







## Crop Insurance Scheme May Cover Up to 25 Lakh TN Farmers



\*AS ON SEPTEMBER 29, 2021

- Despite a late start, the Tamil Nadu government aims to keep 25 lakh farmers enrolled and 42 lakh acres covered under the Prime Minister's crop insurance scheme (Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana) this year.
- Though only around one lakh farmers till now have enrolled so far under this scheme. Agriculture Department officials are hopeful that the enrolment drive would pick up in the coming weeks as farmers intensify their activities during the current 'samba', 'thaladi', and 'pishanam' cultivation season.

#### Special season

- Given the peculiarity of the circumstances in the State, crops grown during the 'samba' season come under the special season in terms of insurance coverage. Otherwise, it is either kharif or rabi season for insurance purposes. Last year, 25.77 lakh farmers were enrolled for an area of around 42.77 lakh acres.
- Approximately 12.4 lakh farmers alone have registered for the 2020-21 special season. The ongoing 'samba' season is significant since it accounts for roughly two-thirds of annual rice production.
- This time, there is an additional motive for the authorities to guarantee comprehensive coverage. During the kharif season this year, coverage was hardly one-fourth of what the State had accomplished the previous year.



- This was due to a number of factors, including the implementation of the model code of conduct for the Assembly election, which caused a delay in the selection of insurance companies.
- The harvest of paddy produced during the 'kuruvai' season had begun by the time Agriculture Insurance Company of India Limited and IFFCO-Tokio General Insurance Company were picked in late August. According to officials, this is why paddy alone could not be covered this year.

#### **Period of Enrollment**

- Normally, farmer enrollment for the special season concludes on December 15th. However, in most districts, paddy harvesting is completed by the middle of November. Maize, cotton, and onions are some of the crops that may be covered.
- The registration procedure for Rabi is planned to begin in the third week of October and will go through February. There will, however, be district and crop- wise cut-off dates.



## ASI to renovate World War I memorial arch near Lalgudi

- The Archaeological Survey of India has planned to take up restoration and conservation works on a commemorative arch, built during the British rule recognising the role of Indian soldiers in the victory of the Allied powers in World War I, at Keezha Valadi near Lalgudi in Tiruchi district.
- The memorial was erected by Dewan Bahadur G. Krishnamachariar and opened by Dewan Bahadur Sir T. Desikachariar, Trichinopoly District Board president, on August 10, 1922.



#### Stalin names road after freedom fighter Tiruppur Kumaran



- Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on October 4 named a road in Erode district after late freedom fighter Tiruppur Kumaran on the occasion of his birth anniversary.
- During a virtual event in the Secretariat, Mr. Stalin unveiled the name board 'Thiyagi Kumaran Road'. A main road in Sampath Nagar opposite to Erode Collectorate has been named after the freedom fighter who is fondly being remembered as 'Kodi Katha Kumaran.'
- The State government on October 3 issued a G.O. for naming the road in Sampath Nagar in Erode after the late freedom fighter. The G.O. followed a request made by Erode Collector after a resolution was adopted in this regard by Erode Corporation's Council meeting.

#### Vallalar's birth anniversary is benevolence day

- Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on Tuesday announced that the State government would observe the birth anniversary of 'Arutpragasa Vallalar' Ramalinga Adigalar as the Day of Thaniperungarunai (boundless benevolence) every year.
- In a statement, Mr. Stalin recalled the life of Vallalar and highlighted how the kitchen in his Sathya Gnana Sabhai in Vadalur, Cuddalore district, continued to feed the hungry.
- Born on October 5, 1823, in Maruthur near Chidambaram, in Cuddalore district, Vallalar led a life filled with kindness and benevolence, said Mr. Stalin.
- The Chief Minister also recalled Vallalar's works, including Manumurai kanda thiruvasagam and Jeeva karunya ozhukkam.
- > Ramalinga Adigalar's poem *Thiruvarutpa* is divided into six *Thirumuraigal*.



#### TN Signs MoU for Multi-Modal Logistics Park near Chennai



- A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to set up a multi-modal logistics park (MMLP) at Mappedu in Tiruvallur district was signed.
- It was signed between Tamil Nadu Industrial Development Corporation (TIDCO), National Highways Logistics Management Limited (NHLML) and the Chennai Port Trust (CPT).
- The MMLP, to be set up close to Chennai Peripheral Ring Road, would connect Chennai airport, Chennai port, Kamarajar port and Kattupalli port.

#### T23 Tiger captured in Tamil Nadu taken to Mysuru zoo for treatment



- The man-hunting Tiger T23 of Mudumalai Tiger Reserve has finally been captured alive by the Tamil Nadu Forest Department.
- > They had captured it after 22 days of the massive hunt.
- > T23 was spotted near the Masinagudi forest area.
- ➢ It was moved to Mysuru Zoo.



# Seventh phase of excavation at Keeladi completed

- The Tamil Nadu State Department of Archaeology (TNSDA) began excavations in Keeladi, Konthagai, and Agaram in Sivagangai district.
- The seventh phase was conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Department of Archaeology
- ▶ Keeladi is an urban settlement that is at least 2,600 years old.
- > Ring wells were the highlight of the seventh phase of this excavation.
- Ring wells may have been used as soak pits or draw wells.
- This is the first time that the Tamil Nadu State Archaeology Department has left the quadrants open without filling it with soil after the excavation ended as it plans to establish an open site museum.
- ➤ When the museum is established then it would be a first-of-its-kind to be established in Tamil Nadu.
- The image of a fish imprinted on a ring well and the engraved coins found here strengthened the theory that the people who lived here had commercial transactions with other parts of the country, namely north India.

# **SC/ST Commission**



- > Tamil Nadu government appointed the members for SC/ST Commission.
- Chief Minister MK Stalin said that High Court Judge Sivakumar will be the Chairperson of the Commission.
- Punitha Pandian, Editor of 'Dalit Murasu' magazine will be Deputy Chairperson.
- > The commission will also have five more persons,
  - Advocate Kumaradevan,
  - Ezhil Ilangovan (a writer),
  - Leelavathi Dhanaraj (social activist involved in imparting education to tribal children),
  - Advocate Ilanchezhian and
  - Professor Raghupathi.
- > The period of the members of the SC/ST commission will be three years.
- > They will ensure that the legal rights of SCs and STs are protected.

**Covid -19 Vaccine & Relief measures** World Health Organization recommends first anti-malarial vaccine



- In a historic move, the World Health Organization (WHO) on Wednesday endorsed the first anti-malarial vaccine, as mankind enters a key turning point in a battle waged relentlessly over decades between man and mosquito, the vector.
- In a press conference that went live on social media, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said, "This is a historic moment. The longawaited malaria vaccine for children is a breakthrough for science, child health and malaria control... Using this vaccine on top of existing tools to prevent malaria could save tens of thousands of young lives each year."
- The WHO said on Wednesday that it was recommending the widespread use of the RTS,S/AS01 (RTS,S) malaria vaccine among children in sub-Saharan Africa and in other regions with moderate to high P. falciparum malaria transmission, based on results from an ongoing pilot programme in Ghana, Kenya and Malawi.
- The development comes at a time when the WHO and its partners have reported a stagnation in the progress against the disease that kills more than 2,60,000 African children under the age of five annually. Malaria remains a primary cause of childhood illness and death in sub-Saharan Africa, according to the WHO.
- "For centuries, malaria has stalked sub-Saharan Africa, causing immense personal suffering," said WHO Regional Director for Africa Dr. Matshidiso Moeti. "We have long hoped for an effective malaria vaccine and now for the first time ever, we have such a vaccine recommended for widespread use. Today's recommendation offers a glimmer of hope for the continent which shoulders the heaviest burden of the disease and we expect many more African children to be protected from malaria and grow into healthy adults."
- The vaccine does significantly reduce life-threatening severed malaria, Dr. Tedros said, but added that, "It's not the only tool. Vaccination against #malaria does not replace or reduce the need for other measures, including bed nets."
- RTS,S was first authorised in 2015 by the European Medicines Agency for use in Africa in infants and children.





#### Tuberculosis deaths up in pandemic: WHO




- The World Health Organisation (WHO) has released the 'Global TB report for 2021.
- ➢ It highlighted the effects of COVID-19 which led to a huge reversal in the progress of Tuberculosis (TB) elimination.
- > The report also mentioned India as the worst-hit country in TB elimination.
- A dramatic reduction of 20% TB cases was witnessed in 2020 as compared to 2019, i.e. A gap of 4.1 million cases.



# India crosses 100-crore COVID-19 vaccination doses milestone

**Dose progression** The chart shows the days taken for total COVID-19 vaccination doses in India to cross every 100 million dose mark:



- India completed 100 crore doses of COVID-19 vaccines, in about 9 months since the drive began.
- To mark the occasion, the Union Health Ministry held a series of events and released a two-minute and four-second video with rap and visual representation of the country's fight against COVID-19.
- India took 85 days to touch the 10-crore vaccination mark, 45 more days to cross the 20-crore mark and 29 more days to reach the 30-crore mark, according to the Union Health Ministry data.
- The country took 24 days to reach the 40-crore mark from 30-crore doses and then 20 more days to surpass the 50-crore vaccination mark on August 6. It then took 76 days to go past the 100-crore mark.
- The top five States which have administered the highest number of doses are Uttar Pradesh followed by Maharashtra, West Bengal, Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh.
- The countrywide vaccination drive was rolled out on January 16 with health care workers (HCWs) getting inoculated in the first phase. The vaccination of frontline workers (FLWs) started from February 2.
- The next phase of COVID-19 vaccination commenced from March 1 for people over 60 years of age and those aged 45 and above with specified co-morbid conditions. The country launched vaccination for all people aged over 45 years from April 1.
- The government then decided to expand its vaccination drive by allowing all above 18 to be vaccinated from May 1.

# Poll spending

The DMK and the Trinamool Congress (AITC), both winners of State elections in 2021, spent over 265 crore during their election campaigns, according to the reports submitted to the Election Commission of India (ECI). Among all parties, the AIADMK spent the highest share in spreading the party's propaganda (99.5%) and relied only on media and advertisements. The DMK and the AITC, on the other hand, split their expenses half-and-half between its candidates and party propaganda. Interestingly, the INC adopted a unique spending strategy for spreading the party's propaganda in each of the five elections. By **Jasmin Nihalani** 







## GI-tagged 'Mihidana' Batch From West Bengal Exported To Bahrain



- The first consignment of Geographical Indication (GI) tagged sweet dish Mihidana, from Bardhaman, West Bengal has been exported to the Kingdom of Bahrain.
- This initiative is part of the effort to promote indigenous & Geographical Identification (GI) tagged products of India globally. The product was exported by APEDA registered M/S DM Enterprises, Kolkata.
- West Bengal's Bardhaman got the GI tag for the Mihidana sweetmeats in 2017. A GI tag is a sign denoting a specific geographical origin and possesses qualities or a reputation that are due to that origin.



#### Maharashtra: Palghar's famed Wada Kolam rice gets GI tag



- A variety of rice widely grown in Wada in the Palghar district has been given a 'Geographical Indication' tag, which will give it a unique identity as well as wider markets.
- Wada Kolam, also known as Zini or Jhini rice, is a traditional variety grown in the Wada tehsil of Palghar, with the grain being off white in colour.

# After 68 years, Tatas win back Air India with ₹18,000-crore bid



- ➤ Tata Group, the progenitor of the Air India airline, reclaimed it, nearly 60 years after it was nationalised. Tata Sons bid ₹180 billion for the government's 100% stake in Air India.
- The government is seeking to sell 100 per cent of its stake in the state-owned national airline, including Air India's 100 per cent shareholding in AI Express Ltd and 50 per cent in Air India SATS Airport Services Private Ltd.

#### 51 products get GI tag; German beer among 12 entrants from Europe

- For 51 new products, Geographical Indications (GI) tags were issued by the Chennai registry.
- They included a German beer (Muncener Bier), Italian veined blue cheese (gorgonzola), a plant resin (Chios Mastiha) from Greece and a variety of seed cones (zatecky chmel) from Czech Republic.
- > Tamil Nadu has earned GI tags for five products.
- They are Kanyakumari clove, Thanjavur Netti works, Karuppur Kalamkari paintings and wood carvings of Arumbavur and Kallakurichi.

- India has been ranked at 40th position out of 43 countries in the 2021 Mercer CFS Global Pension Index survey.
- ▶ In 2020, India was ranked at 34th position out of 39 pension systems.
- Iceland has topped this ranking.
- It was followed by the Netherlands and Norway.
- India had an overall index value of 43.3.
- Thailand had the lowest overall index.

# India's position drops on Global Hunger Index 2021 to 101 from 94, WCD ministry says ranking unscientific

Alarming levels | The Global Hunger Index (GHI) tracks hunger and malnutrition across countries using four indicators - undernourishment, child wasting, child stunting and child mortality. Based on this, GHI determines hunger on a 100-point scale, where 0 is the best possible score (no hunger) and 100 is the worst. - It is prepared jointly by an Irish aid agency called 'Concern Worldwide' and a German organisation called 'Welthungerhilfe'.
- > The Index termed the hunger level in India is alarming.
- ▶ In the index, India has been placed in the 101st position out of 116 countries.
- ➤ In 2020, India's was positioned at 94th.
- India has improved with respect to indicators like under-5 mortality rate, the prevalence of undernourishment and prevalence of stunting among children.



#### India at 71st on Global Food Security index 2021 of 113 nations



- India has achieved the 71st position in the Global Food Security Index 2021 from among a list of 113 countries.
- This Index is designed and constructed by London-based Economist Impact and is sponsored by Corteva Agriscience.
- > The overall score of India is 57.2 points on the GFS Index 2021.
- Ireland, Australia, the UK, Finland, Switzerland, the Netherlands, Canada, Japan, France and the US shared the top rank.

- ▶ India received **184 votes** of the 193 votes cast in the election.



#### India among world's top 10 for climate tech investment



- India ranked 9th in the list of top 10 countries for climate technology investment from 2016 to 2021.
- This is in accordance with the report 'Five years on: Global climate tech investment trends since the Paris Agreement' by London & Partners, and Co.
- Indian climate tech firms received USD 1 billion in venture capital (VC) funding in this period.
- > The list has been topped by the United States which is followed by China.




# Nobel Prize in Physics 2021



- Syukuro Manabe, Klaus Hasselmann, Giorgio Parisi jointly won the 2021 Nobel Prize in Physics.
- This is for their ground breaking contributions to our understanding of complex physical systems.
- The Nobel Prize in Physics is awarded by the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences, Stockholm, Sweden.
- Syukuro Manabe (Princeton University, USA) and Klaus Hasselmann (Max Planck Institute for Meteorology, Hamburg, Germany) awarded for the physical modelling of Earth's climate, quantifying variability and reliably predicting global warming".
- Giorgio Parisi (Sapienza University of Rome, Italy) was awarded for the discovery of the interplay of disorder and fluctuations in physical systems from atomic to planetary scales.




#### Nobel Prize in Literature 2021

- The Nobel Prize in literature is awarded by the Swedish Academy, Stockholm, Sweden.


#### 2021 Nobel Peace Prize



- The Norwegian Nobel Committee has decided to award it to Maria Ressa and Dmitry Muratov.
- This is "for their efforts to safeguard freedom of expression, which is a precondition for democracy and lasting peace".
- Maria Ressa uses freedom of expression to expose abuse of power, use of violence and growing authoritarianism in the Philippines.
- Dmitry Muratov has for decades defended freedom of speech in Russia under increasingly challenging conditions.




Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences 2021



- The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences has decided to award the Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel.
- It's one half is to given David Card (University of California of USA) "for his empirical contributions to labour economics".
- The other half jointly to Joshua Angrist (Massachusetts Institute of Technology of USA) and Guido Imbens (Stanford University of USA) "for their methodological contributions to the analysis of causal relationships".
- In 1968, Sveriges Riksbank (Sweden's central bank) established the Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel, founder of the Nobel Prize.
- The first Prize in Economic Sciences was awarded to Ragnar Frisch and Jan Tinbergen in 1969.



#### The Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2021



- The Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2021 was awarded jointly to Benjamin List and David W.C. MacMillan "for the development of asymmetric organocatalysis." This has had a great impact on pharmaceutical research and has made chemistry greener.

## Philippine leader Duterte announces retirement from politics



- Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte says he is backing out of an announced plan to run for Vice President in next year's elections and will retire from politics after his term ends.
- Mr. Duterte announced the surprise decision on October 2 after accompanying his former longtime aide, Sen. Bong Go, who instead filed his own candidacy for the vice presidency at a Commission on Elections center.
- Philippine Presidents are limited by the constitution to a single six-year term and opponents had said they would question the legality of Mr. Duterte's announced vice presidential run before the Supreme Court.
- Mr. Duterte took office in 2016 and launched a crackdown on illegal drugs that left more than 6,000 mostly petty suspects dead and alarmed Western governments and human rights groups. The International Criminal Court is investigating the killings.



- Japan's former Foreign Minister, Fumio Kishida has won the ruling party's leadership election, virtually ensuring that he will become the country's next prime minister.
- ▶ Kishida won 257 votes in a runoff to defeat Taro Kono.
- > Fumio Kishida replaces outgoing party leader Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga.




TN Governor appointed chairman of Auroville Foundation Governing Board

- As a four-star Army general, he was chairman of the military's Joint Chiefs of Staff under President George H.W. Bush during the 1991 Gulf War in which U.S.-led forces expelled Iraqi troops from neighboring Kuwait.
- Mr. Powell, a moderate Republican and a pragmatist, later served as Secretary of State under President George W. Bush.

# GST collection in September crosses Rs 1.17 lakh crore

- Goods and service tax collections for September clocked Rs 1.17 lakh crore, making it the third consecutive month of revenues above Rs 1 lakh crore mark since June.
- The revenues for the month of September 2021 are 23% higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year.
- ➤ The average monthly gross GST collection for the second quarter of the current year has been Rs 1.15 lakh crore, which is 5% higher than the average monthly collection of Rs 1.10 lakh crore in the first quarter of the year.
- "This clearly indicates that the economy is recovering at a fast pace... It is expected that the positive trend in the revenues will continue and the second half of the year will post higher revenues," the **finance ministry** said in a statement.
- Coupled with economic growth, anti-evasion activities, especially action against fake billers have also been contributing to the enhanced GST collections, the ministry said.
- During the month, revenues from import of goods was 30% higher and the revenues from domestic transaction (including import of services) are 20% higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year.
- The revenue for September 2020 was, in itself at a growth of 4% over the revenue of September 2019 of Rs 91,916 crore.
- Of the gross collections, Central GST is Rs 20,578 crore, state GST is Rs 26,767 crore, integrated GST is Rs 60,911 crore (including Rs 29,555 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 8,754 crore (including Rs 623 crore collected on import of goods.
- Centre had also released GST compensation of Rs 22,000 crore to States to meet their GST revenue gap.

# **Centre Launches Web Portal to Find Solutions to India's Waste Problems**



- The government of India has launched a web portal called "Waste to Wealth" to enhance cooperation for sustainable development through economy and community participation.
- The web portal will bring together technology providers, government stakeholders and urban local bodies to find solutions to India's waste problems, mainly plastic waste.



# Paytm Group takes over complete ownership of CreditMate



- Online payment services provider, Paytm has acquired a 100% stake in Mumbai-based digital lending startup CreditMate.
- However, the transaction details of the deal have not been disclosed. The Paytm Group will now be the 100% beneficial owners of the business, while the co-founders of CreditMate will exit the business.

#### Government releases ₹40,000-crore GST dues to States



- ➤ The Centre released ₹40,000 crore to States and Union Territories on Thursday to help meet the shortfall in GST compensation cess collections, through backto-back borrowings from the market.
- ➤ The Finance Ministry said this was part of the ₹1.59 lakh crore shortfall estimated in the Compensation Fund for States, to be raised via market borrowings, but indicated that total GST compensation to be paid in 2021-22 may exceed States' actual dues for the year.
- An amount of ₹75,000 crore had already been transferred to States in July, leaving another ₹44,000 crore to be borrowed and disbursed over the rest of 2021-22.
- > The balance amount will be released in due course, the Ministry said.

#### 'Over and above'

➤ "This release is in addition to normal GST compensation being released every two months out of actual cess collection," the Ministry said, adding that more than ₹1 lakh crore was also estimated to be released to States during the financial year, based on GST cess collections.

# Write-off possibility

- "The sum total of ₹2.59 lakh crore is expected to exceed the amount of GST compensation accruing in FY 2021-22," it added, signalling that some of the pending dues from 2020-21 would be written off to that extent.
- "It is expected that this release will help the States/UTs in planning their public expenditure among other things, for improving, health infrastructure and taking up infrastructure projects," the Ministry said.



#### **RBI** maintains status quo on rates



The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) kept the repo rate unchanged in the fourth bi-monthly policy meet for the financial year 2021-22 headed by RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das has maintained the status quo. The meeting was held between October (6 to 8). The remaining will take place in December (6 to 8) and February (7 to 9, 2022).

- This report examines the level and composition of multidimensional poverty across 109 countries covering 5.9 billion people.

#### **Indian Scenario**

- The Scheduled Tribe group in India, which accounts for 9.4 per cent of the population, is the poorest.
- Out of 129 million people, 65 million are living in multidimensional poverty.
- Out of 283 million scheduled caste group people, 94 million are living in multidimensional poverty.



India's retail inflation eases to 4.35% in September: Govt data



- Retail inflation declined to 4.35 per cent in September, mainly due to lower food prices, according to government data released.
- The Consumer Price Index-based (CPI) inflation was at 5.30 per cent in August and at 7.27 per cent in September 2020.
- As per the data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO), the inflation in the food basket eased to 0.68 per cent in September 2021, significantly down from 3.11 per cent in the preceding month.

IMF Projects Indian Economy to grow at 9.5% in FY22



- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has estimated the Indian economy to grow by 9.5% in the current fiscal year, i.e 2021-22 (FY22) and 8.5% in FY23 (2022-23), in its latest World Economic Outlook report, released on October 12, 2021.
- Meanwhile, IMF expects the global gross domestic product (GDP) to grow by 5.9 per cent in 2021 and 4.9% in 2022.



**RBI** imposes Rs 1 crore penalty on State Bank of India



- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 1 crore on the country's largest lender, State Bank of India (SBI), for not complying with directions issued by the central bank with regard to fraud classification and reporting by commercial banks.
- "This action is based on the deficiencies in regulatory compliance and is not intended to pronounce upon the validity of any transaction or agreement entered into by the bank with its customers," the RBI said in a statement.
- Upon scrutinising a customer account maintained with SBI, the central bank found that the bank had delayed the reporting of fraud in the said account to RBI.
- The RBI issued a show-cause notice to the bank asking why a monetary penalty should not be levied on it for non-compliance and after considering the bank's reply on the charges leveled against it, RBI came to the conclusion that the charges were substantiated and warranted imposition of monetary penalty.
- The penalty has been imposed in the exercise of powers vested in RBI under the provisions of section 47A (1) (c) read with sections 46(4)(i) and 51(1) of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

### **RBI authorises KVB to collect direct taxes**



- The Reserve Bank of India has authorised Karur Vysya Bank (KVB) to collect direct taxes on behalf of the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT).
- After obtaining the approval, KVB has started the integration process with the CBDT to collect direct taxes.
- The integration would enable the bank to allow its customers to remit the direct taxes through any branch/net banking/ mobile banking services (DLite Mobile application).




### Russian team back on Earth after filming first movie in space


### China launches its first solar observation satellite

- It is launched by a Long March 2D rocket from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Centre in northern Shanxi province.
- > The 550-kg Xihe satellite will monitor the Sun for three years.



NITI Aayog Launches Geospatial Energy Map of India



- Geospatial Energy Map of India was launched by Dr Rajiv Kumar (Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog), Dr V K Saraswat (Member, NITI Aayog), and Shri Amitabh Kant (CEO, NITI Aayog) on 18 October 2021. Dr K Sivan, Chairman ISRO & Secretary Department of Space attended the launch event.
- NITI Aayog in collaboration with Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has developed a comprehensive Geographic Information System (GIS) Energy Map of India with the support of Energy Ministries of Government of India. The GIS map provides a holistic picture of all energy resources of the country which enables visualisation of energy installations such as conventional power plants, oil and gas wells, petroleum refineries, coal fields and coal blocks, district-wise data on renewable energy power plants and renewable energy resource potential, etc through 27 thematic layers.
- The map attempts to identify and locate all primary and secondary sources of energy and their transportation/transmission networks to provide a comprehensive view of energy production and distribution in a country. It is a unique effort aimed at integrating energy data scattered across multiple organizations and to present it in a consolidated, visually appealing graphical manner. It leverages latest advancements in web-GIS technology and opensource software to make it interactive and user friendly. The Geospatial Energy Map of India will be useful in planning and making investment decisions. It will also aid in disaster management using available energy assets.



Microsoft launches new initiative to empower AI startups in India



- Microsoft has launched a programme called "AI Innovate Programme".
- The programme was launched in its efforts of supporting the start-up ecosystem in India.
- The programme will support those start-ups that are leveraging artificial intelligence (AI).
- ➢ It is supported by TiE Mumbai.

# South Korea seeks space race entry with first homegrown rocket



- South Korea recently launched its first indigenously developed rocket, known as "Korean Satellite Launch Vehicle II" or "Nuri".
- The launch vehicle lifted off from the Naro Space Center, in Goheung, built on an island nearly 300 miles (500 kilometres) south of Seoul.
- Nuri rocket is 47.2 metres long and weighs 200 tons. The three-stage rocket is fitted with six liquid-fuelled engines. It has been built at an estimated cost of 2 trillion won (£1.23bn or \$1.6bn).



China successfully launches Shijian-21 satellite to test space debris



- China successfully launched a new satellite named Shijian-21.
- ➤ The satellite will be used to test and verify space debris mitigation technologies.
- This launch marked the 393rd mission for the Long March series carrier rockets.

# High-Speed Expendable Aerial Target ABHYAS successfully flight-tested by DRDO



- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully tested the high-speed expendable aerial target (HEAT) called ABHYAS.
- The ABHYAS high-speed expendable aerial target will be used to evaluate several missile systems.
- It was tested from Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the coast of Bay of Bengal in Odisha.
- ABHYAS has been designed and developed by the Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE) of DRDO, headquartered in Bengaluru.



### India successfully test-fires Agni-5 missile



- India has successfully test-fired a surface-to-surface ballistic missile called Agni-5.
- > The missile was launched from APJ Abdul Kalam Island off the Odisha coast.
- > The missile uses a three-stage solid-fuelled engine.
- It can strike targets up to the range of 5000-km with a very high degree of accuracy.
- The successful launch of the Agni-5 missile aligns with India's policy to have a "credible minimum deterrence".
- > This policy underpins the commitment of 'No First Use'.
- The Agni-5 missile has been built by the Defence Research Development Organisation.

### Facebook rebrands as Meta to emphasise 'metaverse' vision



- ➢ Facebook changes the parent company name.
- The parent company's name is being changed to "Meta" to represent a future beyond just its troubled social network.
- Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp will keep their names under the rebranding.



### Microsoft nearly overtakes Apple as most valuable company



- Microsoft Corp. has surpassed Apple Inc. to become the world's most valuable publicly-traded company by market capitalisation.
- At market close on October 29, 2021, Apple stood at about \$2.46 trillion while Microsoft reached nearly \$2.49 trillion.

# 7. NATIONAL NEWS

Activities which held up in India during October 2021

### Shri Tomar congratulates farmers and state governments for record food grain production of 296.65 million tonnes in 2019-2020 under unfavourable conditions imposed by Covid-19

- Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shri Narendra Singh Tomar has congratulated farmers and state governments for record food grain production of 296.65 million tonnes in 2019-20 under unfavourable conditions imposed by Covid-19. The pulses and oilseed production is expected to be at 23.15 and 33.42 million tonnes, respectively. Production of cotton is being estimated at 354.91 lakh bales with which India is set to rise to the first position in the world. This year has established a milestone in the history of Indian agriculture. Kharif sowing during this year up to 11-09-2020 has been 1113 lakh hectares which is 46 lakh hectares more than normal sowing area. This provides good opportunity for ensuring food and nutritional security of the country. Shri Tomar said that the farming community and State Governments deserve special appreciation for this commendable achievement.
- Addressing the National Conference for Rabi Campaign 2020 held today under his Chairmanship to review the progress of Kharif 2020-21 and plan for the Rabi season, Shri Tomar said that Government is taking revolutionary steps to strengthen agriculture infrastructure and economic condition of the farmers. Recently Agricultural Infrastructure Fund (AIF) scheme worth Rs 1 lakh crore for 4 years has been launched for creating facilities for cold storage, warehouse, packaging, ripening & waxing plants by agri-entrepreneurs, farmers' association and local government agencies. Tentative allocation to the states have made on the basis of total value of output of the state from agriculture and allied sectors. A 3% interest subvention will be given on bank interest, making loan with effective interest rate in the range of 5.0 to 5.5%. Formation of 10,000 Farmers Producer Organisations (FPOs) is another such step to organize farmers in aggregation and marketing for higher returns. These will be registered under company or cooperative act and 15% will be constituted in Aspirational and Notified Tribal Areas.
- The Union Agriculture Minister further elaborated that to improve agriculture sector, two bills relating to freedom of marketing to farmers have been passed in Parliament. The Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion & Facilitation) Bill 2020 and The Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill 2020 will give a boost to farmers engaged in agriculture and allied activities. Farmers will get freedom to sell their produce at different places. Government will continue the practice of procurement at minimum support price (MSP) through existing network. These measures will attract large private investment leading to rapid development in agriculture and strengthening of rural economy.



- Shri Tomar said that Government of India has set the target of covering 100 lakh hectares in five years under micro-irrigation. A dedicated Micro Irrigation Fund (MIF) of Rs. 5,000 crore has been created with National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) for expanding coverage of micro irrigation. In the year 2019-20, about 11 lakh farmers have benefitted by the adoption of drip and sprinkler irrigation system. During the last five years, an area of 47.92 lakh hectare has been covered under micro irrigation in the country which includes 11.72 lakh ha for the year 2019-20 which is a significant achievement.
- India has three major growing seasons; kharif, rabi and summer, for cultivating large number of cereal, pulse, oilseed and cash crops. Rabi is important cropping season contributing to more than half of crop productions. National conferences are held before every season to take stock of the preparedness and ensure timely availability of seed, fertilizers and other inputs. This time good rainfall has occurred and water reservoirs are full which offers good opportunity.
- The conference set a target of 301 million tonnes of food grains production for 2020-21 which includes 119.60, 108.00, 5.00, 9.57, 29.00 and 47.80 million tonnes of rice, wheat, Jowar, bajra, maize and coarse cereals, respectively. More emphasis will be laid on production of pulses and oilseeds and targets have been set at 25.60 million tonnes for pulses and 37.00 million tonnes for oilseeds. To reduce import of edible oils, great emphasis is being laid on production of oilseeds and oil palm plantation indigenously. This Rabi Focus is on Mustard under oilseeds and the target for production of mustard alone has been raised from 92 to 125 lakh tonnes.
- Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare and Panchyati Raj, Shri Parshottam Rupala and Union Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Shri Kailash Choudhary also graced the occasion. The conference was also attended by Secretary, Department of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers' Welfare, Secretary, Department of Agriculture Research and Education and Director General, ICAR and Secretary, Fertilizers and other senior officials of various central ministries and state governments.



Cabinet clears Rs. 4,445-cr. textile parks



- Plan entails establishing 7 Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Parks over a 5-year period
- The Union Cabinet approved the setting up of seven Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel (PM MITRA) Parks at an outlay of Rs. 4,445 crore.
- The mega parks scheme will include brownfield and greenfield projects, spread over five years, said Textiles Minister Piyush Goyal.
- The parks would be developed by a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) owned by the Central and State governments and would get two kinds of support. Development Capital Support, aimed at helping develop infrastructure, would fund 30% of the project cost with a cap of Rs. 500 crore for greenfield projects and Rs. 200 crore for brownfield projects. A separate Competitiveness Incentive Support would be limited to Rs. 300 crore per park.

### 'TN, Gujarat interested'

- As many as 10 States including Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Gujarat had already shown interest, Textiles Secretary Upendra Prasad Singh told The Hindu. States offering the cheapest land (contiguous and encumbrance-free land of minimum 1,000 acres) and facilities such as adequate electricity and water would be selected through a transparent challenge route.
- The SPV would select a Master Developer to set up and maintain the park for a specified period. Of the park's area, 50% would be earmarked for manufacturing activity, 20% for utilities, and 10% set aside for commercial development.
- The parks are expected to generate 7 lakh direct jobs and provide indirect jobs to almost 14 lakh people.
- Mr. Singh said industries in the parks would comprise four categories units investing Rs. 300 crore or more, units investing Rs. 100-300 crore, investors of less than Rs. 100 crore and tenant units.



8 Judges Elevated As Chief Justices of High Courts



The Government notified the appointments of eight and transfer of five chief justices of high courts. Eight High Courts will get new Chief Justices, and five Chief Justices have been transferred. The clearance in the 13 High Courts was considered crucial as some of them have been making do with Acting Chief Justices.

### Five Chief Justices have been transferred:

- The government cleared the transfer of Tripura High Court Chief Justice A.A. Kureshi to the Rajasthan High Court.
- Justice Indrajit Mahanty, Chief Justice of the Rajasthan High Court, would take over as Tripura Chief Justice.
- Chief Justice Mohammad Rafiq of Madhya Pradesh has been appointed as the Chief Justice of the Himachal Pradesh High Court.
- Chief Justice Biswanath Somadder of the Meghalaya High Court has been transferred as the Chief Justice of the Sikkim High Court.
- Justice A.K. Goswami has been appointed as the Chief Justice of the Chhattisgarh High Court. He is presently the Chief Justice of Andhra Pradesh High Court.

- Justice Rajesh Bindal, Acting Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court, was appointed as the Chief Justice of the Allahabad High Court.

- It is located in the northern part of the state, bordering Madhya Pradesh & Jharkhand. This is the 4th Tiger Reserve in Chhattisgarh (Udanti-Sitanadi, Achanakmar, Indravati).

- The Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, inaugurated "Azadi@75 New Urban India: Transforming Urban Landscape conference-cum-expo".
- The Foundation stone for 75 Urban Development Projects in Uttar Pradesh under AMRUT Mission and Smart Cities Mission was laid.
- > 75 smart electric buses were flagged off under FAME-II for seven cities.
- The cities are Lucknow, Varanasi, Kanpur, Prayagraj, Gorakhpur, Ghaziabad and Jhansi.


- As part of the corporatisation of the Ordnance, the Government of India formally launched seven new defence firms on October 15.

- The aim of the exercise is to enhance interoperability and sharing best practices in counter-insurgency and counter-terrorism operations between Armies of both countries and further strengthen the relationship between both the South Asian Nations.

## Army's Sikh Light Infantry signs affiliation with IAF's 17 Squadron in Ambala



- The historic affiliation of 17 Squadron of the Indian Air Force (IAF) with the Sikh Light Infantry Regiment (SLIR) of Indian Army was formally signed at a ceremony at Ambala Cantonment.
- Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Manoj Mukund Naravane, who is also the Colonel of the SLIR, signed the charter of affiliation with Air Cmde Tarun Chaudhry, Commodore Commandant, 17 Squadron.
- The affiliation of SLIR with Rafale's 17 Squadron of the Western Air Command will assist them in development of mutual understanding of joint ethos, capability, limitations and core competencies of the other service through common understanding of military tactical doctrines and concepts in the contemporary conflict environment.
- General Naravane said this enhanced synergy and understanding of each other's strength will act as "Force Multiplier within our armed forces".



India joins Seychelles' Tax Inspectors Without Borders programme



- The Tax Inspectors Without Borders (TIWB) has launched its programme in Seychelles. India has been chosen as the Partner Administration for this programme. The country will be providing its Tax Expert in support of the initiative.
- The focus of the 12-month programme will be on Transfer Pricing cases of tourism and financial services sectors.
- TIWB is a joint initiative of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), since its launch in 2015.
- > The aim of the initiative is to aid countries in strengthening their tax administration by transferring technical know-how and skills to the tax auditors through sharing of best audit practices.

### China launches biodiversity fund



- China pledged to inject \$233 million into a new fund called the "Kunming Biodiversity Fund" recently.
- > It is for the protection of biodiversity in developing countries.
- This decision was taken during a key UN conservation summit, even though major donors disagreed on it.
- China pledged as it is the world's biggest polluter and seeks to play a prominent role internationally in biodiversity conservation.
- > This summit seeks to establish a new accord, setting targets for 2030 and 2050.



### Germany unveils world's first automated, driverless train



- Germany launches the first automated & driverless train.
- ➢ It is being dubbed as "world-first".
- > This project is being developed by 'Siemens and Deutsche Bahn'.
- > The self-driving train was launched in the city of Hamburg.

### Indian and U.S armies commence Exercise Yudh Abhyas 2021



- India and the United States are set to start a 15-day mega military exercise in Alaska of the USA.
- > The year 2021 will mark the 17th edition of the exercise "Yudh Abhyas".
- > This Exercise will be conducted at Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson in Alaska.
- This exercise is to further deepen bilateral military cooperation between both countries.



Sri Lanka seeks \$500 million loan from India for fuel purchases amid forex crisis



- The Government of Sri Lanka has sought a USD 500 million credit line from India to pay for its crude oil purchases, as the country is facing a severe foreign exchange crisis in the island nation after the pandemic hit the nation's earnings from tourism and remittances.
- The USD 500 million credit line is part of the India-Sri Lanka economic partnership arrangement. The facility would be used for purchasing petrol and diesel requirements.

# South Korea Completes Construction of World's Largest Hydrogen Fuel Cell Power Plant



- South Korea announced the completion ceremony of the 'Shinincheon Bitdream Fuel Cell Power Plant'.
- The power plant has a total capacity of 78 MW constructed in four stages since 2017 by using fuel cells supplied by POSCO Energy and Doosan Fuel Cell.
- > It is the world's largest fuel cell power plant currently in operation.
- Unlike other power generators, hydrogen fuel cell emits very little nitrogen oxides (NOX) and sulfur oxides (SOX) as it does not produce electricity through high-temperature combustion.

# Largest khadi national flag unfurled in Ladakh



- The world's largest national flag, made up of Khadi cloth, has been installed in Leh, Ladakh, on the occasion of the 152nd birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi on October 2, 2021.

# Mamata Wins by Record 58,832 Votes, Betters 2011 Performance



- Facing a litmus test in Bhabanipur, a Kolkata seat from where she contested to continue as the chief minister of West Bengal, Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee on Sunday registered a thumping victory by a record margin of 58,389 votes.
- As per the official Election Commission data, after 21 rounds of counting, Mamata secured 84,709 votes against BJP's Priyanka Tibrewal who managed to scrape 24,296 votes. CPI(M)'s Srijib Biswas remained a distant third with just 4,201 votes. Banerjee bettered her 2011 performance from the bastion.
- While inching closer to victory, Banerjee greeted her supporters outside her Kolkata residence. Meanwhile, TMC workers were seen celebrating outside the chief minister's house.



- Meanwhile, the TMC was was also leading in Murshidabad's Samserganj and Jangipur constituencies, where votes are being counted for the assembly elections.
- In Samserganj, TMC candidate Amirul Islam was leading by 3,768 votes after the fifth round of counting. He secured 19,751 votes, while his nearest rival, Zaidur Rahaman of the Congress, got 15,983. Jangipur's TMC nominee Jakir Hossain was leading by 15,643 votes after the second round of counting. Hossain secured 25,572 votes, and his nearest rival, BJP's Sujit Das, got 9,929.

Andhra government launched 'Swechha' programme

- It was inaugurated at the Regional Forensic Science Laboratory in Nagpur, Maharashtra.
- At present, there are 2 Wildlife DNA testing laboratories at Dehradun & Hyderabad.
- These are fully owned by the Central Government.
- > The newly launched is the 1st in India to be owned by a state government.
- Maharashtra became the first state in India to release its own Wildlife Action plan (2021-30).
- > The new plan will be implemented over the next 10 years.
- It recognises concerns about climate change impacts on wildlife, coastal ecosystems, marine biodiversity, flora and fauna.
