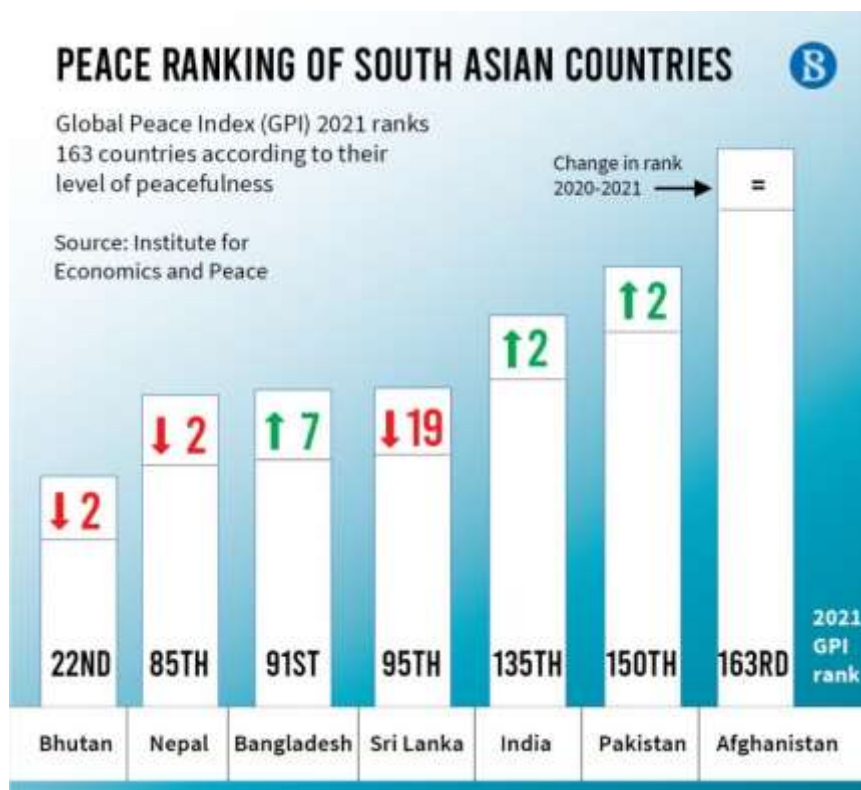
World Bank-IMF High Advisory Group

- Montek Singh Ahluwalia was named a member of a high-level Advisory Group formed by the World Bank and IMF.
- He is the former Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission.
- The group will be jointly led by Mari Pangestu, Ceyla Pazarbasioglu and Lord Nicholas Stern.
- The group was formed in the face of the dual crisis posed by the Covid-19 pandemic and climate change.

TIWB programme - Bhutan and India

- This programme is expected to be of about 24 months' duration.
- The focus of the programme will be in the area of International Taxation and Transfer Pricing.
- Through this India aims to aid Bhutan in strengthening its tax administration.
- TIWB Programme is a joint initiative of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD).

Global Peace Index 2021



- The 15th edition of the Global Peace Index (GPI) announced by Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP) Sydney.
- GPI is the world's leading measure of global peacefulness.
- Iceland remains the most peaceful country in the world, a position it has held since 2008.
- It is joined at the top of the index by New Zealand, Denmark, Portugal, and Slovenia.
- Afghanistan is the least peaceful country in the world for the fourth consecutive year.
- It is followed by Yemen, Syria, South Sudan, and Iraq.
- India becomes the 135th most peaceful country in the world.
- It ranks 5th in South Asia.
- Bhutan and Nepal are named as the first and second most peaceful in South Asia region.

Last print edition newspaper Apple Daily

- Apple Daily's final edition of 1 million copies was sold out in Hongkong.
- The newspaper said it would cease operations after Hongkong police froze \$2.3 million in assets, searched its office and arrested five top editors and executives recently.
- The Hongkong police were accusing them of foreign collusion to endanger national security.
- In recent years, the newspaper has become increasingly outspoken, criticizing Chinese and Hong Kong authorities for limiting the city's freedoms.

UN Trade Forum 2021



Towards a green and inclusive recovery

- At UN Trade Forum 2021, Union Minister Piyush Goyal has said, India's per-capita carbon dioxide emission is the lowest amongst big economies.
- India has an ambitious renewable energy target of 450 Gigawatts by 2030.
- It shows India's commitment towards United Nations 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development Goals.
- UN Trade Forum was established as a space for dialogue on how trade can be harnessed to get a prosperous, inclusive and sustainable world.

India abstains from voting on UN's Myanmar resolution

- The UN's resolution demonstrated widespread global opposition to the Myanmar military and demanded that the country's democratic transition be restored.
- India abstained from voting on the United Nations General Assembly's (UNGA's) resolution for an arms embargo against Myanmar.
- 119 countries voted 'yes', Belarus voted 'no' and 36 countries abstained.

Background

- The elected leaders of Myanmar were overthrown on February 1 this year in a coup by the army.
- It accused Aung Sang Suu Kyi's ruling party of cheating in the November elections.
- The army's allegation has been rejected by the previous election commission and international monitors.

Children and Digital Dumpsites report



- The new report, titled Children and Digital Dumpsites, was recently released by the WHO.

Highlights

- More than 18 million children and adolescents working at e-waste dumpsites in low and middle-income countries are potentially at the risk of severe health hazards.
- They face risk due to discarded electronic devices or e-waste being dumped from high-income countries.
- The processing is done in low-income countries, which do not have proper safeguarding regulation.
- Children are especially preferred at these dumpsites because of their small and dexterous hands.
- About 53.6 million tonnes of e-waste was generated in 2019.
- Only 17.4 per cent of this e-waste was processed in formal recycling facilities.
- The rest of it was dumped in low or middle-income countries for illegal processing by informal workers.

Children & Armed Conflict - Report

- The United Nations published its “Annual Report of Secretary-General on Children & Armed Conflict (CAAC)”.
- As per the report, 26425 grave violations were committed against children in 2020.
- About 19,300 children affected by war in 2020.
- Crimes of abduction have increased by 90%.
- Incidents of rape & other forms of sexual violence have increased by 70%.
- One in four children affected by grave violations like rape & other forms of sexual violence were girls.

Global Trends report

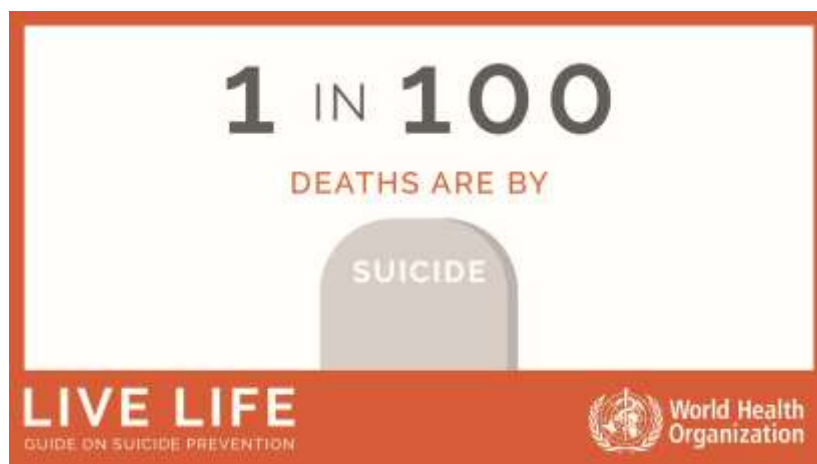


- According to the UNHCR's latest annual Global Trends report
 - 82.4 million people forcibly displaced globally.
 - 20.7 million refugees under UNHCR's mandate (20.4 million in 2019)
 - 5.7 million Palestine refugees under UNRWA's mandate (5.6 million in 2019)
 - 48.0 million internally displaced people (45.7 million in 2019)
 - 4.1 million asylum-seekers (4.1 million in 2019)
 - 3.9 million Venezuelans displaced abroad (3.6 million in 2019)
- 2020 is the ninth year of uninterrupted rise in forced displacement worldwide.
- More than two thirds of all people who fled abroad came from just five countries
 - Syria (6.7 million),
 - Venezuela (4.0 million),
 - Afghanistan (2.6 million),
 - South Sudan (2.2 million) and
 - Myanmar (1.1 million).
- For the seventh year in a row, Turkey hosted the largest refugee population worldwide (3.7 million refugees).

Report on Racial Justice and Equality

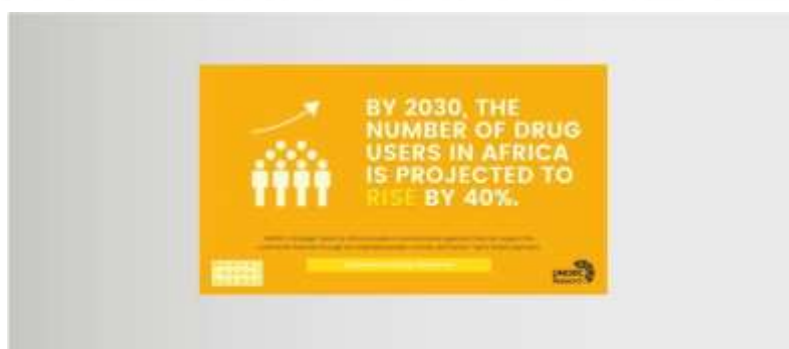
- The United Nations published its report on Racial Justice & Equality.
- It called to immediately dismantle systemic racism against black people worldwide to avoid repeating outrages such as killing of George Floyd.
- The UN report was triggered by death of Floyd.
- He was murdered by US police officer, Derek Chauvin.

Suicide worldwide in 2019



- Suicide worldwide in 2019 report was published by World Health Organization.
- According to the report, only 38 countries have a national suicide prevention strategy, as of now.
- Suicide crisis was already in place in 2019.
- About one in 100 died by suicide in 2019.
- 58% of the suicides occurred before the age of 50 years.
- Suicide was fourth-leading cause of death in young people aged 15-29 worldwide in 2019.
- 77% of global suicides occurred in low-income and middle-income countries in 2019.
- Africa, Europe and South-East Asia accounted for suicide rates higher than world's average.
- India has highest suicide rate in Southeast Asian region.
- Rate of suicide was 9.9 in 2017 which increased to 10.2 in 2018.

World Drug Report 2021



- World Drug Report 2021 was released by United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC).
- As per the report, 275 million people used drugs across the world in 2020.
- As per the report, 36 million people suffered from drug use disorders.
- Percentage of adolescents who perceived drug as harmful has reduced by 40 per cent.

CEOS COAST



- Recently, UN body has endorsed a multinational project called (CEOS COAST).
- CEOS COAST is Committee on Earth Observation Satellites Coastal Observations, Applications, Services, and Tools.
- CEOS COAST programme is co-led by ISRO and NOAA from US.
- This programme aims to improve accuracy of coastal data on the basis of satellite and land-based observations.
- Themes of these projects are disaster risk reduction & coastal resilience among continental shorelines & small island nations.

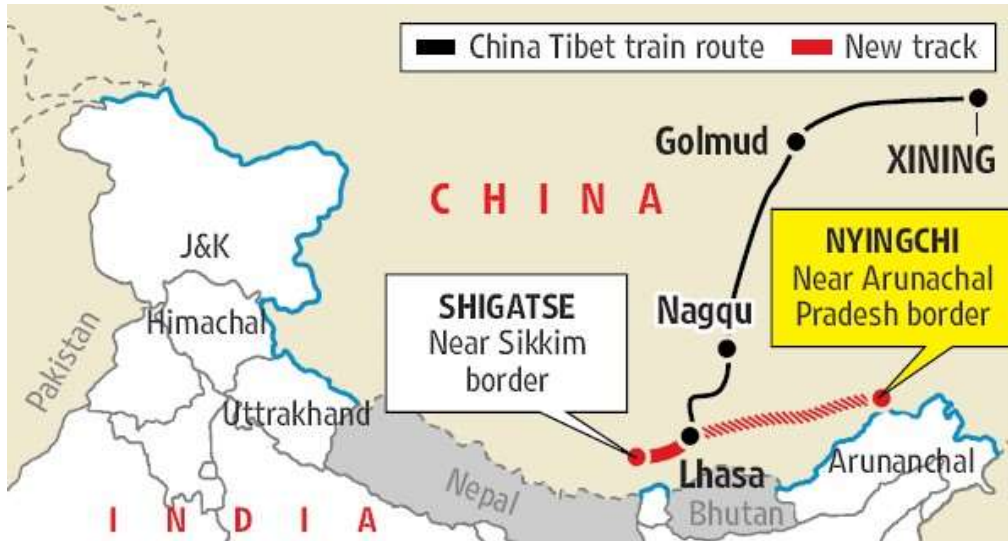
FATF - Grey list

- The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) added Haiti, Malta, the Philippines and South Sudan to the grey list.
- Ghana was removed from the list.

FATF

- The Financial Action Task Force is an inter-governmental body established on the initiative of the G7.
- It was established in 1989.
- FATF is a Paris-based organization.
- It sets anti-money-laundering law standards.
- There are now 22 countries or territories on the so-called grey list.

China to run First Electric Train in Tibet



- China will operationalise first electric train in remote Himalayan region of Tibet.
- The electric train will connect provincial capital Lhasa with Nyingchi.
- Nyingchi is a strategically located Tibetan border town close to Arunachal Pradesh.

Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership and Japan



- Japan had recently ratified the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP).
- It is a free trade agreement between Australia, China, and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).
- Japan has become the third member to ratify the agreement.
- Among the signatories, China and Singapore have completed the ratification procedures.
- Joining RCEP will be Japan's first trade deal involving China and South Korea.

Denmark signed the ISA Framework agreement



- Denmark has signed the **International Solar Alliance Framework Agreement (ISA FA)** and Instrument of Ratification with India.
- Denmark has become the first country to ratify this after amendments in the ISA FA entered into force on January 8, 2021.

Note

- ISA was established with the objective of working for efficient consumption of solar energy in a bid to reduce dependence on fossil fuels.
- ISA initiative was first proposed by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his speech in November 2015 at Wembley Stadium.
- During his speech, he referred the sunshine countries as Suryaputra.

U.S. economic blockade against Cuba



- India, along with 183 countries voted in favour of a General Assembly resolution that demanded ending the U.S. economic blockade against Cuba.
- The U.S. and Israel were the only nations voting against the resolution.
- Colombia, Ukraine and Brazil abstained on the resolution.
- The embargo against Cuba was imposed in 1960.
- This was following the revolution led by Fidel Castro and the nationalisation of properties belonging to U.S. citizens and corporations.

Most expensive city for foreign workers - Ashgabat



- Ashgabat has been named the world's most expensive city for foreign workers.
- It is the capital of Turkmenistan.
- The city topped the list in a 2021 cost-of-living survey by consultancy firm Mercer.
- Hong Kong was on the second position.
- Hongkong was followed by Beirut in Lebanon and Tokyo in Japan.

Baihetan Hydro power Station



- China began operating the world's second-largest hydro power station (Baihetan Hydro power Station) recently.
- Baihetan Hydro power Station has been built with a total installed capacity of 16,000 megawatts.
- The hydropower dam is built on the upper section of the Yangtze River.
- Yangtze is the longest river in China.
- Three Gorges dam (China) is the largest hydro power station in the world in terms of power generation.



Dragon Man



- The Researchers from China have claimed to have found an ancient human skull that could belong to an altogether new species of humans.
- The skull was found in north-east China's Harbin city.
- It has been dubbed the "Dragon Man" or Homo longi.
- The name has been derived from the Long Jiang or Dragon River in the Heilongjiang province of China where the city of Harbin is located.
- The cranium could be over 146,000 years old.

UK bans World's Largest Crypto Exchange



- The Financial Conduct Authority of Britain has banned world's largest cryptocurrency exchanges, Binance.
- Binance is a cryptocurrency exchange from Cayman Islands.
- It provides a platform to trade several cryptocurrencies.
- It was founded in 2017.
- This cryptocurrency exchange was founded by Changpeng Zhao.
- It was initially based in China.
- But due to increased regulation of cryptocurrency in China, it moved headquarters out of China.

Mobile World Congress



- The Mobile World Congress is world's biggest mobile event of the 2021.
- It started on June 28 in Barcelona of Spain.
- The Mobile World Congress is an annual event focused on innovations in telecom industry.
- It is being hosted by Global System for Mobile Association.
- This event is attended by major telecom operators, component manufacturers, smartphone companies, trade insiders, media, and representatives from telecom ministries across the world.

Activities which held up in other states of India

Maratha Community avail benefits under EWS quota

- Supreme Court struck down the Maharashtra law granting quota to the Maratha community in admissions and government jobs, by terming it "unconstitutional".
- The Maharashtra Government announced that the Maratha Community can now avail benefits under the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) quota.
- Earlier, the Maratha Community recognized as the Socially and Economically Backward Class (SEBC) category was not eligible for the availing the 10 per cent EWS quota due to the prevalence of Maratha reservation in the state.

Skill development colleges

- The government of Andhra Pradesh has passed an order to establish of one Skill Development University and 30 skill development colleges across the state.
- One college will be set up in each of the 25 parliamentary constituencies.
- One will be set up in each IIIT across the state.
- One will be set up in Pulivendila, Chief Minister YS Jaganmohan Reddy's constituency.

Guardian Ministers

- Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has appointed 'Guardian Ministers'.
- They are appointed to oversee the implementation of government policy decisions, administrative reforms, and other welfare schemes in all the 34 districts of the state.
- 13 'Guardian Ministers' have been appointed for all 34 districts in Assam
- The assigned ministers will be responsible for the implementation of all centrally-sponsored schemes as well as the state's own priority programmes.

Indus Best Mega Food Park

- Union Minister for Food Processing Industries, Narendra Singh Tomar virtually inaugurated the Indus Best Mega Food Park in Chhattisgarh.
- The Park will also provide direct and indirect employment to about 5,000 persons.
- It will benefit about 25,000 farmers in the CPC and PPC catchment areas.

Indimimus Jayanti



- Recently, a new species of Cricket named '**Indimimus jayanti**' was found in the Kurra caves of Chhattisgarh.
- The new species was named after Professor Jayant Biswas, one of the leading cave explorers in the country.
- The new species of cricket has been identified under the genus Arachnomimus Saussure, 1897.
- Jayanti has led to the new subgenus 'Indimimus'.
- Males of the new Jayanti subgenus cannot produce sound and their females don't have ears.

GIFT - Goa

- Goa government has established the "Goa Institution for Future Transformation (GIFT)"
- GIFT will function on the lines of NITI Aayog.
- It will assist, advice and guide government on policy making, its formulation and implementation.
- It will also help in monitoring sustainable development goals and evaluation of several development plans, programmes and schemes.
- It will be backed up under Article 309 of Constitution of India to attain autonomy.

International maritime services cluster - GIFT City

- Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) will set up the country's first international maritime services cluster at GIFT City.
- This will be a dedicated ecosystem comprising ports, shipping, logistics services providers and government regulators, all present in the same geographic vicinity.
- GIFT City is India's first operational smart city and international financial services.

Dehing Patkai Wildlife Sanctuary

- The Assam Government has decided to declare Dehing Patkai Wildlife Sanctuary as the 7th National Park of the state.
- It is popularly known as Dehing Patkai Rain Forest.
- The state now has the second-highest number of national parks in the country.
- Madhya Pradesh and Andaman and Nicobar Islands have nine national parks each.

Net energy neutral status - Bengaluru airport

- The Kempegowda International Airport has achieved net energy neutral status in the Financial Year 2020-21.
- Bengaluru international airport has been able to save nearly 22 lakh units of energy in the Financial Year 2020-21.
- These measures were achieved through solar installation.

eIDs

- Punjab Government has initiated the usage of eIDs for their officers/employees.
- Punjab becomes the first state to use this.
- The eIDs are equipped with Near Field Communication (NFC) technology.

Heritage Tree concept



- The state Cabinet approved the action plan to implement 'Heritage Tree' concept in Maharashtra.
- This action plan was proposed by Environment Department headed by Aaditya Thackeray.
- This is to protect ancient and old trees aged 50 years and above in urban areas.
- Action plan amends Maharashtra (Urban Areas) Tree Protection and Conservation Act, 1975.

Raja Parba - Odisha

- Raja Parba festival celebrated in Odisha.
- It is a 3-days unique festival.
- It is celebrated during the onset of monsoon.
- It is believed that during this time the Mother Earth or Bhudevi undergoes menstruation.
- The fourth day is the day of the 'purification bath'.
- This festival is synonymous with varieties of cakes (pithas).

Jalgaon Banana

- Jalgaon Banana was exported to Dubai.
- Jalgaon Banana is a GI certified agricultural produce from Jalgaon district of Maharashtra.
- Jalgaon District is an identified banana cluster under Agri Export Policy.
- It is also called as "Banana city" of Maharashtra.

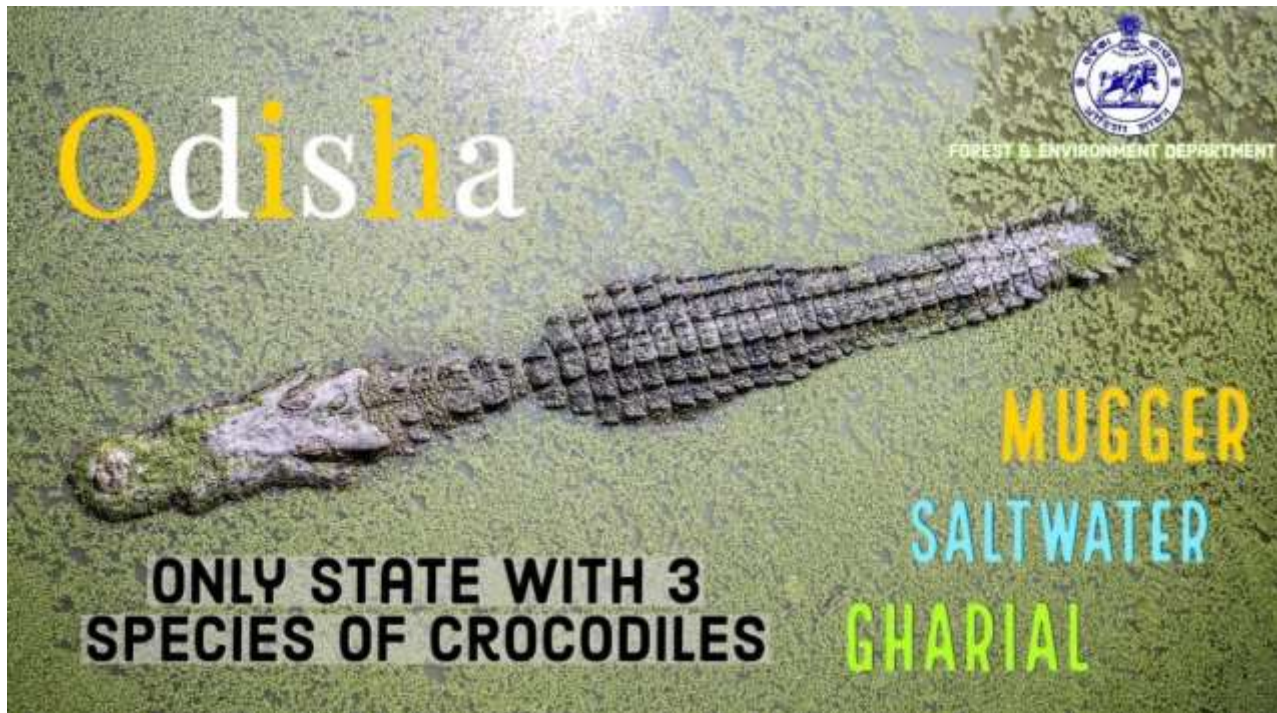
Stygarctus Keralensis

- This tiny & tough species of Tardigrades has been named after Kerala.'
- Tardigrades are small specie which are commonly called as 'water bears' and moss piglets.
- They were first described by German zoologist Johann August Ephraim Goeze in 1773.

Benefits in Punjab due to BT Cotton adoption

- The Researchers in India recently conducted one study funded by Agricultural Extension Division of Indian Council of Agricultural Research.
- It was done under an extramural project named "Impact evaluation of integrated pest management technologies".
- The study says that,
 - The use of highly hazardous & riskiest insecticides has reduced over time.
 - Expenses associated with insecticide use have also reduced.
 - Cotton yields in the past 13 years have been stable, except in 2015.
- BT cotton is a genetically modified pest resistant plant cotton variety.
- BT toxins are insecticidal to larvae of moths, butterflies, cotton bollworms, beetles and flies.

Crocodiles' species in Odisha



- Odisha has become the only state in India to have all the three species of crocodiles.
- They are,
 - Reptile freshwater Gharials at Satkosia in Mahanadi,
 - Muggers in Bhitarkanika National Park and
 - Saltwater crocodiles in Bhitarkanika National Park.
- Odisha has witnessed natural nesting of Gharials (a critically endangered species) for the first time since they were introduced in its rivers in 1975.

GM Rubber planted in Assam

- The Rubber Board has started field trial of world's first GM (genetically modified) rubber in the state of Assam.
- GM Rubber was developed in biotechnology laboratory at Rubber Research Institute of India (RRII) in Puthuppally, Kottayam.
- It was planted at Rubber board's Sarutari research farm in Guwahati.
- In Kerala, the state Government denied permission for the field trial of GM Rubber because of its adverse impact on environment.

Incentives for having more children - Mizoram

- Sports Minister of Mizoram, Robert Romawia Royte, has announced a cash incentive of Rs 1 lakh for having more children.
- Rs 1 lakh would be given to living parent with highest number of children in minister's constituency.
- This is to encourage population growth among the demographically small Mizo communities.

Kaval Plus programme

- The Department of Women & Child Development in Kerala has decided to expand Kaval Plus programme to five districts.
- The programme is to lend holistic support to children in need of care & protection and to the survivors of sexual abuse.
- This Project was before implemented in Thiruvananthapuram and Palakkad district.
- It will be now implemented in Ernakulam, Idukki, Malappuram, Kozhikode, and Kannur districts.

Freshwater Black Softshell Turtle



- Hayagriva Madhava Temple Committee (Assam) signed a MoU with two NGOs, Assam State Zoo cum Botanical Garden and the Kamrup district administration.
- This is for conserving the rare freshwater black softshell turtle.
- Also, a Vision Document 2030 was launched to raise at least 1000 black softshell turtle (*Nilssonina nigricans*) by 2030.
- These turtles are found along the Brahmaputra River's drainage in Assam, and in ponds of temples in north-eastern India and Bangladesh.
- The International Union for Conservation of Nature had in 2021 listed the turtle as 'critically endangered'.

Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine

- The Odisha Government will launch Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV) under the universal vaccination programme.
- The Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV) has been developed by the Serum Institute of India (SII).
- It was developed in association with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

Hemis Festival



- The legendary two days Hemis festival celebrated in Leh in Ladakh.
- It's also popularly known as Hemis Tses-Chu.
- It is celebrated to commemorate the birth anniversary of Guru Padma sambhava.
- Guru Padma sambhava introduced and flourished Vajrayana Buddhist tradition in the entire Himalayas.
- Guru Padma sambhava is popularly known as the second Buddha.

Reforms in AP Public Service Commission

- The Andhra Pradesh government issued a formal order dispensing with the process of interviews for all future recruitments into government service.
- This includes the executive posts also.
- Written tests and interviews were, however, retained for executive posts like deputy collector, Deputy Superintendent of Police, commercial taxes officer, regional transport officer and the like.
- The reforms were implemented as per the recommendations of a high-level committee headed by the then Special Chief Secretary J Satyanarayana.

SALT programme

- Andhra Pradesh has started a Supporting Andhra's Learning Transformation (SALT) programme.
- This programme is to transform foundational learning in government schools for which the World Bank has approved a loan of 250 million dollars.
- The main objectives of the programme are strengthening foundation schools and providing training and skill development to teachers.

Export of Dragon fruits



- The first consignment of dragon fruit has been exported to Dubai recently.
- In India, this dragon fruit is also known as Kamalam.
- Dragon Fruit for exports was sourced from the farmers of Tadasar village, Sangli district, Maharashtra
- Dragon fruit is the fruit of a species of wild cactus indigenous to South and Central America.
- It is called pitaya or pitahaya over there.

Ramgarh Vishdhari wildlife sanctuary

- Ramgarh Vishdhari wildlife sanctuary becomes the 4th Tiger reserve of Rajasthan.
- This will be the 52nd Tiger Reserve of India.
- Rajasthan's other three tiger reserves are,
 - Ranthambore Tiger Reserve (RTR) in Sawai Madhopur,
 - Sariska Tiger Reserve (STR) in Alwar and
 - Mukundra Hills Tiger Reserve (MHTR) in Kota.

Note

- Project Tiger was launched in 1973 with 9 tiger reserves.
- It is an ongoing Centrally Sponsored Scheme of the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change.

ICC Hall of Fame



Aubrey Faulkner of South Africa and Monty Noble of Australia for the early era (pre-1918), Sir Learie Constantine of West Indies and Stan McCabe of Australia for the inter-war Era (1918-1945), Ted Dexter of England and **Vinoo Mankad of India** for the **post-war Era (1946-1970)**. Desmond Haynes of the West Indies and Bob Willis of England were inducted from the ODI era (1971-1995) Andy Flower of Zimbabwe and Kumar Sangakkara of Sri Lanka were from the modern era (1996-2016).

- The ICC has inducted 10 icons of the game, including India's Vinoo Mankad, into its illustrious Hall of Fame.

- It is her maiden Grand Slam Title.
- Barbora along with her partner Katerlina Siniakova (Czech Republic) defeated Bethanie Mattek-Sands (USA) & Iga Swiatek (Poland) to win the Women's Doubles Title.
- Barbora Krejčíková becomes first player to win women's singles and doubles title in French Open since 2000.
- French pair of Pierre-Huues Herbert & Nicola Pietrangeli became the 1st French pair to win the men's doubles title at the French Open 2021.

Poland open - Vinesh Phogat



- The Indian wrestler Vinesh Phogat won the gold medal in the 53 kg category at the Poland Open.
- It is her third title of the season.
- Earlier, She had won gold at the Matteo Pellicone event (March) and Asian Championship (April).

Laurel Hubbard



- The New Zealand weightlifter Laurel Hubbard becomes the first transgender athlete to compete at an Olympic Games.
- She is 43-year-old.
- She will be the fourth oldest weightlifter at an Olympics.
- She is to participate in the women's super-heavyweight 87kg-plus category in Tokyo.

Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce



- Jamaican sprinter Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce became the second-fastest woman of all time.
- She clocked 10.63 seconds at a 100 metre meet in Kingston.
- She is behind 100 metres world record holder Florence Griffith-Joyner.
- Florence Griffith-Joyner holds the women's 100m world record of 10.49 seconds, set in Indianapolis in 1988.

ICC World Test Championship



- New Zealand defeated India to win the ICC's first World Test Championship for the first time.
- Kyle Jamieson (NZ) has been adjudged as the "Player of the match".
- Kane Williamson (NZ) is the "Player of the series".
- The final match was played at Ageas Bowl Stadium (Rose Bowl Stadium) in Southampton, England.

Saurabh Chaudhary



- The Indian shooter Saurabh Chaudhary won the bronze medal in the men's 10m air pistol shooting at the ISSF World Cup 2021.
- The event took place in Osijek, Croatia on June 24, 2021.

Note

- Chaudhary was the youngest Indian athlete to win gold at the 2018 Asian Games in the 10m air pistol event.
- Chaudhary is also the only Indian shooter who has won a gold medal in ISSF World Championship, ISSF World Cup, Asian Games, Asian Air Gun Championship, and Youth Olympic Games.

World Environment Day - June 5



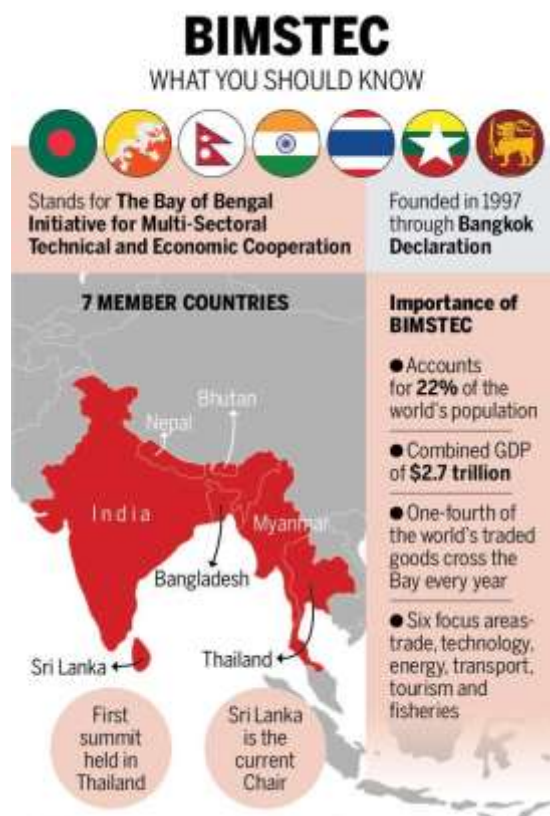
- World Environment Day is observed to raise awareness about protecting the environment.

- The first World Pest Day was marked in 2017.

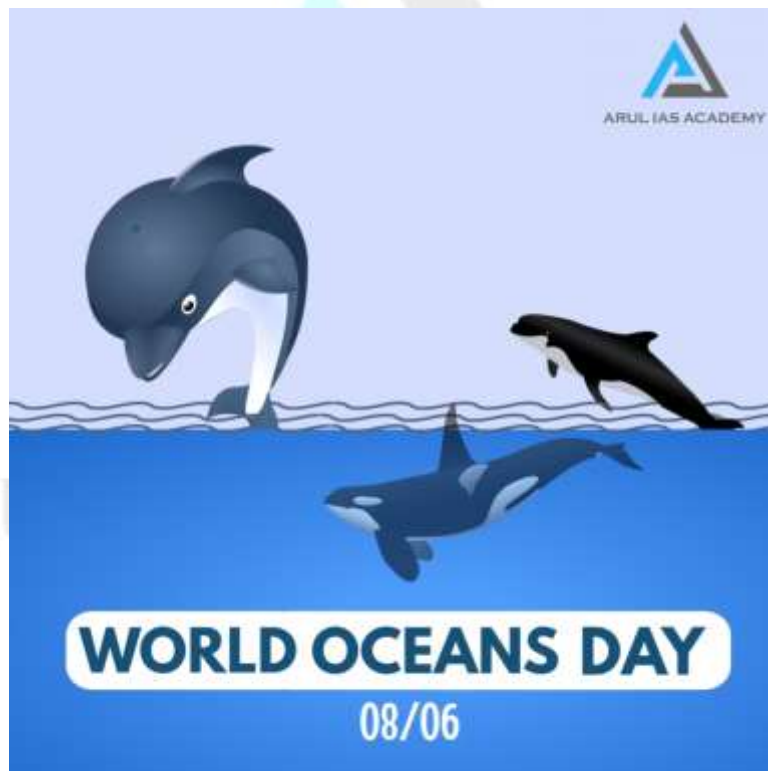

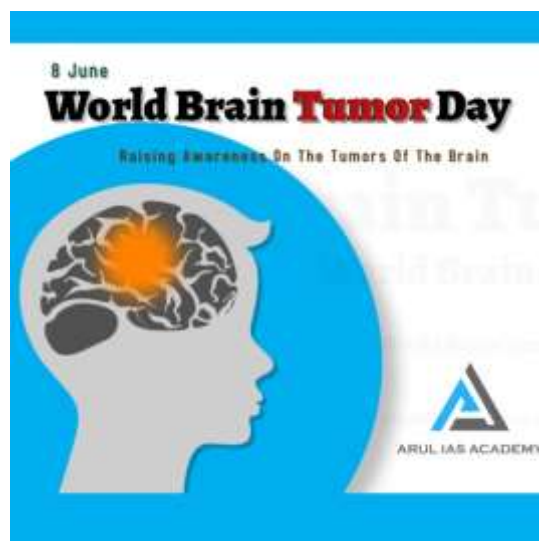

International Day for the Elimination of Sexual Violence in Conflict - June 19



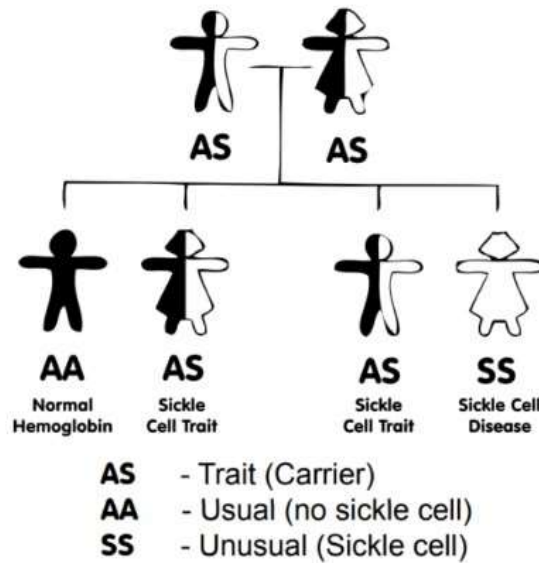
- The day aims to raise awareness of the need to put an end to conflict-related sexual violence, honour the victims and survivors of sexual violence around the world.

World Sickle Cell Awareness Day - June 19



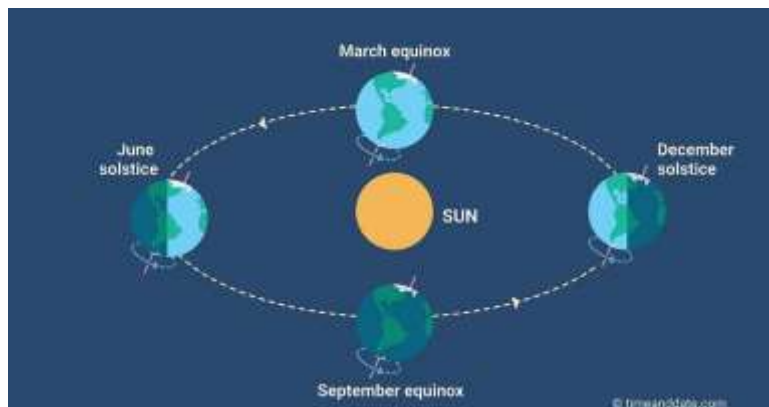
- This day is observed to increase awareness and understanding of the sickle cell disease and the challenges faced by its patients and their families.

 - Encourage amateur musicians to showcase their work to the world.

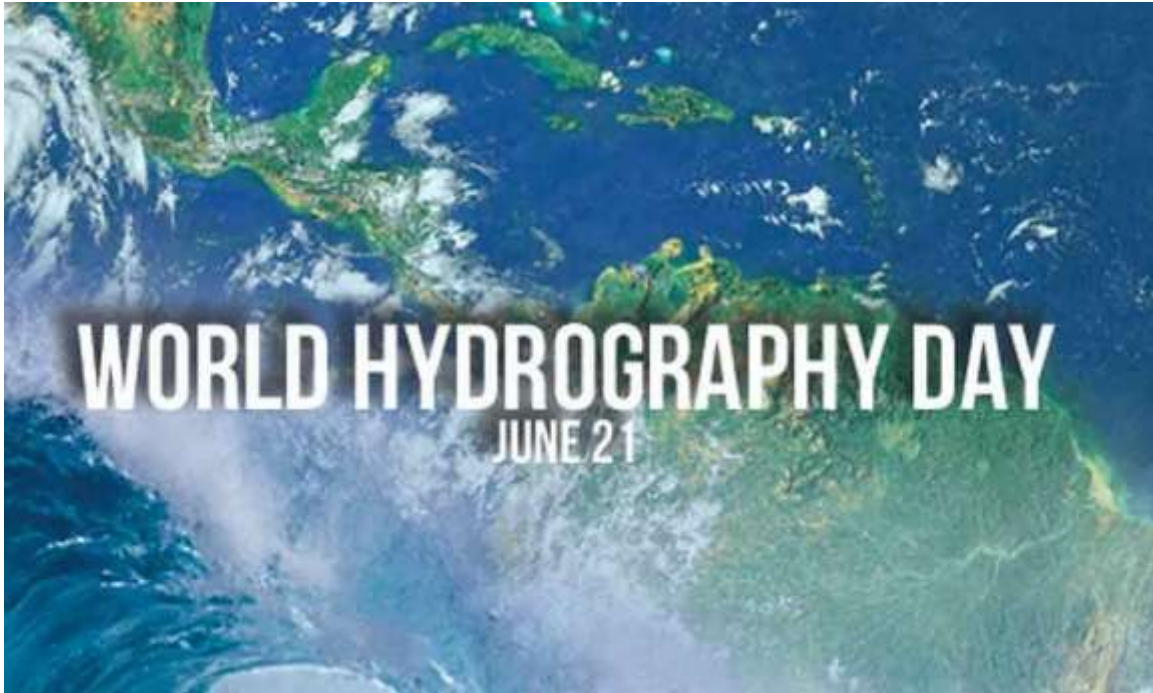
World Humanist Day - June 21

World Vitiligo Day - June 25



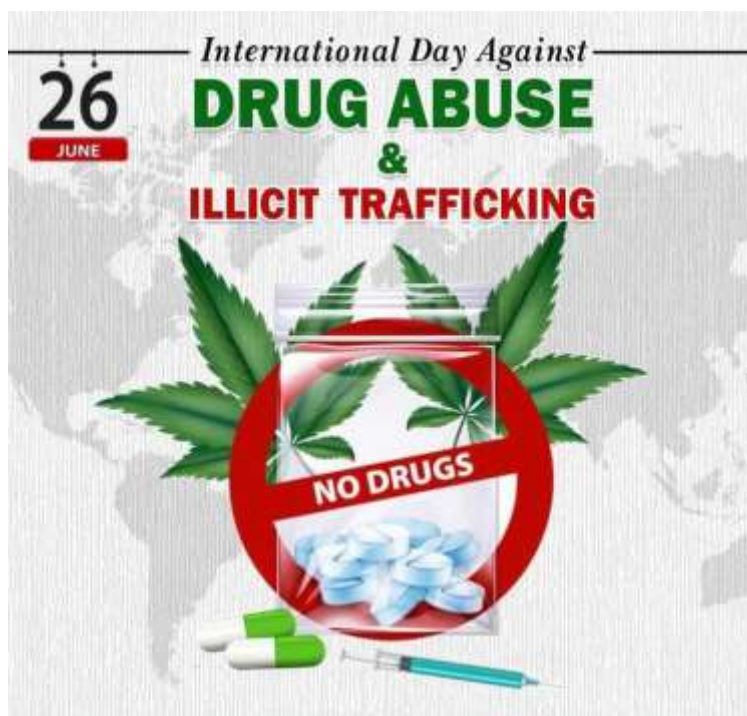
- The day is observed to build global awareness about vitiligo.

International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking - June 26



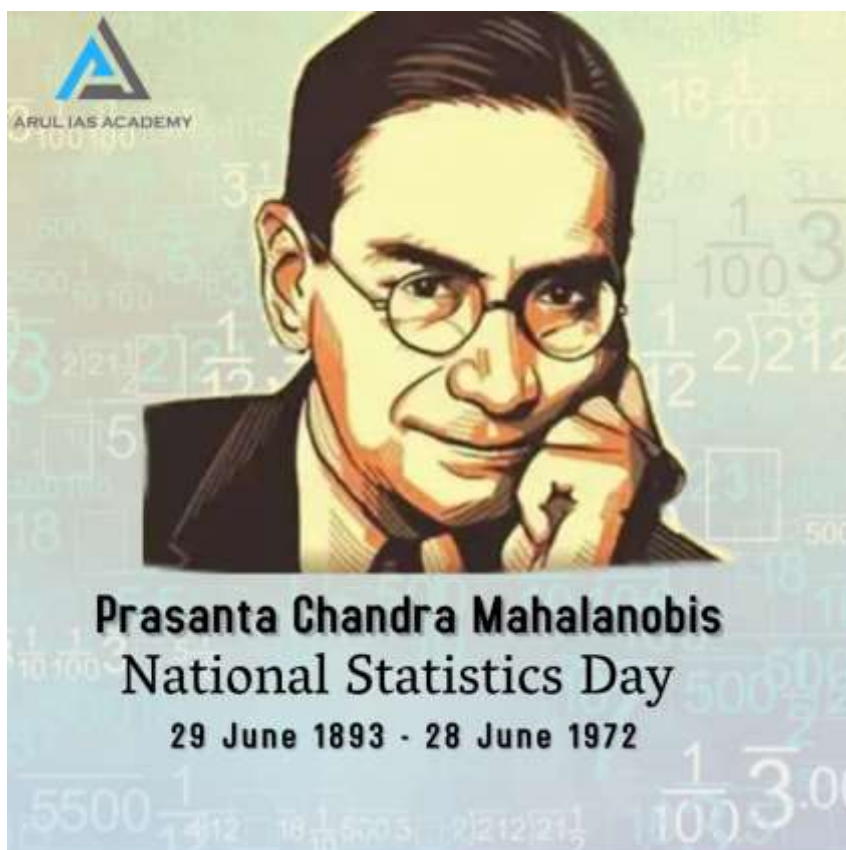
- The day is observed by the United Nations as an expression of its determination to strengthen action and cooperation to achieve the goal of an international society free of drug abuse.

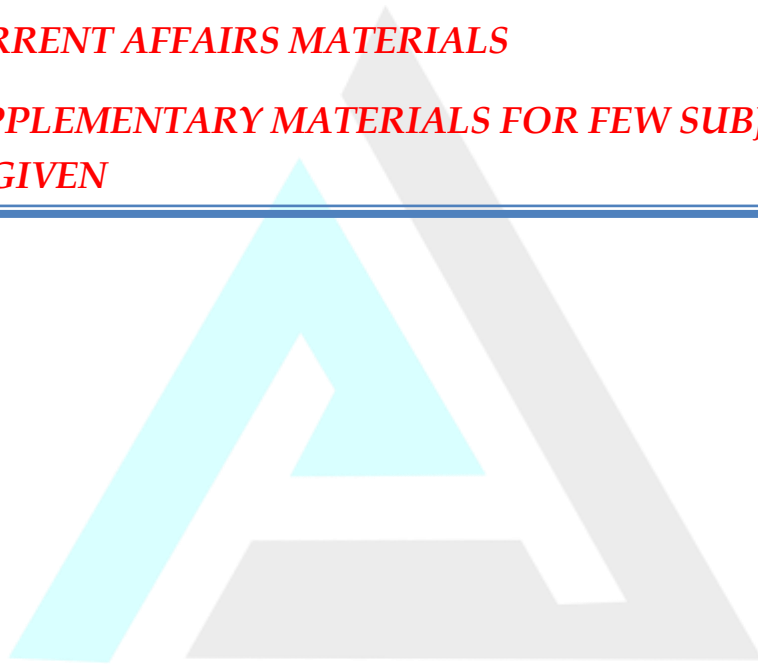
