**1. TAMIL NADU NEWS** 

Activities which held up in Tamil Nadu during December 2021

#### Tamil is compulsory, the qualifying norm for govt services: TN



- All state government held competitive exams would from now on have a compulsory paper in the Tamil language and a pass in the subject is the basic qualifying norm for entry to Tamil Nadu government services and state-run public sector enterprises, the government announced.
- A paper on Tamil language, conforming to Class 10 standards is compulsory in all such exams and a score of 40 per cent is the minimum qualifying mark, according to a Government Order dated 1 December 2021.
- If an aspirant does not get through in the qualifying Tamil language paper, other subject papers, that are part of the overall exam scheme, would not be taken up for evaluation, the order said.
- While Tamil language paper would be compulsory, a pass in it is the basic qualifying norm for entry to government and PSU services and this rule is applicable to all state government recruiting agencies including the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission.
- As regards the TNPSC, the norm takes immediate effect, the government said. Other state recruitment agencies including the Teachers Recruitment Board, Medical Services Recruitment Board, TN Uniformed Services Recruitment Board and TN Forest Uniformed Services Recruitment Committee would release similar guidelines.



#### Bharathiar memorial award for six researchers



- > CM gives prizes to winners of Thirukkural recital competition
- Chief Minister M.K. Stalin handed over Bharathi Memorial Centenary Award to Tamil researchers Seeni Viswanathan and Ya. Manikandan, who undertook research on the life and works of Tamil poet Subramania Bharathi. The award includes a cheque for ₹3 lakh.
- ➤ Mr. Stalin gave away the award along with cash prize to family members of senior Tamil scholars Periyasaamy Thooran, R.A. Padmanabhan, T.M.C. Ragunathan and Ilasai Manian, an official release said. The Chief Minister also handed over a cheque for ₹25 lakh to Navi Mumbai Tamil Sangam to its representative Krishnamurthy as contribution from the State government.
- ➤ The Chief Minister handed over a cash prize of ₹10,000 to students from Chennai and Kancheepuram districts for reciting all 1,330 couplets of *Thirukkural*. Of the 219 prize-winning students, only nine from these two districts were invited to receive the prize in person from the Chief Minister in view of the COVID-19 situation, the release said.
- Industries Minister Thangam Thennarasu, Chief Secretary V. Irai Anbu, Secretary of Tamil Development Department Mahesan Kasirajan, Director of Information and Public Relations V.P. Jayaseelan and Director (in-charge) of Tamil Development S. Saravanan were present.



#### Two universities in State get new Vice-Chancellors



- Thiruvalluvan is presently working as professor, Centre for Advanced Studies in Linguistics, Annamalai University, Chidambaram.
- Tamil Nadu Governor RN Ravi appointed Dr. V Thiruvalluvan as Vice-Chancellor (V-C) of the Tamil University, Thanjavur, and Dr. M Sundar as V-C of Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University, Chennai, for a period of three years.
- Sundar presently works as Principal, College of Physical Education, Alagappa University, Karaikudi. He has teaching experience of 26 years and has served as a professor for 11 years. He received the Excellence in Sports Department-My Stamp Award from Indian Postal Department in 2019 and the Mahatma Gandhiji Award from Indian Cultural Development Organisation in 2009.
- Thiruvalluvan is presently working as a professor at the Centre for Advanced Studies in Linguistics, Annamalai University, Chidambaram. He has a teaching experience of 28 years. He has published five research papers and presented four research papers in international academic/research events and organised five international academic or research events.



#### Groundwater law may cover commercial users

- The proposed law on groundwater development and management, being finetuned by the State Government, essentially seeks to cover every commercial user of groundwater in the State.
- Commercial, industrial, infrastructural and bulk users, withdrawing groundwater of two lakh litres a day, will be mandated to recycle water. The installation of sewage treatment plants will be mandatory for all residential apartments where groundwater requirement is more than 20 cubic meter a day or 20,000 litres a day.

#### Tamil Nadu launches emergency care scheme



- Chief Minister MK Stalin inaugurated Innuyir Kaapoom-Nammai Kaakkum 48 scheme.
- The scheme ensures the government pays for the medical bills of all accident victims in enlisted hospitals for treatment within 48 hours of the accident.
- > All medical care services will be covered under the scheme.
- > People can avail of benefits in 609 hospitals across the State.
- > They include 204 government hospitals and 405 private hospitals.
- Those who are not eligible for the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme (CMCHIS) will also be covered under the scheme.
- The free treatment will be provided in collaboration with the Department of Highways and Department of Transport.



- 12 out of 15 of them are either full or close to full, thanks to a bountiful monsoon
- As many as 12 out of 15 irrigation reservoirs in Tamil Nadu are better placed than last year, thanks to the bountiful northeast monsoon.
- Among them are the Mettur and Bhavanisagar, both belonging to the Cauvery basin, and the State's two top reservoirs in terms of storage. While the former is full with a storage of 93.47 thousand million cubic feet (tmcft), the latter is almost full with 32.06 tmcft.



### Hero stone unearthed in Villupuram district



- Analysis indicates artefact is likely from the 4th to 5th Century CE: ASI archaeologist
- A team from the Chennai Circle of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has unearthed a hero stone, likely to be from the 4th to 5th Century CE, at V. Nerkunam village in Vikravandi taluk, Villupuram district.

#### CM Stalin declares 'Tamil Thaai Vazhthu' as state song



- The Tamil Nadu Government declared the Tamil Thai Vaazhthu as the State song of Tamil Nadu.
- Everyone except the differently-abled should rise when the song is sung at educational institutions, government offices, and public functions.
- The decision comes in the wake of the Madras High Court recently ruling that 'Tamil Thai Vaazhthu' is a prayer song and not an anthem.
- Government Order to this effect has been issued, mandating that all barring the differently-abled persons should remain standing when the 55-second long song is sung.



#### A 22-km channel in Villupuram comes alive after 45 years



- Residents of Villupuram and three villages restored the waterway that supplied to eight tanks
- A 22-km water channel has come to life, after 45 years, thanks to the residents of Villupuram and three villages.
- Originating at the zero point of the Thenpennaiar at Thelimedu, the Villupuram channel meandered its way to eight waterbodies that helped to recharge the groundwater table and meet the drinking water requirements of Villupuram town. The waterbodies are Villupuram Periya Eri, Puthu Eri, Sitheri, Virattikuppam Eri, Maruthur Eri, Ayyankovilpattu Eri, Vazhuthureddi Eri and Thattampalayam Eri.
- But the channel lost its glory with waste dumping, encroachments on account of farming activities and the closure of a part of the channel after the Villupuram-Chennai national highway was four-laned in 2003. Instead of building a culvert, the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) closed the channel near the west end of Villupuram, thus stopping the flow from the Thenpennaiar to Periya Eri. Then, debris and silt filled the channel.
- Since 2015, the town had gone through a severe water scarcity. Lack of maintenance of the channels meant the eight waterbodies remained dry, while the other waterbodies in the district brimmed. This was when a group of residents from Villupuram and from Nannadu, Viratikuppam and Alathur stepped in. "We found that the Villupuram channel had once flowed 22 km and recharged eight large waterbodies spread over 900 acres.
- "A WhatsApp group of youths from Villupuram and the three villages was formed. This group decided to desilt the channel and the inlets to streamline the flow to the eight tanks. In 2018, the residents volunteered to do manual work, while others contributed money for the first phase of restoration," he says.
- "The locals cleared the waste, strengthened the embankments and carried out other works to increase storage. Though the channel received around 20% of the flow from the Thenpennaiar. Yet, the youths continued their efforts and



restored the channel to a distance of 16 km in 2019. Their dream became a reality, and the channel got a copious flow from the Thenpennaiar, reaching 65% of its carrying capacity.

- "The Water Resources Department joined the efforts and sanctioned ₹35 lakh
   under the 'kudimaramathu' scheme in 2020".
- Subsequently, the villagers and the residents of Villupuram found that the channel had to be restored to another 6 km from Nannadu to Villupuram town and approached the district administration for help. Collector D. Mohan inspected the channel and promised them funds. However, the villagers raised ₹8.54 lakh through crowdfunding and restored the final portion of the channel.
- The channel is back on the district's water map. The efforts of the villagers have helped to drive up the groundwater table, and irrigated 250 acres of farmland around the eight waterbodies.

### New amenities inaugurated at Gangaikondacholapuram temple



- Visitors to the famous Sri Brihadisvara Temple at Gangaikondacholapuram in Ariyalur district can have access to better amenities as the Archaeological Survey of India inaugurated a few new facilities at the temple complex.
- A publication counter, cafeteria, a reverse osmosis water treatment unit, a toilet complex and a camp office were inaugurated at the temple. The facilities have been established at a cost of ₹2.01 crore.
- Separate toilets for men and women have been built as part of the project, meeting a felt need. The ASI's and other publications would be available at the publication counter. An approach pathway and lawn have also been developed in between the buildings, which have been designed in line with the heritage ambience of the temple.
- Built by King Rajendra Chola-I, the Gangaikondacholisvarar Temple is a major tourist attraction in this region. Following the conquest of the Gangetic plains in 1023 CE, Rajendra–I built the city of Gangaikondacholapauram, a Siva temple and a lake Chola Gangam in commemoration of his victory. The gigantic stone temple, which is a repository of beautiful sculptures, is now a UNESCO World Heritage Monument and is maintained by ASI.



Tamil Nadu CM launched 'Meendum Manjappai' scheme



- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin has launched the 'Meendum Manjappai' scheme to promote the use of cloth bags by the public and discourage the use of plastic bags.
- This awareness campaign on using 'yellow' cloth bag or 'manjapai' as it is called in Tamil, is aimed at encouraging the people to return to the use of this eco-friendly bag and discard the plastic bags.
- The state government had enforced a ban on the production, use, storage, distribution, transportation or sale of 14 types of plastics with effect from January 1, 2019.

## Kazhuveli Wetland declared as 16th Bird Sanctuary of Tamil Nadu



- The Kazhuveli wetland situated in Villupuram district of Tamil Nadu has been declared as the 16th Bird Sanctuary by Surpiya Sahu, Environment and Forest Secretary, at the Minister of Environment Forest and Climate Change.
- The declaration was made under subsection (1) of section 18 of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. The Kazhuveli wetlands is referred to as the 2nd largest Brackish Water Lake in South India, only after Pulicat lake.



#### New rose variety named after M.S. Swaminathan



The M.S. Swaminathan Rose and the Jewel of Monkompu

- M.S. Viraraghavan, a leading horticulturist in the country based in Kodaikanal, has bred the variety
- A new rose variety has been named after the eminent agriculture scientist M.S. Swaminathan.
- M.S. Viraraghavan, a leading horticulturist in the country based in Kodaikanal, has bred a new rose variety and named it "The M.S. Swaminanthan Rose". This rose wearing a magenta purple is highly disease resistant, according to a release from the M.S. Swaminathan Research Foundation, Chennai.
- This variety of rose plant, which results from a series of crosses between "news" variety of rose and other purple roses, grows up to a height of 4 to 5 feet with a dark green granular surface, large leaves with regular thorns.
- "Professor Swaminathan pioneered in bringing new approaches to the breeding of food crops which increased production and made India food selfsufficient," the release said.

### Jewel of Monkompu

- Another new variety of rose has been named "Jewel of Monkompu", which was bred by KSG Son, a nursery based in Bengaluru, and it is a sparkling pinkish floribunda rose.
- "Floribunda rose is a hybrid of polyantha and tea roses. They bloom freely with excellent shape and colour and the shrubs are hardy. The shrub of flower grows vigorously with glossy leaves and is thornless," the release said.
- These two varieties were handed over by Narendra Dadlani, floriculture scientist and former director, horticulture, Government of India, New Delhi, to Mr. Swaminathan in Chennai. Mr. Dadlani also presented a copy of his book *Indian Rose* to the agriculture scientist.

### **Covid -19 Vaccine & Relief measures**

Covid-19: Govt approves emergency use of Corbevax and Covovax vaccines and anti-viral pill Molnupiravir



- The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has approved Corbevax and Covovax Covid vaccines and anti-viral drug Molnupiravir for restricted use on adults in emergency situations.
- CORBEVAX vaccine is India's 1st indigenously developed RBD protein subunit vaccine.
- ▶ It is made by Hyderabad-based firm Biological-E.
- The Nanoparticle Vaccine, COVOVAX, will be manufactured by Pune-based firm Serum Institute of India.
- Molnupiravir, an antiviral drug, will now be manufactured in the country by 13 companies for restricted use under emergency situation for adults.



## How States fare in wages for rural workers


The wages of rural workers engaged in construction, agriculture, and non-agriculture (those who are not cultivators or agricultural labourers) have risen considerably in nominal terms over the last five years. However, there are stark differences across the States. In Kerala, for instance, workers receive the highest wages, more than twice of India's average, followed by J&K and Tamil Nadu. In States which have the highest Gross Value Added (rupee value of goods and services produced in the economy after deducting the cost of inputs and raw materials), the wages are among the lowest. 

WORKERS | The chart plots State-wise wages earned by a rural construction worker against the GVA by the construction sector.








## Anaemia among children on the rise

The progress made in reducing the prevalence of anaemia among children between 2005 and 2015 has been derailed as a higher proportion of children aged 6-59 months have been found to be anaemic in India, according to the National Family Health Survey-5 (2019-21) compared to NFHS-4 (2015-16). In 30 out of the 36 States/UTs, over half the children in the age group were found to be anaemic in 2019-20. More worryingly, the proportion of anaemic children increased in 29 States/ UTs in NFHS-5 compared to NFHS-4. A relatively higher share of children were found to be anaemic in several northern and western States in rural and urban areas. By Sumant Sen




#### State-wise prevalence

# Omicron: Spreads fast, less severe

While the Delta variant of COVID-19 is still the dominant strain globally, the recently discovered Omicron variant threatens to pose more significant problems. A comparison of infection rates in South Africa's Gauteng province, considered the epicentre of the new strain, shows that the Omicron variant spreads faster than the Delta and Beta variants. However, initial data from the province also indicate that the Omicron variant does not cause more severe disease. The number of hospital admissions and ICU patients with this variant of COVID-19 was lower compared to that of the Delta wave. However, these are still early days. By Vignesh Radhakrishnan

The number of infections in the Gauteng province jumped from 150 to 11,500 in just over 20 days after the Omicron variant was discovered Period has crossed just the 1,500-mark, relatively slower than the pace observed during the Delta wave

The number of ICU admissions in the same period too has gone up from 50 to around 150, much lower than the initial days of the Delta wave










#### AREA DOMINANCE



## States' performance on health indicators


Kerala emerged as the best-performing State on health parameters for the fourth consecutive year, according to NITI Aayog's Health Index for 2019-20. The annual health index, compiled by the government think tank, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, and the World Bank, tracks a State/UT's progress on health outcomes. It is computed using indicators such as maternal mortality ratio, neonatal and under-five mortality rate, institutional deliveries, and birth and death registrations. Among the major States, Kerala was followed by Tamil Nadu and Telangana in the rankings. Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh were the three lowest-ranked States. By **The Hindu Data Team**

The Arctic region is warming significantly faster than the rest of the world, according to the recently released Arctic Report Card 2021. Several indicators, such as the volume and extent of sea ice and the surface air temperature, depict how the region has been heating up for quite some time now. The Arctic region, which is characterised by frozen landscapes, has recorded a significant sea ice loss in the past year. According to the report, all of this is a consequence of rising temperatures over the region


#### 3. Greenland ice sheet





#### GST collections surge in November 2021



- Gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue collections in November (for sales in October) rose 25.3 per cent year-on-year to Rs 1,31,526 crore. This is the second highest revenue collection under GST ever since its rollout in July 2017, and has two specific triggers: a pickup in economic activity alongside multiple compliance measures and increased surveillance undertaken by the tax authorities. These compliance measures include auto-population of returns, blocking of e-way bills and passing of input tax credit for non-filers taken by tax authorities for curbing evasion. GST collections at Rs 1,41,384 crore in April this year, accounting for year-end sales, are the highest level so far in the indirect tax regime.
- Gross GST revenue collected in November is Rs 1,31,526 crore, out of which CGST – the tax levied on intra state supplies of both goods and services by the Central Government – is Rs 23,978 crore, SGST – the tax levied on intra state supplies of both goods and services by the states – is Rs 31,127 crore, IGST – tax levied on all inter-state supplies of goods and services – is Rs 66,815 crore (including Rs 32,165 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 9,606 crore (including Rs 653 crore collected on import of goods).
- The government has settled Rs 27,273 crore to CGST and Rs 22,655 crore to SGST from IGST as regular settlement. The total revenue of Centre and the states after regular settlements in the month of November 2021 is Rs 51,251 crore for CGST and Rs 53,782 crore for the SGST. Centre has also released Rs 17,000 crore to States/UTs towards GST compensation on November 3.
- For GST revenues collected in the respective regions, states such as Maharashtra posted a 24 per cent growth in GST revenues in November, Karnataka posted 31 per cent growth, Gujarat posted 26 per cent growth and Tamil Nadu posted 10 per cent growth.

- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has brought non-banking finance companies (NBFCs) under the ambit of prompt corrective action (PCA) framework.
- Under the PCA framework, NBFCs will face restrictions when parameters such as capital adequacy ratio, non-performing assets, and Tier 1 capital will fall below the stipulated levels.
- > The Banks are already covered under the framework.
- > This framework will be applicable for all deposit-taking NBFC.
- However, it will exclude government NBFCs, housing finance companies, primary dealers and other non-deposit taking NBFCs in the upper, middle, and top layers.
- > The PCA framework for NBFCs will be implemented from October 1, 2022.
- This is done on the basis of the financial position of NBFCs on or after March 31, 2022.



#### Wholesale inflation surges to 14.23% in November



- Annual wholesale price-based inflation in India had accelerated to a record high in November 2021.
- The wholesale price inflation is accelerated by increases in manufacturing and food prices.
- > Thus, it raised concerns about rising inflationary pressure.
- > Annual wholesale price-based inflation increased to 14.23% in November.
- ▶ It was highest since April 2005.

#### CCI slaps ₹200 crore fine on Amazon, freezes Future deal

Deal goes awry | A brief look at the tussle

between Amazon and Future Group

In Aug. 2019, Amazon signed a \$200 million deal to acquire a 49% stake in Future Coupons, which owns 7.3% equity in Future Retail, with the right to buy into Future Retail after a period of three to 10 years

■ In August 2020, Reliance entered into a deal with Future Group to acquire its retail assets for **₹24,713 crore** 



 Amazon contested the deal, arguing that the terms agreed in its 2019 deal prevented Future Group from selling its retail business to certain rivals, including Reliance

- The Competition Commission of India (CCI) fined US e-commerce giant, Amazon Rs 200 crore.
- The CCI has also suspended the 2019 Amazon deal with Future Coupons, a unit of Future Retail Ltd.
- > Amazon was fined for concealing facts while obtaining approval for this deal.



### ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel to invest ₹1.02 lakh cr. in Odisha



- ➤ The Odisha government approved ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel's proposal to set up a 24 million tonne per annum integrated steel plant in Mahakalpara block of Kendrapara district at an estimated investment of ₹1.02 lakh crore.
- Touted to be the largest project in the country's manufacturing sector, the proposed facility of AM/NS (the Kendrapara complex), would produce various grades of steel with its latest 'green' steel making technology and also make 18.75 MTPA of cement.
- On completion, the steel and cement facilities would both be India's largest single location greenfield projects, respectively. The project is proposed to be completed in phases over seven years.

# Airtel prepays Rs 15,519 crore to DoT to clear all deferred liabilities for 2014 spectrum

- Telecom operator Bharti Airtel said it has paid Rs 15,519 crore to the government towards prepayment of its entire deferred liability pertaining to spectrum acquired in the 2014 auction.
- The company had acquired 128.4 MHz spectrum (including Telenor spectrum) for a consideration of Rs 19,051 crore in the 2014 auction, Airtel said in a statement.
- The company estimates that the prepayment to department of telecom (DoT) will likely result in interest cost savings of at least Rs 3,400 crore over the residual life for fully substituted capital.
- In a statement, Airtel said it has prepaid Rs 15,519 crore to clear all deferred liabilities for the spectrum acquired in 2014.

# DRDO test-fired air version of the BrahMos supersonic cruise missile



- India successfully test-fired the air version of the BrahMos supersonic cruise missile from the integrated test range of Chandipur, off the coast of Odisha.
- The air version of the missile was test-fired from supersonic fighter aircraft Sukhoi 30 MK-I.
- BrahMos is a joint venture between Defence Research and Development Organisation - DRDO (India) and NPO Mashinostroyeniya (Russia) for the development, production, and marketing of the supersonic cruise missile which has been inducted into the Indian Armed Forces.
  - Chairman DRDO: Dr G Satheesh Reddy.
  - DRDO Headquarters: New Delhi.
  - DRDO Established: 1958.

# DRDO successfully tests indigenous missile-assisted torpedo system



- India successfully launched Supersonic Missile Assisted Release of Torpedo System (SMART) from Abdul Kalam Island, off the Odisha coast.
- The SMART system has been designed for enhancing anti-submarine warfare capability far beyond the conventional range of torpedoes.
- SMART carried a torpedo, release mechanisms, and parachute delivery system.
- The Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) has developed the weapon for the Indian Navy.



#### China launches Shijian-6 05 satellites for space exploration



- China successfully launched a new group of satellites Shijian-6 05 into space from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in northwest China for space exploration and new technology tests.
- The satellites were launched by a Long March-4B rocket which marked the 400th mission of Long March series carrier rockets.
  - China Capital: Beijing;
  - China Currency: Renminbi;
  - China President: Xi Jinping.

## TVS Motor and BMW Motorrad tie up to make electric vehicles



- India's TVS Motor Company will develop electric vehicles with BMW's motorcycle brand in India.
- The tie-up comes at a time when new-age start-ups like Ola Electric & Ather are ramping up investment in electric scooters.

New generation nuclear capable ballistic missile Agni-P tested for second time



- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully tested the new generation nuclear-capable ballistic missile 'Agni P'.
- Agni P was launched from Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam island off the coast of Odisha.
- It is a medium-range ballistic missile, developed by DRDO as the successor of Agni-I and Agni-II missiles.
- It is the sixth missile in the Agni series of ballistic missiles.

# India earned \$35 million and 10 million euros from 2019-21 through foreign satellite launches: Govt



- India has launched a total of 342 foreign satellites to 34 countries since 1999. These satellites have been commercially launched by various types of PSLV rockets of the Indian company ISRO.
- These were launched for Earth observation, science and technology demonstration purposes. The PSLV rocket has the highest number of US 226 satellites in these 34 countries. Other countries in the list include Canada (12), Britain (12), Jomani (11), Singapore (8), Korea (6) and Japan (5). In this regard, in the last three years (2019-2021) alone, India has received about Rs. 350 crore, the ministry said.



- ➢ Recently, a scientific paper revealed that NASA's Parker Solar Probe successfully entered the Sun's Corona on April 28, 2021.
- Corona is the outermost layer of the Sun's atmosphere
- > Parker Solar Probe is the first spacecraft to fly into the low solar corona.





- A whopping 1,160 elephants were killed in the country due to reasons other than natural causes in the past 10 years up to December 31, 2020, according to the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC).
- While electrocution claimed the lives of 741 elephants, train hits led to the death of 186 pachyderms, followed by poaching - 169, and poisoning - 64, a document accessed from the Ministry through the Right to Information (RTI) Act revealed.
- Karnataka and Odisha lost 133 elephants each due to electrocution during the period and Assam reported 129 deaths.
- Among elephant casualties due to train hits, Assam stood first with 62 deaths, followed by West Bengal at 57.
- A total of 169 mammals were killed by poachers in the 10 years and Odisha reported the highest - 49 deaths, followed by Kerala 23.
- Assam reported the highest number of elephants poisoned 32, and Odisha stood second with 15 deaths.
- Karnataka 6,049, Assam 5,719, Kerala 5,706, and Tamil Nadu 2,761 were the top four States that had the highest number of elephants as per the RTI reply from the Project Elephant Division of the MoEFCC.



# Rajya Sabha Passes the Landmark 'Dam Safety Bill (2019)'



- The Rajya Sabha passed the landmark Dam Safety Bill (2019), paving the way for enactment of the Dam Safety Act in the country. The Union Minister of Jal Shakti Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat had introduced the bill in Rajya Sabha on 1st December, 2021.
- > The Rajya Sabha has passed the Dam Safety Bill, 2019.
- > The Bill was passed in the Lok Sabha on 2 August 2019.
- The Bill provides for proper surveillance, inspection, operation, and maintenance of all specified dams in the country to ensure their safe functioning.
- > The Bill provides for the constitution of a National Committee on Dam Safety.
- That shall evolve dam safety policies and recommend necessary regulations as may be required for the purpose.
- The Bill provides for the establishment of the National Dam Safety Authority as a regulatory body that shall discharge functions to implement the policy, guidelines, and standards for dam safety in the country.
- The Bill provides for the constitution of a State Committee on Dam Safety by the State Government.




6.98 Lakh Employees Recruited Since 2014, Higher Than Previous 7 Years of UPA: Union Minister



- Union Minister Jitendra Singh said the Centre has recruited around 6.98 lakh employees for its various departments since 2014 as against 6.19 lakh in the previous seven years of the UPA government.
- In response to supplementary questions in the Rajya Sabha during the Question Hour, Mr Singh, the Minister of State for Personnel, Public Grievances, and Pension, said the Central government under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi has not only expedited the recruitment process but at the same time made efforts to create new posts.
- Between 2007-08 to 2013-14, 6,19,027 posts were filled by three major recruiting agencies, the Staff Selection Commission, Union Public Service Commission, and the Railway Recruitment Board, he said.
- ➢ In comparison, he said the recruitment increased to 6,98,011 in the last seven years of the Modi government. The sanctioned strength has also increased to 40,04,941 in 2020 from 36,45,584 in 2014, the minister added.

#### MGNREGA seeks ₹25,000 crore additional funding

- ➤ The Centre has sought ₹25,000 crore as additional funding for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) scheme as part of the supplementary demand for grants submitted to Parliament, after the demanddriven rural jobs scheme ran out of funds midway through the year.
- ➤ Overall, ₹3.73 lakh crore of additional funding is planned for the current financial year, with an equity infusion into Air India



Assets Holding Company, additional fertiliser subsidy, food storage and warehousing, and payment of pending export incentives being the big ticket items accounting for three-fourths of the total.

With four months remaining in the financial year, MGNREGA has finished spending the ₹73,000 crore initially allocated in the budget, and its financial statement now shows a negative net balance of ₹10,244 crore, including payments due.



India, Russia broaden ties and military cooperation



- > The India Russia 2+2 Ministerial Dialogue was held in New Delhi.
- It was held by the defence ministers and external affairs ministers of the two countries.
- > This is the first 2+2 Dialogue held between India and Russia.
- During this dialogue, the countries discussed the ongoing situation in Afghanistan.
- The dialogue expanded military cooperation and joint development between the countries.
- During the dialogue, India signed a contract with Russia to procure more than six lakh AK – 203 rifles.
  - "In an endeavour to provide a big boost to self-reliance in defence manufacturing in India, the government has approved the plan for production of over five lakh AK-203 assault rifles at Korwa, Amethi in U.P.," a Government source said.

#### Parliament approves bills on ART, surrogacy

- The bill aims to provide for the regulation of ART (Assisted Reproduction Technology).
- ➤ ART is used to treat infertility.
- In ART, the eggs are removed from a woman's body, mixed with sperm to form embryos.
- The bill was recently passed in both Sabha.

 As of Feb. 20, there are 517 ART clinics under the National Registry of ART clinics and banks in India, according to the ICMR



Union Cabinet clears Ken-Betwa river interlinking project



- > The Union Cabinet approved the Ken-Betwa River interlinking project.
- This project promises to address the issue of water scarcity in the Bundelkhand region, spreading across Madhya Pradesh (MP) and Uttar Pradesh (UP).
- This project is expected to benefit several poverty-stricken regions in MP and UP.
- At 2020-21 price levels, the overall cost of the Ken-Betwa link project has been estimated at Rs. 44,605 crore.
- The Union Cabinet has approved central support for the project in the amount of Rs. 39,317 crore, which includes a grant of Rs. 36,290 crore and a loan of Rs. 3,027 crore.

## Bhasha Sangam mobile app launched with 22 languages



- A mobile app known as 'Bhasha Sangam' has been launched by the Ministry of Education.
- The app will help individuals in acquiring basic conversation abilities in languages other than one's own mother tongue.
- The initiative by the Government has been taken under Ek Bharat-Shreshtha Bharat Programme.
- The app has 100+ sentences, designed on different themes that allow people to learn basic conversation in 22 Indian languages, test themselves and generate online certificates.



## Maharashtra tops the list of Atmanirbhar Bharat Rozgar Yojana beneficiaries



- Atmanirbhar Bharat Rojgar Yojana was rolled out during the covid-19 pandemic for generating jobs.
- Maharashtra has topped the list of states with the highest number of beneficiaries.
- Maharashtra is followed by Gujarat and Karnataka.
- As many as 6,49,560 beneficiaries were recorded in Maharashtra, followed by Tamil Nadu (5,35,615), Gujarat (4,44,741) and Karnataka (3,07,164). In Maharashtra, the beneficiaries have been provided with a total of Rs 409.72 crore under the scheme to new employees of 17,524 establishments.

#### 7th edition of India International Science festival begins in Panaji



- Union Minister of State Science & Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated the seventh edition of the India International Science Festival at Panaji, Goa.
- The theme of the 4-day science festival is 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' "Celebrating Creativity, Science, Technology, and Innovation for a prosperous India".
- > The First India International Science Festival was held in 2015 at IIT Delhi.
- The main aim of the Science Festival is to bring into use the innovations by the people and develop technology that is affordable to the masses.



Minimum legal age of marriage for women being raised to 21 years

AGE FOR LEGAL MARRIAGE



- The Union Cabinet approved the proposal of increasing the marriage age for women from 18 years to 21 years.
- Currently, the minimum age of marriage for men is 21 while for women it is 18.
- The government will now look to introduce amendments to the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act of 2006, Special Marriage Act of 1954, and the Hindu Marriage Act of 1955 to bring the plan into action.


## Private hospitals to be tagged for being breastfeeding-friendly



- A new initiative will now help mothers identify "breastfeeding-friendly" hospitals before they give birth.
- The Breastfeeding Promotion Network of India(BPNI) in collaboration with Association of Healthcare Providers of India (AHPI), which comprises more than 12,000 private hospitals, has launched an accreditation programme that will enable hospitals to get a "breastfeeding-friendly" tag. This programme is called "Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI)".
- ➤ The certification process involves two stages the first stage includes self-assessment by a hospital, followed by an external assessment by an authorised appraiser who interviews doctors, nurses and patients as well as reviews different practices and training of staff. The accreditation process costs ₹17,000 per hospital.



#### Heated winter session of Parliament concludes a day early



- Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha were adjourned sine die on 22nd December, a day ahead of its original schedule.
- It was marking the end of the Winter Session of Parliament.
- The Winter Session in Lok Sabha had 18 sittings and witnessed the passage of key legislation such as the Farm Laws Repeal Bill and the Election Laws (Amendment) Bill.
- The Upper House witnessed several disruptions during the session following the suspension of 12 opposition party members for their "unruly" conduct in the previous session in August.
- The Winter Session, which started on November 29, was scheduled to conclude on December 23.

- Out of the total 31 members, TMC MP Sushmita Dev is the sole woman representative on the committee.
- The Bill seeks to raise the legal age of marriage for women in India from 18 to 21 to bring it at par with men.
- The Prohibition of Child Marriage (Amendment) Bill 2021 seeks to amend the "Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006" and seven personal laws.
- ➤ They are,
  - Indian Christian Marriage Act
  - Parsi Marriage and Divorce Act
  - Muslim Personal Law (Shariat) Application Act
  - Special Marriage Act
  - Hindu Marriage Act

#### Barbados becomes the world's newest republic



- Barbados has become the World's newest republic, around 400 years after it became a British colony.
- Barbados, the Caribbean Island nation, removed Queen Elizabeth II as the head of the state.
- > Dame Sandra Prunella Mason took over as the President of Barbados.
- > Barbados is said to have been made a slave society by the British.
- ▶ It first became an English colony in 1625.
- ➢ It gained its independence in 1966.

#### Sri Lankan government appoints ex-Navy chief as governor



- A former Sri Lanka navy chief previously charged over a spate of killings during the island's long civil war was named a provincial governor.
- The investigation into Admiral Wasantha Karannagoda cast a spotlight on extrajudicial murders during the 37-year conflict, which ended in 2009.
- He was one of 14 people accused of abducting the teenaged children of wealthy families and killing them after extorting money.
- Authorities dropped the charges in October, prompting an outcry from human rights groups.



# New Zealand to ban cigarette sales for future generations



- The proposal from New Zealand's health officials would effectively ban anyone 14 years or younger from purchasing cigarettes for their entire lifetime.
- It would raise the minimum age to buy cigarettes every year beginning in 2023.

#### **Dubai 1st govt to go 100 percent paperless**



- Dubai became the world's first government to turn 100% paperless, the announcement was made by the United Arab Emirate (UAE) Crown Prince, Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum.
- It will save around 3 billion Dirham (USD 350 million) and 14-million-man hours.



#### U.S. tests laser weapon in West Asia



- The U.S. Navy announced it tested a laser weapon and destroyed a floating target in West Asia, a system that could be used to counter bomb-laden drone boats deployed by Yemen's Houthi rebels in the Red Sea.
- The test saw the USS Portland test-fire its Laser Weapon System Demonstrator at the target in the Gulf of Aden, the body of water separating East Africa from the Arabian Peninsula.
- The Navy's West Asia-based 5th Fleet described the laser as having "successfully engaged" the target in a statement. Previously, the *Portland* used the laser to bring down a flying drone in May 2020.



### U.P. reports most UAPA arrests



- Uttar Pradesh reported the highest number of arrests under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), 1967, followed by Jammu and Kashmir, and Manipur, according to data tabled by the Government in Rajya Sabha on Wednesday.
- Uttar Pradesh recorded 361 UAPA arrests, Jammu and Kashmir 346 arrests, and Manipur 225 arrests in the year 2020 alone.
- Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai said in a written reply that as per the National Crime Record Bureau's report, "the number of persons arrested under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in the years 2019 and 2020 are 1,948 and 1,321 respectively."
- In another reply, Mr. Rai said that since 2016, 7,243 persons were arrested under UAPA and during the same period 212 persons were convicted. As many as 286 cases ended in acquittal, 25 cases were abated and 42 cases were discharged by courts, it said.

## Cyclone Jawad

- A cyclonic storm, named Cyclone Jawad is hits Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, and West Bengal.
- The name is as per the suggestion from Saudi Arabia and means generous or merciful in Arabic.



### Bihar won Gold Medal Award at 40th edition India International Trade Fair



- Bihar bagged a gold medal in the 40th India International Trade Fair held at Pragati Maidan in Delhi.
- It was awarded for "excellence in display" in the state government/union territory pavilion category.
- > Assam Pavilion has been awarded, Silver Medal.

#### Madhya Pradesh government organises first drone fair at Gwalior

- In Madhya Pradesh, the first drone fair in the country was organised at Gwalior.
- Gwalior Drone Mela was organised jointly by the Ministry of Civil Aviation, the Government of India, the Government of Madhya Pradesh, and the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI).

#### Nagaland resolution seeks repeal of AFSPA

- In June 2021, Ministry of Home Affairs had declared the entire State of Nagaland as a "disturbed area" for six more months in accordance with the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA).
- AFSPA provides power to the armed forces to maintain public order in disturbed areas.

### Mission Shakti Living Lab Launched In Odisha



- Odisha inked an agreement with United Nations Capital Development Fund to launch "Mission Shakti Living Lab" for the financial empowerment of women.
- It will address the barriers related to the autonomy and financial freedom of women.
- Mission Shakti was launched in 2001 to enhance the holistic development of women.

- ➢ With the inclusion of Durga Puja, the number of elements in the list of Intangible Cultural Heritage from India has increased to 14.

## Supreme Court allows bullock cart races in Maharashtra



- > The Supreme Court gave the nod to resume bullock cart races in Maharashtra.
- > The races were prohibited since 2017.



#### Karnataka Assembly passes anti-conversion bill amidst protests



- "Karnataka Protection of Right to Freedom of Religion Bill, 2021" was passed in the Karnataka State legislative Assembly.
- > The bill is popularly known as anti-conversion bill.
- The bill is being opposed, tagging it as "anti-people", "inhuman", "unconstitutional", "anti poor" and "draconian".
- ➤ This Bill was passed by a voice vote.
- > This bill provides for protection of the right to freedom of religion.
- It also prohibits unlawful conversion from one religion to another by force, mis representation, coercion, undue influence, allurement or by any fraudulent means.

Laker took nine for 37 in the first innings before returning to scalp all 10 in the second. His 19 for 90 remains the best bowling figures in a Test match

Ajaz is the first to come up with a 10-wicket haul in the first innings of a Test, Laker and Kumble performed their feats in the second innings

The Kiwi left-arm spinner is also the first to do it in an away Test Ajaz's 10-119 is the best by a New Zealander in Tests, bettering Richard Hadlee's 9-52 (vs Aus, 1985, Brisbane)

His figures are the best by a bowler in his place of birth, eclipsing Muttiah Muralitharan's 9-51 (vs Zim, Kandy, 2002) and Abdul Qadir's 9-56 (vs Eng, Lahore, 1987)

\* includes the ongoing Tests between India-New Zealand and Pakistan-Bangladesh

- Ajaz Patel is the third player to take 10 wickets in a Test inning.
- > Ajaz is the first New Zealand bowler to achieve the feat.
- Mumbai-born New Zealand spinner Ajaz Patel achieved this feat at the Wankhede Stadium of Mumbai against India.
- He became the third cricketer to claim 10 wickets in a single inning of a Test match after Jim Laker and Anil Kumble.
- India was bowled out for 325.



WTA suspends events in China over Peng Shuai concerns



- The Women's Tennis Association (WTA) has taken the unprecedented step of immediately suspending all of its events in China, citing the failure of the authorities to take up Chinese star Peng Shuai's allegations of sexual abuse by a former senior Communist Party leader.
- The WTA and a number of stars expressed concerns about Ms. Peng's whereabouts after she disappeared from public view for two weeks after the statement and had her account on Sina Weibo, a Chinese Twitter equivalent, blocked from public view.

Argentina beat six-time champions Germany to lift Junior hockey world cup



- Argentina lifted the coveted trophy of the Junior Men's Hockey World Cup after defeating Germany 4-2 in the final match at the Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneshwar, Odisha.
- > India suffered a defeat against France in the bronze medal match.



#### PV Sindhu settles for silver in BWF World Tour Finals



- The BWF World Tour 2021 finals was held between PV Sindhu of India and Seyoung of Korea at Bali in Indonesia.
- Seyoung won the cup and Sindhu settled in for a silver medal.
- ▶ In Men's Singles of the BWF World Tour 2021, Viktor Axelsen won the cup.
- > The BWF World Tour is a Grade 2 Badminton tournament series.
- > It is held by the BWF, Badminton World Federation.
- It is held among the top world-ranked players in singles (men and women) and doubles (men, women, and mixed).
