# Kalaignar Urban Development Scheme

In order to fill the gap in infrastructure in the Tamil Nadu Government, Municipalities and Municipalities, 138 Municipalities 490 Nagar panchayat and 6 Municipal Corporations newly formed into Municipal Corporations with a view to construction and reconstruction of infrastructure facilities. Annually launched the "Kalaignar Urban Development Scheme" with an allocation of Rs. 1000 crores. Basic infrastructure requirements are identified in each urban local government system, Drinking water facility, Street lighting facility, Improvement of roads, Establishment of intellectual center for community development, Developing markets, Works such as upgradation of bus stands are being implemented

#### **Municipalities**

- ➤ In the financial year 2021-2022 Rs. 558.88 crores, 586 works have been taken up, 365 works have been completed and other works are in various stages of progress.
- ➤ In the financial year 2022-2023, 453 works have been taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.582.19 crore, 17 works have been completed and other works are in various stages of progress.

#### **Municipalities**

- ➤ In the financial year 2021-22 Rs. 473.42 crores, 800 works have been taken up, 700 works have been completed and remaining works are under completion.
- ➤ In the financial year 2022-23 including Amrut's share amount, 291 works have been taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.466.19 crore and are in various stages of progress.



## Namakku Naame Scheme (Urban)

The Government of Tamil Nadu has introduced the Namakku Naame scheme in urban areas from 2021 with an aim to increase public participation in building and maintaining community infrastructure.

Under this scheme, rehabilitation of water bodies in urban local bodies, establishment, development and maintenance of parks, playgrounds, installation of street lights, installation of surveillance cameras, construction and renovation of schools, colleges, hospitals, urban primary health centers, shopping malls and new buildings for public use, public libraries and Infrastructural works such as setting up of intellectual centres, new gas crematoriums, rainwater drains, roads, public and community toilets, and markets are being undertaken. At present, provision has also been made at this place for procurement of vehicles used for solid waste management.

## **Urban Employment Scheme**

In order to raise the livelihood of the urban poor, the Urban Employment Program is being implemented in two zones in the Metropolitan Chennai Corporation, one zone each in the other 14 Municipal Corporations, one municipality each in the 7 Municipal Administrative Zones in 7 municipalities, and one municipality in each of the 37 districts in 37 municipalities. So far 2,04,860 people have been issued employment identity cards. Rs.75.00 crore has been received for the financial year 2021-2022.

- ➤ Metropolitan Chennai Corporation 31 works have been taken up at an estimate of Rs.2.14 crores, 16 works have been completed and remaining works are in progress.
- ➤ Other Corporations and Municipalities 208 works have been taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.28.72 crores, 76 works have been completed and remaining works are in progress.
- Municipalities 192 works have been taken up with an estimate of Rs.27.74 crores, 72 works have been completed and remaining works are in progress.
- ➤ Following the allocation of Rs.25.00 crore for the financial year 2022-2023, it is planned to be implemented in all urban local bodies.
- An evaluation study has been carried out by the State Development Policy Committee and an interim report has been received to find out the bottlenecks in the urban employment scheme being implemented on a preliminary basis. The report recommended that the scheme should be extended to all urban local bodies



## Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) 2.0

The Swachh Bharat Mission aims to make all cities free from open defecation, ensure solid waste or sewage treatment management and ensure maximum use of treated water, making all cities clean and litter-free. 100% scientific treatment of solid waste, on-site sorting of solid waste, effective management of construction and demolition waste, flexible waste management and reclamation of all stagnant solid waste dumping sites, information, education, communication, awareness creation, capacity building.

City Sanitation Action Plan and City Solid Waste Management Action Plan in local bodies are prepared and approved by the State High Level Committee.



### Amrut -2.0

Atal Urban Renewal and Urban Transformation Plan 2.0 was launched by the Union Government on 01.10.2021. All the urban local bodies including 21 Municipal Corporations, 138 Municipalities and 490 Boroughs in Tamil Nadu will be benefited under the Amrut 2.0 scheme.

The main objective of Amrut 2.0 is to ensure 100% complete water source security in urban areas and provide functional domestic drinking water supply to all households. The objective is water resource protection. Rehabilitation of water bodies and wells, recycling/reuse of treated water and rainwater harvesting will be done with public participation.

Key components of Amrut 2.0 are (1) provision of potable water for all, (2) sewage, sewage management, recycling/reuse of used water, restoration of water bodies (including urban wetlands) and creation of green spaces.

#### **Municipalities and Corporations**

- ➤ 154 works have been taken up in the financial year 2021-2022 at an estimated cost of Rs.2,854.70 crore and are in progress at various stages.
- ➤ 585 works have been taken up in the financial year 2022-2023 at an estimated cost of Rs.6,404.18 crore and are in various stages of progress.



#### **Amrut**

The project aims at atal regeneration and urban transformation. Drinking Water Supply, Waste Water and Sludge Waste Management. Ensuring the establishment of infrastructure such as storm water drainage, non-motorized vehicular traffic, parks and green areas. Under this scheme, cities with a population of more than one lakh, cities of religious and tourist importance have been taken up. The scheme is being implemented in a total of 28 cities in Tamil Nadu, including 26 cities with a population of over one lakh and 2 cities of religious and tourism importance.

Under this scheme 27 Corporations / Municipalities / Boroughs (excluding Metropolitan Chennai Corporation) have so far spent Rs. 11,441.41 crores, 445 works have been taken up and 423 works have been completed. Remaining 22 works are in various stages of progress.



## **Smart Cities Mission**

The Smart Cities Mission is an infrastructure for a higher quality of life for the people. It has been running since 2015 with the objective of providing clean and sustainable sustainable environment and sustainable solutions. In Tamil Nadu, 11 Municipal Corporations namely Chennai, Coimbatore, Madurai, Salem, Thanjavur, Vellore, Thoothukudi, Tirunelveli, Tirupur, Tiruchirappalli and Erode are implementing the Smart Cities Mission

#### **Allocation of Funds:**

- ➤ Under this scheme each of the 11 Municipal Corporations including Metropolitan Chennai Corporation will get Rs. 684 works worth Rs.10,797.89 crore have been taken up and 509 works have been completed on the basis of Rs.1000 crore allocation. Remaining works are in various stages of progress.
- ➤ The Smart Cities Mission period has now been extended till June 2023.
